

UPDATED: Liturgical Protocols for Public Health

(Excerpt from diojeffcity.org)

- 1. Funeral Masses and services may still be celebrated, but with the requirement to keep attendance to no more than 10 asymptomatic immediate family members, in accord with the <u>CDC</u> guidelines.
- 2. Baptisms may still be celebrated, but with the requirement to keep attendance to asymptomatic immediate family and godparents. The total number of witnesses, including the celebrant, should be 10 or less according to the <u>CDC</u>.
- 3. The sacrament of confession should still be offered, but penance services are to be canceled. When celebrated individually, proper social distancing should be observed as much as possible.
- 4. Holy Communion may still be administered by clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and anointing of the sick may still be administered by priests to those seriously ill or in danger of death, but always following the proper protocols for handwashing and use of masks by those infected.
- 5. Confirmation Masses with the Bishop will be rescheduled.
- 6. The celebration of First Communion in the parish is to be delayed until the Feast of Corpus Christi or after.
- 7. Public weddings should be rescheduled. Simple weddings and validations may be celebrated, but only with the minister, official witnesses and asymptomatic immediate family members. Again, the total number of witnesses, including the celebrant, should be 10 or less according to the CDC.
- 8. If they are not already doing so, parishioners should be encouraged to consider contributing to the parish by electronic giving. They may also mail their weekly contributions.
- 9. Public celebrations of the Liturgy of the Hours, Stations of the Cross, in-person Bible study groups (or other devotional gatherings) are suspended until the public celebration of Mass resumes.

CONFESSIONS AND ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Fr. Nelen will be available for individual confessions and anointing of the sick in the Cathedral Cry Room from 12:00—1:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 3:30–5:00 p.m. on Saturday afternoon.

Those who are ill may also call to set up a time for anointing of the sick.


The 2020 date for Confirmation has been set for Sunday, April 26, at the 10:00 a.m. Mass.

PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

A message from Bishop W. Shawn McKnight (3-17-20)

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I know you join me in concern for all who are being affected by the rapid spread of the coronavirus. Today, I am announcing that all public Masses will be suspended in the Diocese of Jefferson City, beginning on Wednesday, March 18, and until at least April 3.

This is in keeping with the federal directives and other public entities in our area. We offer this decision as part of our effort to help stem the spread of the coronavirus.

This means all Catholics are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in person. Online opportunities are listed on our website, and some parishes will be able to provide online Masses. Catholics are encouraged to check with their local parish regarding online Masses.

In addition, parishes have been instructed to make the following changes beginning March 18:

All public gatherings are cancelled or postponed. This includes public weddings. More information on baptisms, funerals and other liturgical protocols can be found on our website.

- Confirmation Masses will be rescheduled to be celebrated after Easter Sunday.
- During this time, churches will remain open as places of prayer and comfort. Priests will be available in the parishes to offer Anointing of the Sick and other sacraments. You are encouraged to seek the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick before you go to the hospital, if possible.

I ask you to be mindful of your responsibility to serve the community in your time, talent and treasure in this extraordinary hour of need. You may register your volunteer capacity on our website. Parishes are organizing disaster responder teams to serve those immediately impacted by the coronavirus pandemic. Please continue your tithes to your parishes by postal mail or online - if the parish offers that option.

• Diocesan schools, that are suspending in-school instruction from March 18 to April 3 are providing ongoing instruction either online or packet-based, on a case-by-case basis. While diocesan offices and parish offices will remain open, some employees may work remotely or may need to take leave to care for themselves or their families. Some parishes may reduce office hours. Regardless, all diocesan and parish employees will continue to receive compensation.

I am grateful to all who are working tirelessly to mitigate the effects of the pandemic. I pray the efforts we are making, as a people of faith will provide tangible support, encouragement and spiritual hope to our communities. With prayers for the protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I am,

REPORTING SERVICES

The Catholic Bishops' Abuse Reporting Service has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. Where a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential. If you have any other kind of complaint about a bishop—such as parish assignments, church closings, or homily contents—please address those directly to your diocesan or eparchial bishop.
