FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATIONS

Hello and happy Sunday!

This weekend as a Church we celebrate the World day of Prayer for Vocations. When we hear the word 'vocation,' we often think of a religious vocation and forget that all of us have a vocation. Our primary vocation is to holiness and this is a universal vocation. God longs for all of us to grow in holiness and to become saints. Each of us also have a particular vocation (marriage, religious life or single). A vocation is not what we do, but rather who we are. It is who God created us to be. Therefore, this particular vocation must be discerned well.

When I was a child, I never thought about my vocation (universal - to holiness, or particular - priesthood). I would get up each day and pursue what I wanted in life. I was kind to others and tried to be a good person. I was praverful at Church and was an altar server, but I never stopped to ask God what it was that He wanted me to do with my life. That day would come and change my life forever. I do not have time to give my entire vocation story here, but I can tell you that it was a gradual change.

The more I sought to grow in prayer and relationship with God, the more I sought to do His will and in turn the happier I became. I think the first step for us to understand our vocation is to grow in our knowledge of the love of God. The love He has for us and the love we have for Him. Again, many of us don't think about our vocation. On this day of the world day of prayer for vocations, I want to encourage us as a parish community to pray for vocations. For us to pray that we might discern and live well our vocation and to pray for others that they might discern well their vocation. We must not underestimate the power of prayer.

I encourage us to pray for engaged couples, married couples, and their families. That they may be filled with and guided by God's grace. I ask that we pray that their homes might be a place for others to encounter God. I would also like us to pray for the young of our parish that they might discern well their vocation: especially those considering a religious vocation (priest, religious brother/ sister). The world often dismisses the discernment of a religious vocation, but God is calling people to this vocation. People from our Parish. It is often not a calling problem, but rather a listening problem. It can be scary and frightening to religious vocation. discern а This apprehension often comes from fear that if we tell others we are considering it, then we will be pressured into it or judged for considering it. For those who might feel this way, I pray for you to have courage. Trust that God will guide you. I ask that we as a parish community pray with conviction for the increase of religious vocations. That the young of the parish might be open to hear the call and have the courage to pursue it.

As we celebrate all vocations this weekend, let us thank God for the calling to be His disciples and to ask Him for the grace that we might live well our vocation, the vocation placed on our hearts by God.






