

All the blocks are 10" finished and can be found at www.quilterscache.com. So here is a little excitement to know the patterns, but you have to wait for each month to find out what color the month will bring! 😳



| The pattern for the TEN INCH BLOCK can be found at: http://www.guilterscache.com/G/GrandmothersChoiceBlock.html | ** Supplies List ** | Color 1 Color 1 Color 1 needs: one 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip AND one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip | Color 2 Color 2 needs: one 5" x 9" strip AND one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip | ** <u>Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block</u> ** ** Start by cutting the Color 1 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" squares. Cut the Color 1 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" | = 5 strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack those and cut them once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles | Now cut the Color 2 5" x 9" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. Cut the Color 2 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack and cut the squares once on the diagonal to make eight half square triangles | Using a scant 1/4" scam allowance - now and throughout this block, sew a Color 2 half square triangle ight sides together to the right hand side of a Color 1 square. Press scam towards triangle. Sew another triangle to the lower edge, again pressing towards triangle. Sew a Color 1 half square triangle to this pieced triangle, pressing this scam towards the larger triangle. This should measure $4-1/2$ "; trim if needed. Make four units like this | Now lay out all the units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the outside, and the middle row seam to the center. Now just join the rows to complete your Grandmother's Choice Block! | | Unrusty & 1 up ~ Measure and test your seam | should measure 10 12" when you bring it to the June meeting.
