+ Earlier today, INF Tim Beckham and OF Mallex Smith visited Sunrise Lanes bowling alley in St. Petersburg at a Rays-sponsored celebration for about 45 kids from Tampa RBI before they leave for the RBI championships.

WELCOME HOME-Tonight the Rays open a 6 -game homestand against the Rangers and Orioles...it is the first time the Rays have hosted a game after the All-Star break while positioned to reach the postseason since Sep 23, 2013 vs. BAL, when PH James Loney hit a walk-off homer off then-Orioles RH Tommy Hunter for a 5-4 win...after the game, they embarked on what became a five-city, 12-day road trip to New York, Toronto, Texas, Cleveland and Boston, as they continued to a "Game 163" tiebreaker, American League Wild Card Game and the ALDS.

+ When gates open tomorrow, the first 15,000 fans will receive a DJ Kitty Onesie presented by Suncoast Credit Union...on Sunday, kids 14 and under will receive a Chris Archer Emoji Pillow presented by Moffitt Cancer Center...all promo items are available while supplies last.
+ Tomorrow WWE Superstar Titus O'Neil will sign autographs from 6-6:30 p.m. in the Republic Bank Draft Room.

RAY MATTER-The Rays returned home late Wednesday night/early Thursday morning from a $4-2$ road trip to Anaheim (2-1) and Oakland (2-1), missing a chance for a sweep in both series finales...the Rays have won 6 of their las 8 games and are 12-3-4 over their last 19 series, since May 12-14 at BOS.. they are 22-14 (.611) since June 7, the best record in the American League ahead of Kansas City (22-15) and 2nd best in the majors behind the Dodgers (31-5)...they own the 3rd-best record overall in the AL (.531), trailing Houston (63-32, .663) and Boston (53-43, .557)...with a win tonight, they can return to a season-high 7 games over . 500 ( $51-44$ through Tuesday).. the highwater mark under third-year Manager Kevin Cash is 10 games over . 500 (40-30 through June 20, 2015).

+ The Rays first 12 games out of the All-Star break are against opponents currently under .500, with 3 games each at LAA, at OAK, vs. TEX, vs. BAL...they are 4-2 so far.
+ Rays starting pitchers own a 3.98 ERA, 2nd lowest in the AL behind the Astros (3.89).
+ The Rays are 7-3 in extra innings...they have a 6-game winning streak in extras, the longest in club history within a season, and one shy of the longest overall (7 straight, 2007-08).

WHERE THEY STAND-The Rays are 2.5 GB of first place in the AL East...the last time the Rays were this close to first place this late in the season was through Aug 29, 2013, when they were 2.5 GB of

| Seattle | 48-49 | . 495 |  | Boston...if the season ended today, the Rays would host the Yankees in the AL Wild Card Game...through June 12, the Yankees were a season-high-tying 15 games over . 500 (38-23), up 4.0 games on Boston and up 6.5 games on the Rays...since then, the Rays have gone 17-13 and the Yankees have gone 11-22.

RAYS vs. RANGERS-The Rays won 2 of 3 games in Arlington, May 2931, in a series in which both teams scored 22 runs...the Rays won the rubber match finale, 7-5, in 10 innings...the Rays are 9-1-2 in series play at Tropicana Field in Texas' last 12 visits here, dating back to Aug 21, 2006, with the only series loss coming May 30-June 1, 2011 (lost 2 of 3)...they are 26-13 here over this stretch...the Rays are 79-91 all-time (44-37 home, $35-54$ road)...they are 39-34 in the Rays era (since 2008).

+ 3B Evan Longoria is a career .296/.369/.546 hitter (77-for-260) with 18 2B, 15 HR and 56 RBI in 69 games vs. Texas...his 15 HR are matched only by his 16 HR vs. MIN among non-divisional opponents.
+ OF Steven Souza Jr. is a career . 324 (12-for-37) hitter with 5 HR and 12 RBI in 10 games vs. Texas.

RAY-KING RAYS-The Rays have hit 140 HR, tied for 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL behind Houston (155) and Texas (142)...they have hit 52 HR in the last 35 games...last year they knocked a club-record 216 HR; this year they are on pace to eclipse that mark by 20 (236)...through 966 games, their 140 HR are most in club history (prev. 126 in 2016), while their 448 runs are their most since 2013 (449)...the Rays lead the majors with a club-record 11 back-to-back home runs, and no other team has more than 8 (Nationals)...the Rays have outscored opponents 297-217 (+80) in innings 1-thru-5, but have been outscored 216-151 after that (-65).
+1 B Logan Morrison has hit a career-high 26 HR (T-5th in majors), has tied his career high with 54 BB (4th in AL ) and his 61 RBI (10th in AL ) are approaching his career high of 72 (2011)...he leads the Rays in all three categories...the only players in baseball who can match his combination of HR and BB are NYY Aaron Judge ( $30-\mathrm{HR}$, 67BB) and CIN Joey Votto (26-HR, 69-BB).

+ RF Steven Souza Jr. has already established career highs with 20 $\mathrm{HR}, 60 \mathrm{RBI}$ and 49 BB , and ranks 2 nd on the team in each category to Morrison...he has 6 HR over his last 15 games (since June 30).. all 20 HR have come vs. RHP, which according to the Elias Sports Bureau makes him the first right-handed batter to hit his first 20 HR of a season off RHP since CHC Sammy Sosa (first 22) in 2004...Sosa finished that season, his last with the Cubs, with 35 HR.

EVAN LONGORIA-Is batting .322 (29-for-90) in 23 games against AL West opponents...over the last 22 games (beginning June 20) is batting .333 (29-for-87) with $82 \mathrm{~B}, 4 \mathrm{HR}$ and 19 RBI....over the last five seasons (2013-17) he leads the majors with 735 games played, ahead of SEA Kyle Seager (731) and KC Alcides Escobar (724).

+ Leads the majors with 9 SF, ahead of SF Brandon Crawford (8), and has 4 SF in his last 12 G ...since his rookie season of 2008, his 73 SF are 10 more than any other player in baseball (Albert Pujols, 63).

FIRST 48, LAST 48-Over the Rays first 48 games (through May 23) the offense logged $504 \mathrm{SO}, 87$ more than any other team (Brewers 417) including 33 games with at least 10 SO...in the last 48 games (since May 24), the offense has 416 SO, 14th most in the majors, and only 15 games with at least 10 SO...they still lead the AL with 920 SO but have been passed by Milwaukee (940) for the major league lead.

BACKSTOP POP-Rays catchers have already amassed 16 HR (T-6th in majors) and 58 RBI (4th in majors), compared to 18 HR and 55 RBI (4th fewest in majors) last season...this puts them on pace for 27 HR, which would break the club record of 20 (2015 and 1999), and 98 RBI, which would tie the club record (1999)...only two positions have produced more RBI for the Rays: 1B (61) and RF (60)...from 2008-16, the Rays ranked last in the majors with 512 RBI from their catchers, and Rays catchers have ranked among the majors' bottom 10 in RBI for each of the last 8 years.

MARGINAL GAINS-The Rays are 13-11 in one-run games, and have won 7 of their last 8 after starting the season 6 -10...in 2016, the Rays went $13-$ 27 (.325) in one-run games, the worst record of any team since the 2008 Braves (11-30, .268) and worst mark in franchise history.

ALEX COLOMÉ-Leads the AL with 28 saves, and ranks 2nd in the majors to COL Greg Holland (30)...dating back to the 2016 All-Star break, he leads the majors with 46 saves, ahead of LAD Kenley Jansen (44) and TOR Roberto Osuna (42)...is attempting to become only the second pitcher in the last 13 seasons (2005-17) to lead the Rays in saves in back-to-back seasons (Fernando Rodney, 2012-13).

ODDS \& ENDS-RF Steven Souza Jr. underwent an MRI yesterday in St. Petersburg that showed no damage to his left hip, and he is day-to-day.. Souza exited Wednesday's game in Oakland with a left hip strain...Rickie Weeks Jr. played his second rehab game for Triple-A Durham yesterday vs. Lehigh Valley (Phillies) and went 1 -for-2 with a 2 -run home run, 2 BB and 2 runs scored...RH Jumbo Díaz cleared waivers and has elected free agency...yesterday the Rays released RH Danny Farquhar, who had been designated for assignment on June 29, from Triple-A Durham.

+ LAST START—On Sat at LAA, had his second consecutive start of 7.2 IP, one out shy of tying his season high...his only run came on a solo homer by Luis Valbuena in the 7th...lowered his season ERA to 3.59 , its lowest since his 3.56 ERA after his May 7 start vs. TOR.. averaged 13.7 pitches per inning, and was at 56 pitches through 5 IP at which point he had faced two batters over the minimum...however, threw only 56.2 pct. of pitches for strikes, and first-pitch strikes to a season-low 43.3 pct. of BF...replaced following a 2 -out $2 B$ and $B B$ in the 8th...his line: W, 7.2 IP, $6 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{R}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{SO}, 1 \mathrm{HR}, 105$ pit, 59 str.
+ THE TURNAROUND—Allowed a ca-reer-high 14 hits and career-high 9 runs on June 3 at SEA, but since then has pitched to a 2.19 ERA (49.1-IP, 12-ER) in his last 7 starts-2nd in the AL, min. 30 IP (see chart)...has allowed 2 ER or fewer in 6 of these 7 starts, and 6 ER in the other...included over this span is a pair of scoreless starts of 7 IP (or more) and 2 hits (or fewer)...the only other AL pitchers to do that twice this season are MIN Ervin Santana (3) and BAL Ubaldo Jimenez (2).

+ PITCHING DEEPER—Has gone 6 IP or more in 7 consecutive starts the longest such streak of his career (prev. 6, Aug 31-Sep 28, 2014).. prior to this stretch, went $6+$ IP in 7 of his first 12 starts...has gone 7.2 IP in each of his last 2 starts, matching the longest such streak and the first time since Sep 16-21, 2013 vs. TEX (8 IP) and vs. BAL (8.1 IP).
$\pm$ HOMEBODY—Has won his last 3 starts at Tropicana Field, going 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (20.2-IP, 3-ER) and .184 opp avg. over this span...his last start here was a scoreless start of 7.2 IP in a 1-0 win over reigning AL Cy Young winner Rick Porcello.
+ THE LONG BALL—Has only allowed 3 HR in his last 7 starts... his 0.94 HR/9 IP ratio for the season ranks 9th in the AL...has allowed 13 HR, but a career-high 8 HR against righties (prev. 4, 2x-last 2014).
seven of his last 8 HR allowed have been to righties, and prior to this stretch only 13 of 48 HR allowed in his career were vs. RHB
+ PITCH SELECTION—Has thrown his changeup a career-low 14.4 percent of the time this season, and his curveball a career-high 34.2 percent of the time...in his career entering this season, his pitch distribution included 34.7 pct. changeups and 20.5 pct. curveballs.
+ Since returning from Tommy John surgery, opponents are batting . 286 (32-for-112) in at-bats ending with the changeup...prior to it, they hit . 206 (188-for-913) against it, including postseason.
+ THE BATTING ORDER—Opposing 7-thru-9 hitters are batting .304/ .347/.478 (42-for-138) with 9 2B, 5 HR and 19 RBI against him...the major league average for this split is .247/.313/.400.
+ DON'T RUSH ME—Averages 26.1 seconds between pitches, according to FanGraphs, 3rd in the majors behind tonight's opposing starter TEX Yu Darvish (26.2) and KC Jason Hammel (26.1), and the highest of his career...in his 5 starts after returning from Tommy John las season, averaged 21.4 seconds between pitches...his previous high before this season was 24.5 seconds in 2014
+ WATCH YOUR BACK—Has 5 pickoffs, most among right-handed pitchers in the majors, and two more than any other RHP...including lefties, only SD Clayton Richard (6) has more this season... his 5 pickoffs are the most by a Rays right-handed pitcher since James Shields (13) in 2011...had 5 career pickoffs entering this year.
+ OFF-AND-ON—Has made 24 starts since returning from Tommy John surgery and has yielded 4 runs (or more) in 10 of them ( 41.6 pct.) compared to 20 of his 81 career starts ( 24.7 pct.) before it... has made 19 starts this season and allowed 4 runs (or more) 7 times, which is already the 2nd most in his career, ahead of 2012 (8)...in his 14 starts when yielding 3 runs or fewer since returning from Tommy John surgery, he is $8-1$ with a 1.77 ERA (91.1-IP, 18-ER).
+ SEEKING DURABILITY—Last season was the fourth straight year he missed six weeks or more of action due to injury, and the fifth time in six major league seasons overall...he missed time in 2016 and 2015 recovering from Tommy John surgery, in 2014 with a left oblique strain in 2013 following a concussion suffered on a line drive to the head and in 2011 due to thoracic outlet syndrome.

+ LAST START—On Sun at LAA, yielded 5 BB, his most since May 15 at CLE (6)...it was his ninth career start of 5 BB or more and third this season...yielded 2 runs, his fewest since June 17 at DET (2), and had 9 SO, his most since June 6 vs. CWS...pitched to a scoreless tie through 4 IP, then allowed a RBI single to Albert Pujols (5th) and fielder's choice/sac bunt to Martin Maldonado (6th)...his line: ND, 6 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 5 BB, 9 SO, 107 pit, 63 str.
