## **NEW PROJECTS:**

### Yoga Ed

Jacqui Pailing has begun teaching an introductory 12 week session of the Yoga Ed program at the Kohala Elementary school, with the support of the principal Ellie Lazslo who secured a start-up grant for the program. After a mid session evaluation, all the teachers, principal and counselor agree, the Yoga Ed Physical Education program highly benefits the students in areas of focus, concentration, balance, self awareness/self management as well as physical fitness. #### North Kohala Emergency Earthquake Relief Fund

The Earthquake Emergency Relief Fund, was established on October 23, 2006 by members of the North Kohala community to address the needs of North Kohala

families and property here that were not being addressed by Federal, State and County resources as the result of multiple 6.7 earthquakes which occurred here on October 15, 2006. The group assessed damaged residential house foundations and provided emergency repairs. This fund received a generous donation of building supplies from Honsador Lumber and a \$50,000 grant from Salesforce.com Charitable Fund. In the first weeks, the primary mission was to educate the public and assist home owners in reporting their damage to FEMA. To date over 30 homes have received extensive repair work to the foundations. The Relief Fund has had a positive impact with many more houses yet to be repaired. Jim Sargent 889-5813.

We are is very grateful for the community support we received this year. Thank You All! Without the continued support of the community, the Center would not be able to provide the teaching, training, researching, and sometimes "handholding" for the projects you will find summarized in the following pages. We are honored by the 392 individuals and families and 218 businesses who joined us in contributing to our operational support in 2006.

We were able to assist our projects in receiving over \$45,000 in donations and \$220,360 in grants with commitments from funders for \$520,000 more in grants in 2007! These are the satisfying results that keep us going.

# Completed Projects in 2006

- The Hawaii Wildlife Center (HWC) was initially launched with the assistance of the North Kohala Community Resource Center in spring 2004. This past year, HWC gained its own non-profit status as a 501(c)3. Congratulations to Linda Elliott and her Board of Directors! Linda is well on her way to realizing her dream of a wildlife rehabilitation center here in Kohala. The Center provided resources and support over a three-year period that allowed her to develop her own non-profit organization and continues to collaborate with HWC in developing funding support.
- Kahua Pa'a Mua I and II, Kohala High School Business Plan Training. This successful multi-year after school program was funded by OHA. David and Carol Fuertes provided business planning and skills training to high school students in the areas of saddle making, plant propagation and fish farming. Congratulations to all members of the team on a very worthwhile project.
- Kohala Girls School Campus Business Plan. The Kohala Center collaborated
  with the Center to obtain funding from the State of Hawaii CBED fund to develop the marketing phase of the Contemplative Retreat Center at the old Kohala
  Girls School Campus.
- Kohala Elementary School Garden. This
  wonderful project, led by Amy Carlson, fifth
  grade teacher at Kohala Elementary School,
  took an abandoned old garden on campus
  and turned it into an integrated learning
  project site for years to come.
- Keiki Kingdom. In June, the new Volcano climbing wall was dedicated at Keiki Kingdom Playground in Kamehameha Park. This piece was made possible by a generous

# PROJECT SUMMARIES:

#### Hawaii Wildlife Center

We are developing Hawaii's first ever wildlife recovery and conservation center for salvaging and rehabilitating sick,

injured, and orphaned native wildlife, especially threatened and endangered species. The Center will also further Hawaii's emergency response capabilities by providing assistance when there are natural

or man-made disasters that affect wildlife populations. Educational programs at the Center will include training in wildlife conservation, research procedures, and cultural awareness. Our development office space, donated by New Moon Foundation, is located at the Kohala Girls School campus while we build the new Center. Our new facility, located in Halaula will include a wildlife care and response unit, a public interpretative courtyard, and an education pavilion. Linda Elliott 889-5180.

The Messenger Project

The Messenger Project was a direct response to the October 15, 2006 earthquake. Created two weeks after the quake, this project was designed to provide the North Kohala community with disaster-assistance information from government and other agencies and to put in place a long-term means for disseminating information in time

of natural disasters or other community-wide emergencies. In October and November, flyers were posted, emailed, and bulk-mailed to all post office boxes

in Hawi and Kapa'au (with financial support from the North Kohala Earthquake Relief Fund); in the future, large display easels also will be set up in key locations. Project organizer Carol Perry plans to fundraise in 2007 to create a modest financial reserve to draw from for future needs. Contact Carol at 889-0317.

#### **KCAA**

In 2006, KCAA chose a new 15 person board, including 4 new officers. KCAA programs for boys and girls include basketball, volleyball, T-ball, pitch ball, and for the first time in 20 years, track and field. The closure of Hisaoka Gym due to earthquake damage has strongly affected basketball and volleyball programs. The County expects it will take almost two years to re-open the Hisaoka Gym. #### Kohala Medicinal Farm
