



Opportunities in Band and Orchestra are available to students who play a musical instrument. These classes are held after school and are a requirement after school for any student taking advanced music in the MYP.

Instrumental lessons can be signed up for with GEMS Music Academy.

Where are the classes in the Secondary (MYP) - All Grade 6 classrooms will be in the Secondary Building. Some classes will be in common areas you have been in before when you were in the PYP:

- o the gym for PE (Physical and Health Education)
- o the first floor hallway for Music and Drama
- o behind the library for Visual Arts classes
- o the ground floor for Design classes

- All Grade 6 students will be placed in **HOUSE ADVISORY** groups.
 - You will be in the same advisory for the school year and take part in many house events.
 - The advisory will happen every second period (Period 2b) from Sunday to Wednesday every week.
 - These classes will allow you to spend time getting to know your peers, planning your academic journey in the MYP, and developing social and emotional skills you need in school and beyond.
 - Your advisory teacher (Student Advisor) will be the first person you will connect with as you begin your Secondary adventure.

Developing Approaches to Learning Skills in the MYP:

We believe MYP students are successful because of many different factors:

- Attendance
- Arriving to school on time
- Proper in-class behaviour
- class participation
- Proper homework completion
- Organization and time management
- A willingness to learn



<u>The Approaches to Learning Skills</u> are taught within each grade level and subject area and support the development of:

- Communication
- Organization
- Thinking
- Reflection
- Collaboration

Through these skills we develop lifelong learners who develop the confidence to work independently and critically in our every changing fast-paced world.

We value each of these and our MYP student report card includes an ATL grade. The grade is based on the progression of the specific ATL skills and is designed to give you valuable information on your student performance.

Organization and Time Management

We want to be able to support the grade 6 students as best we can and here are some points to consider when looking at Managebac (MB). Students need to:

- Review all homework and upcoming assessments by checking the MB Assessment Calendar daily
- Ensure that all assigned tasks are completed at the appropriate deadline.
- Prepare in advance for summative tests and long term projects.
- Plan your time in small chunks to ensure you have time to complete/study for the assessment.

Lockers

Each student is given a locker on the first day of school – the locker has a computer code that is built in where students can select their own number code to lock and unlock the locker.



Don't worry – using a locker takes time getting used to, and our counselors and teachers will support yo in getting used to the process of storing and organizing your materials for learning.

Homework

For daily homework and preparing for upcoming assessments/tasks, it is important you review what you have learned each day and think about what you have to do at home to prepare for the next school day.

Consider the following:

- What time of day is best to complete homework
- Where is the best place to study?
- Know and understand whether you need support. (Please remember to ask for help from parents, teachers, peers at the peer tutoring center, etc.)
- o If you do not have homework for the evening it is always a good idea to prepare study notes of key ideas from the classes of the day.



Writing Center (PEER Tutoring Center)

Students who find some of the content difficult in their classrooms may wish to work with the Writing Center (PEER Tutoring Center). The teachers and students who are working in the Writing Center are there to support students who need extra support and act as peer tutors for students.

Students may also want to ensure they support their own learning experiences by taking responsibility for the expectations during class time, by participating in class discussions and ask questions.
