Late add FAQ

Q. Will I be able to request changes to my schedule after add/drop period?

A. Yes. You may request permission to add a course after final schedules are submitted, but doing so requires the permission of the instructor and the authorization of your college dean.

Timely requests for adding a course after the deadline are routinely approved when, for example, a student on a waitlist for a limited-enrollment course learns, after schedules were due, that a space has become available, or when an adviser identifies a significant problem with a student's final schedule. And, as has always been the case, you may drop a full-term course until 5 p.m. on the last day of classes. Please note that a fee of \$20 will be charged for the processing of any approved course change notice after add/drop period.

Yale Degree Audit

Yale Degree Audit (YDA) is a tool that tracks your progress toward the bachelor's degree. YDA is located on the Academics tab of Student Information System (SIS). YDA displays the Yale College degree requirements that you have already completed and those that are still pending. A "Look Ahead" feature shows you how future course enrollment might apply toward your degree. Yale Degree Audit does not take the place of face-to-face advising, although you may wish to share your audit with your adviser. Instead, it provides an easy-to-read summary of requirements, allowing you and your adviser to spend more time discussing course selection and academic goals.

Do not rely solely on your degree audit when planning your courses; continue to use Yale's standard systems for schedule planning and employ YDA as an additional tool. More features will be added to YDA in the future, including the ability to track progress toward major requirements.





Let's Talk Move-In

Communal living looks different during COVID, and sometimes having conversations around these dynamics can be tricky - here are some questions to help you and your housemates create a space in which everyone feels safe, comfortable, and respected.

General Housing Dynamics



- How will your house make group decisions? How will you ensure everyone's concerns are heard?
- What are your feelings about living in a space with drugs/alcohol?
- Consider your different budget expectations. What are you comfortable sharing? How will you manage shared expenses?
- What are the cleaning expectations among you & your housemates? How can you divide responsibilities evenly?
- How will you respect each other's schedules and spaces?
 Do you want quiet hours? Which rooms are available for Zoom calls?

Moving In

- Have you discussed the different COVID precautions that you and your housemates have been taking over the break? While traveling to New Haven? How does this impact everyone's comfortability level upon move-in?
- How do you feel about your roommates' family or friends coming to help them move in? Will you mask and/or sociallydistance inside the house during movein?
- Do you or your housemates plan to quarantine or distance from each other after move-in? Do you have the space and/or resources to do this?



Let's Talk Move-In

I want to share a resource created by our Communication and Consent Educators to help people navigate off-campus living. We know that living off campus looks and feels different than it ever has before—you can use this guide to jumpstart conversations and create a home environment in which everyone feels safe and comfortable. As we navigate new living spaces or return to old ones amidst the recent surge in cases, it is more important than ever to establish open channels of communication and mutual expectations with the people you live with. I hope that you find this resource useful and even pass it on to a neighbor or two.
