2021 Fulton County 4-H Camp will be June 11-15 at 4-H Camp Palmer! After a year away from camp, this year's planning is appropriately themed as "There's No Place Like Home!"

4-H Camp is for **any** youth age 8 and in the third grade to age 13, as of January 1 of the current year. The cost to attend is \$180 per 4-H camper (\$200 per Non 4-H camper)!

Camp Registration Policy: Online registration for 4-H members will open on May 7, 2021 at 12pm (noon). Registrations for Non 4-H members will be accepted starting May 15 if space is available. All registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis. **Camp is limited to 90 campers**, so register early! The deadline to register for 4-H Camp is June 4 at 4:30pm or until camp is full, whichever comes first.

Pullorum Testing, Skill-a-thon, and Outstanding Market Exhibitor

POULTRY PULLORUM TESTING

As an update from the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA), poultry pullorum testing (when required) will resume for the 2021 fair season as a result of testing antigen availability. We will be setting a date and location for the testing and will plan to advertise it in the July/August newsletters as well as notify the poultry project youth. Stay tuned for more information.

SKILL-A-THON and STUDY TOPICS in RESOURCE HANDBOOKS:

All species except horses will have a skill-a-thon on Saturday, August 14 from 9 A.M. - 12:00 P.M. Youth will be proctored by the Skill-a-thon Coordinators and volunteers while they take their respective species tests. Remember, participating in Skill-a-thons is an **optional** activity.

All youth are welcome to participate in any species skill-a-thons. Competitive placings are only available for youth enrolled in that particular species project(s).



*Dairy beef feeder exhibitors may choose whether they want to participate competitively in the Dairy or Beef skill-a-thon. Exhibitors will indicate their choice upon sign-in at the species skill-a-thon station. Note: only a Beef OME is available.

If you are a 4-H advisor interested in volunteering to coordinate any of the species skill-a-thons, please contact Sara Lewis at lewis.3213@osu.edu to see if you fit the desired position description. Parents of participants are not preferred.

OUTSTANDING MARKET EXHIBITOR CONTEST (Beef, Sheep, Swine, & Goat)

Any Junior Fair youth exhibiting beef, sheep, swine, or goat projects can participate in this contest. To be competitive, an exhibitor must participate in their species' skill-a-thon and Showmanship and market classes (best placing used for points if youth exhibits in multiple classes for the same species). Points are awarded to placement within each class. Registration is on-site at the Skill-a-thons. For beef, sheep, and swine, cash awards will be granted to first (\$50), second (\$30) and third place (\$20) Skill-a-thon winners in each Skill-a-thon division, pending availability. OME winners will sell third in the sale order and will receive a \$1,000 award. The OME winner is not eligible in the following year in the same species, but will become eligible again after one year.

2021 Ohio State Fair Updates

The 2021 Ohio State Fair will be limited to livestock and educational competitions. **We will be finding out more information in the coming weeks.** The Fair will not be open to the public, and will be limited to exhibitors, their families, and guests, stretching the Fair over a longer period of time with an anticipated start date of July 19. This decision will not only help to protect the health and safety of Ohioans, it will also protect the long-term financial viability of the fair.

4-H DOG PRACTICES OFFERED

All practices are outdoors and weather permitting. Dress appropriately for weather. There will not be practice if there are thunderstorms in the area or even if they are threatening in the forecast. Please check directly with the instructor of a particular practice if you are unsure.

Please note: Practices will have a focus on a particular discipline, but other disciplines may be practiced based upon interest of 4-Hers present and at the discretion of the instructor.

Quality Assurance Information for 2021

1) QUALITY ASSURANCE INFORMATION FOR ALL ANIMALS GOING TO FAIR

- **All animal exhibitors to the Fulton County Junior Fair are required to attend Quality Assurance. THIS INCLUDES BREED ANIMALS.** The Ohio Department of Agriculture minimum standards are instruction on all 10 "Good Production Practices," 3 in-depth, and an interactive activity, for a total of one hour (minimum) of face-to-face instruction each year. In 2020, a waiver was made to allow for interactive virtual instruction and that has continued for 2021.
- Quality Assurance Sessions may be held at club meetings if a club advisor is certified as an Assistant Instructor.
- **Please note: All Quality Assurance within clubs must be completed by June 1! Advisors and FFA Instructors, please be sure to have all sign-in sheets turned in to the Extension Office no later than June 1st.**
- Quality Assurance is not required for youth taking pet care projects since these animals do not go to the fair.

2) QUALITY ASSURANCE FOR HORSE PROJECTS

All 4-H horse project participants must complete the [EquiSTEP program on Canvas](#) by **June 1** to be eligible for the Ohio State Fair and to participate in the Fulton County Junior Fair Horse Show/Versatility. Ask your horse advisor about this Quality Assurance program if you need it. Please note that completing equine Quality Assurance will not certify you to exhibit other 4-H project animals at the Junior Fair.

3) QUALITY ASSURANCE FOR DOG PROJECTS

The following 4-H dog project participants: Showmanship, Obedience (Rally), Performance (Agility, Trick) must have viewed the videos at the Dog Kick Off on April 22 or attend a regular Quality Assurance session to be eligible for the Ohio State Fair and to participate in the Fulton County Junior Fair Dog Show. This must be completed and submitted by June 1. Please note that the Dog Kick Off QA will not certify you to exhibit other 4-H project animals at the Junior Fair.

2021 Junior Fair News

Junior Fair Entries are due by August 1st and are required via "Blue Ribbon Fair Online" for **ALL ANIMALS** to exhibit at the Fulton County Fair. The web portal will be open for registration from July 1, 2021 at 12:00 a.m. – August 1, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (EST). **LATE ENTRIES ONLY ACCEPTED UNTIL AUGUST 6th BY 4:30 P.M. AT THE EXTENSION OFFICE WITH A \$20 LATE FEE.** The online link and instructions will be under the "Junior Fair Entries" section of our website at <https://fulton.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/junior-fair-forms>. These instructions will assist you in completing your online entry. **Please read and follow the instructions before starting your online entry.**

DATES OF ANIMAL POSSESSION

- All steers must have been in the possession of 4-H & FFA members by January 1, 2021.
- All feeder calves, sheep, dairy cattle, goats, roaster rabbits, market rabbit breed does, horses, hogs, llamas, poultry (except broilers), must be in the possession of the 4-H members by June 1, 2021.
- Please note the above dates may differ slightly from 2021 Ohio State Fair dates of possession. If you are exhibiting an animal at the Ohio State Fair, please refer to ohiostatefair.com/livestock for their dates.

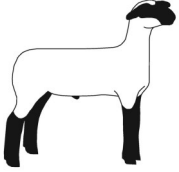
RULES FOR ALL LIVESTOCK ID/TAG-IN (Check page 7 for link to Tag-In Registration Form details)

- The 4-H/FFA member does not have to be present at the ID/Tag-In Day; but must make arrangements with someone else to get animal there.
- If an exhibitor fails to have an animal tagged in on the appropriate tag in day, they will be allowed to show their animal but will not be eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion, or Showmanship placing and will receive market price only. The exhibitor cannot participate in the Junior Fair Livestock (donation) Sale.
- If a tag comes out, it will be replaced for \$2. The animal will still be eligible for all awards, and can sell in the Junior Fair Livestock (donation) sale.
- If animal tags are found to be tampered with the exhibitor will be allowed to show for grade only (will not be eligible for any awards) and will receive market price only. The exhibitor cannot participate in the Junior Fair Livestock (donation) Sale.

2021 Junior Fair News, Continued

GOAT PROJECTS:

Market Goat Tattoo Day is Saturday, June 5, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, Fulton County Fairgrounds—North end of Goat Barn. All market dairy and market Boer goats will be tattooed.



MARKET AND BORN & RAISED SHEEP:

- All Born & Raised Sheep must be born and raised in Fulton County. No exceptions.
- Only one animal will be allowed to weigh-in and show at the fair per project carried by the youth exhibitor.

SCRAPIES DISEASE REGULATIONS

The federal scrapies regulations for sheep and goats were revised in March 2019. This revision means goats, including slaughter goats and commercial goats that were previously exempted, will need to be individually officially identified or group identified with a group lot ID with some exceptions.

Federal requirements:

Sexually intact goats of any age and wethers 18 months of age or older, that are not in slaughter channels must be officially individually identified before moving off the premises where they reside or move as a single flock—of—origin group with group/lot ID and an owner/hauler statement to:

- another premise belonging to the same flock/herd,
- an in-state site to be officially identified, or
- a federally approved livestock market (in-state or out-of-state) to be officially identified.

Further information is available at the Fulton County OSU Extension Office. **All market ewes, wethers, breeding sheep, market goats, dairy goats, pygmy goats and Boer/Boer cross breeding goats must have the ODA approved Scrapie ID from the flock of origin before entering the Fulton County Fairgrounds.** Scrapie cards are available on our [website](#) under Junior Fair Forms. **All goats must have a form of permanent identification (tattoo, tag, microchip) before entering the Fairgrounds.**

RABBITS: All BREED and MARKET rabbits *must* have a permanent and legible tattoo in the rabbit's left ear before checking in at the fair.

- If your breed rabbit needs tattooed, please ask a rabbit advisor to do so for you.
- If you do not have a rabbit advisor, please ask the breeder to do so for you.
- There is a permanent tattoo kit available at the Extension Office which can be borrowed. Call 419-337-9210 to reserve your kit.
- If none of the above options work for you/your family, please contact Sara Lewis at lewis.3213@osu.edu to be put in contact with a volunteer.



Please note: Pet rabbits do not go to the fair. They will be judged in July.

MARKET HOGS:

- Swine Tag-In Day is June 5, 2021 9:00am-12:00pm (noon) at the Fulton County Fairgrounds.
- With the split show at the Fulton County Junior Fair, an exhibitor is allowed to bring 1 or 2 hogs to the fair, **regardless of sex**. Therefore, an exhibitor may bring 2 gilts, 2 barrows, or 1 barrow and 1 gilt. **Only one hog can go through the donation sale, the other would go directly to the truck for market support only. All hogs that enter the Fulton County Fairgrounds must go on the market truck.**
- If an exhibitor brings 2 hogs to the fair, **only one hog can go through the donation sale**. The other would go directly to the truck for market support only. All hogs that enter the Fulton County Fairgrounds must go on the market truck.
- **Each exhibitor will be allowed to tag two hogs each for gilts and/or barrows and one back up animal may be put in the family name for each project carried; however, only one gilt and one barrow will be allowed to weigh-in and show at the fair per exhibitor.**
- The cost for each tag is \$2.00 (exact cash only) and must be paid that day.
- If a tag is lost, but the ear notch matches, the tag will be replaced for \$2.

2021 Junior Fair News, Continued

MARKET STEER PROJECTS: The Fulton County Livestock Sale Committee requires all Dairy Steers, Market Steers, and Born and Raised Steers to be electronically ear tagged to be eligible for show at the Fulton County Junior Fair. **The 2021 steer tag in date was January 9.** Although an exhibitor is allowed to tag 2 animals per project number, only one animal per project will be allowed to weigh-in and show in each category at the fair.

All “Born & Raised Steers” must have been identified and tagged in June of 2020 as a feeder calf in order to show as a “Born & Raised Steer” at the 2021 fair. A “Born & Raised” Animal Certificate and the ID card should have been completed and turned in at the Tag-In Day or to the Extension Office by January 9.

FEEDER CALF PROJECTS: Mandatory Identification Day is June 5, 2021 9:00am-12:00pm at the Fulton County Fairgrounds, Spangler Arena. All animals must be haltered. An exhibitor may exhibit 2 dairy and/or 2 beef feeder calves at fair. Only one animal may pass through the sale ring for donation. All remaining calves may go through the second sale and/or go home. Sale donation ring animal to be determined on Junior Fair Entry form August 1.

Please note:

- The Senior Fair Board and the Livestock Sale Committee will again use the double auction method for feeder calves. More information is available at the Extension Office and in the [Fulton County 4-H Handbook](#).
- A heifer calf shown on Friday night at the Beef Breeding Show cannot be shown Saturday in the Feeder Calf Class. These must be two separate animals.

4-H Species Ambassadors: Lamb, Goat, Dog, Poultry, Rabbit (\$200 scholarship each, one male and/or female ambassador per species)

4-H Horse King and Queen Specialized application. Test to be concurrently completed with interview times on May 25, 6:00pm at the Fulton County OSU Extension Office.
