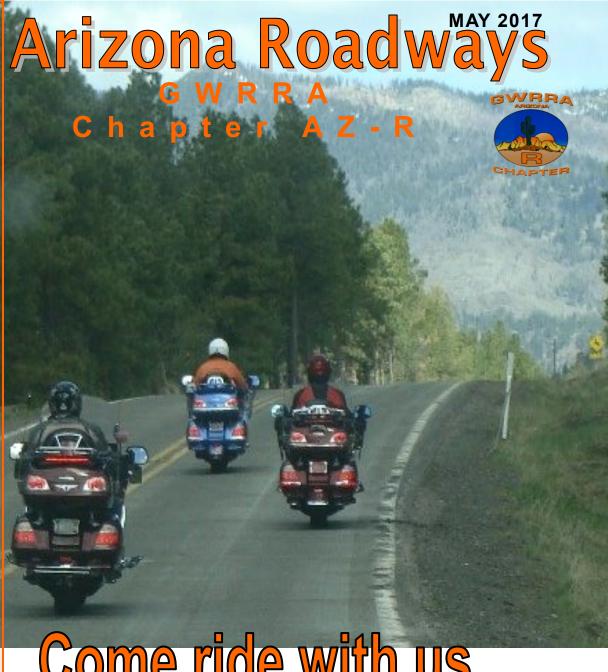

#### Why Rider Education?

The Rider Education Division of GWRRA is one of the great jewels in this organization..! When GWRRA was started back in 1978 the idea of "fun with friends for safety and knowledge" was al-

ready on the table. It took only a few years to put together a great way to learn how to be a better rider and improve your skills.

There are 4 levels: *Commitment, Education, Preparedness and Enhancement*. Each of these requires you to achieve certain goals. Once you reach Level IV you can continue to update yourself to Senior, Grand, and Life Master.

One of the greatest tools we have in the Phoenix area is the Arizona Drill Team's "Skill Enhancement." My understanding is that this was first started as a way to find and groom new members of the Drill Team, but it evolved into much more. Today it is perhaps the best training you can take to improve your skills. There is nothing like it; not only do you challenge yourself, but you will improve your confidence and find you ride safer and better than ever before. The cost? Well, it's actually free...though a donation is graciously accepted.

For years Skill Enhancement was accepted as your rider education course in the GWRRA Levels program. And for a good reason: no training provided better skills than Skill Enhancement.

Recently we have learned that GWRRA has removed Skill Enhancement from its list of skill courses. We have no ability to judge the decision, but for anyone who has taken this course, you will understand my consternation that a course of this caliber has been forsaken.

So why am writing this article? Two reasons: [1] to let you know Skill Enhancement is no longer part of Rider Education; and [2] to encourage you to take this course anyway, even if it doesn't count towards your levels standing.

What can YOU do? As a member of Chapter AZ-R you can take the Skill Enhancement course. The Drill Team has a number of offerings for this training each year. Some are long term (2 hours a week for 6 weeks) and others are a single day course (10 hours on field). Either way, you will improve or upgrade your skills and feel more confident afterwards.

For the Rider Education Levels Program we still have options:

- [1] ARC (Advanced Rider Course) or TRC (Trike Rider Course) offered by GWRRA at various events;
- [2] [2] ERC (Experienced Rider Course), offered by various Motorcycle Safety Foundation certified instructors. Check in your local area for what courses are available.

The Levels requirement is that you take one of these courses every three years, but if you take them more often (or take a Skill Enhancement in the offsetting year) you are doing yourself a favor. Rider Education is a commitment that provides not only pride and patches, but a better talent at the sport we love.

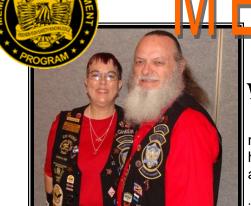

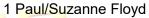

## THE MOTORIST AWARENESS PROGRAM GOLD AWARD

For almost a year now, we've been telling you that "Changes are coming" in motorist awareness efforts. One of those changes is a new award. The Motorist Awareness Program Gold Award is presented at GWRRA Region or District Conventions by the Region or District Motorist Awareness Program Officer or the Motorist

Awareness Program Director.

This award recognizes members who have contributed to the safety of motorcycle riders in at least five of the following ways:

- 1. Presentations to students of public or private schools or universities.
- 2. Presentations to members of community organizations, both civic and religious. (one event per organization counted per calendar year)
- 3. Presentation to Driving Schools.
- 4. Presentation to AAA or AARP driver classes.
- 5. Presentation or MAP exhibit at Company Safety Days. (one event per company per year)
- 6. Presentation or MAP exhibit at Community Safety Days. (one event per community per year)
- 7. Presentation or MAP exhibit at the National Night Out.
- 8. Presentation or MAP exhibit at a community festival or fair.
- 9. Presentation or MAP exhibit at Motorcycle Awareness Month activities.
- 10. Presentation or MAP exhibit at local Malls.
- 11. MAP exhibit at highway rest stops.
- 12. Presentation or MAP exhibit at Community or Company Bike Nights. (one event per community or company per year)
- 13. Presentation to Boys and Girls clubs, and Boy and Girl Scouts.
- 14. Presentation or MAP exhibit at Bike or Car shows.

Region/District Motorist Awareness Officers will review the monthly Motorist Awareness Activity sheet and select candidates for the award.

The list of Motorist Awareness Gold Award recipients will be submitted to the Motorist Awareness Program Director.

Region/District Motorist Awareness Officers will be responsible for contacting the GWRRA office to order the award pins. The first Award pin awarded to each individual will be the Motorist Awareness Gold Award header pin. Pins awarded to that individual thereafter will be year date pins.

#### **HEAT EXHAUSTION!**

With 100 degree temps already here, when we ride we need to think about staying hydrated and cool. Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke are two of the most critical dangers in warm weather riding. There are several ways to avoid these dangers. Heat Exhaustion

occurs when a person can't sweat enough to cool the body. Sweating is the body's natural air conditioner. Heat exhaustion can be caused by loss of fluid (dehydration) or loss of electrolytes.

Symptoms of heat exhaustion include

- fatigue,
- weakness,
- headache.
- dizziness or nausea,
- cramps
- the skin is pale, cool and moist. Mild heat exhaustion does not cause a decrease in a person's mental alertness, but it may occasionally cause fainting. Mild cases of heat exhaustion usually can be treated.

Treatment for heat exhaustion include

- recognize the symptoms,
- stop the activity, and
- move to a cooler place, get into air conditioning. If there isn't air conditioning available at least
  find some shade. Drink plenty of non-caffeinated and non-alcoholic beverages. Rehydration with
  water or a sports drink is the biggest treatment for heat exhaustion.

If heat exhaustion is not treated it can lead to heatstroke. Heatstroke occurs when the body fails to regulate its own temperature. Body temperature continues to rise, often 105 degrees or more.

Signs of rapidly progressing heatstroke include

- Unconsciousness for longer than a few seconds.
- Convulsions (seizure).
- Difficulty breathing.
- Confusion,
- Restlessness or anxiety.
- Fast heart rate.
- Sweating that may be heavy or may have stopped. Skin may be hot and dry. Heatstroke is a
  medical emergency and can be life threatening or result in serious long term complications. Call
  911 and move the person to a cool place, remove any unnecessary clothing, to allow the body to
  cool. Soak the body with cool water, not cold and fan the person to lower the body temperature.

So as we ride in the hot weather look for the signs and stay hydrated. Drink and carry plenty of water and use cool ties or cool vest to keep the body cool. It you do not have a cool tie or cool vest sometimes just soaking your shirt will help to keep the body cool.

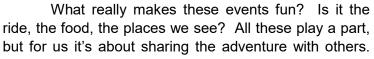
We were looking forward to Black Bart's Steakhouse, as we'd never been, but the group was bumped due to another group

#### **BTM** and Show Low

Chapter Director Bill Trask initiated the ride this way: "One of the greatest supporters of GWRRA in the Southwest has been Accessory Pit in Albuquerque, owned by Rick & Lynda Howell. If you have ever attended a District Rally in Arizona, Colorado, Utah or New Mexico, or any Region F Rally, you have met these wonderful folks. Rick will go out of his way to help and make your bike or trike a better machine; always with a trust and confidence that all me-



chanics should have from their clients. More than that, Rick & Lynda are friends.

After years in Albuquerque, the Howell's decided to retire to the White Mountains in Arizona. Retire? Well, not exactly. They are opening a new shop to service and sell bikes and trikes. For us in the Phoenix area it will be great to have them so close to us."

So, Char and I volunteered to lead a ride to the BTM (Bikes, Trikes and More) in Show Low. Our group included Bob Apple, Robert and Diane Boller, Paul and Suzie Floyd, Char Simpson and me. Our route took us west on US 60 to Superior, then along a beautiful stretch of twisties to Globe and a refuel/refresh stop. Since the Boller's are relatively new to Arizona and Chapter R, we took every opportunity to know them better and share tales of past rides.
