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Cyberbullying: Knowledge is Power (cont.)

We have also included a list of sites that have been identified as posing potential danger for students. Please note, not all of these sites are breeding grounds for cyberbullying, but the reality is that with the lack of monitoring or knowledge of how these sites work, they are creating the perfect opportunities for cyberbullies.

- **Ask.fm:** A social networking site where members interact by inviting others to ask anonymous questions.
- **Omegle:** An instant message service that promises chats with random strangers.
- **Kik:** An instant message service that also allows the sharing of photos.
- **Meet Me:** A social networking site that lets users tailor their search for potential social contacts by age and geography.
- **Vine (App):** Kids are using Vine on their phones and tablets to physically hurt and publicly humiliate each other.
- **Tumblr:** Kids can post anything from anywhere, customize everything, and find and follow anything they want.
- **SnapChat (App):** A smartphone app that allows users to send photo and videos that the app promises disappear within seconds, but which can be kept much longer.
- **Bang With Friends:** (also known as Down in Apple's App Store and "The Next Bang") allows Facebook users to discretely hookup anonymously when they reciprocate through the app. However, anonymity is not always the case.
- **Chatroulette:** Kids can anonymously video chat online with anyone, without any security blocks or filters.
- **Instagram:** A social networking site where kids can post photos and their followers can comment on their photos.
- **Edmodo:** A social networking site used in many schools. However, the site is unmonitored.
- **Keek:** A social networking site focused on microvideo sharing. Users upload video status updates and are able to share them with friends or followers.
- **ooVoo:** A video chat and instant messaging service with apps for desktop, mobile, tablets and Facebook.

These websites and links are just a few of the many resources available for educators and parents. A common theme mentioned in all of them – knowledge is power. The more equipped you are with information on this subject, the more equipped you will be to handle a bullying or cyberbullying situation.

Gaggle Auto Login

Gaggle now has the ability to automatically log users into our system when they login to their computer through their district's network. This allows your students and staff to quickly access Gaggle without having to go through the normal login process. Our Auto Login process takes advantage of the user's Microsoft Windows or Apple OS X username and password and uses those credentials to access our system. Mesquite ISD, TX

Using multiple tools enhance student learning

Mesquite Independent School District is located in Mesquite, TX just twenty minutes outside of Dallas. With over 39,000 students and 46 campuses, the district believes that “by challenging students with high expectations and a rigorous curriculum, they will excel.”

Mesquite ISD joined the Gaggle family in 2011. Their initial goal was to provide students with a safe email account. Since then, teachers in the district have expanded their use of Gaggle with tools like the Digital Locker, Mark-it Up!, Assignment Drop Boxes, GaggleTube and the iPad App. Tammy Rushing, District Facilitator of eLearning and Technology Staff Development says, “what really started sending our teachers to Gaggle was GaggleTube; for the first time, teachers were able to share YouTube videos with their students on campuses where YouTube is blocked.”

Katy Coffey, a fifth grade teacher at Rutherford Elementary added, “The fifth grade teachers are currently using Gaggle for flipped instruction and our UPSL initiative (Understand, Plan, Solve, Look back). The teachers are using GaggleTube to approve certain videos for students. Students then watch the videos at home with guided notes. Task cards are then provided to help achieve the next day’s objectives.”

The fifth grade teachers throughout the district are also utilizing the Gaggle iPad App and all of its features for flipped instruction and the UPSL initiative. Students are accessing UPSL lessons from the Assignment Drop Boxes each day and teachers are then retrieving submitted documents and grading them with the Mark-it Up! feature. “Once teachers were in Gaggle, they realized that there were more uses for it than just GaggleTube. Now that the Gaggle App has been developed and we are beginning to get iPads in the hands of students, Gaggle makes it easy for teachers to share documents and students to submit assignments,” says Tammy.

Mesquite ISD classrooms are utilizing multiple Gaggle tools to enhance student learning and engagement. They, like most districts, saw value in GaggleTube right from the start, but have since triggered additional Gaggle engagement with other tools such as the iPad App. Kudos to you Mesquite ISD for continuing to see all the possibilities that Gaggle Apps has to offer and thanks for being part of our family!

Bulletin boards, open house events and newsletters are some of the ways others can take a peek inside your classroom. We would like to encourage you to consider blogs as another way to share your class content and your students' creativity.

Blogs are more than mere online diaries. Gaggle's blogs provide you and your students the opportunity to do so much more than just post journals online. Gaggle's blogs allow you to share documents, videos, links, images and even Voki and Animoto videos in an online, anywhere format.
