ear Family,

The other day I was reminded of how blessed we are with our new facilities. When Jesus Contreras shared his baptism testimony, he said that he had been invited to play basketball in our recently built Community Hall and then was led to follow Christ by David Uratsu. Others have shared how a particular program we are now able to hold because of our facility brought them to our church. While facilities don't build relationships, they keep out the cold

and rain and are a valuable tool for fulfilling God's purpose; we have been blessed to have them.

Over the last 9.5 years we have also been blessed to have received over \$6.5 million in donations to help pay for these facilities. The total cost, including relocation expenses, architectural fees, interest on the construction loan, etc., was \$10.3 million. Our original real estate loan to finance the difference was \$3.9 million and over the last 18 months it has been paid down to \$3.8 million. But in six months we will be coming to the end of Nehemiah 3 so we have had to make some tough decisions on how to pay off the remainder of the loan.

Your Finance Committee, Board of Deacons and staff have been meeting for the past three months. We have been praying, interviewing different capital stewardship consulting firms, discussing our needs, determining the best timing and asking other churches about their experiences. As a result we have come to the following conclusions:

- 1. We will conduct our own in-house capital stewardship campaign without hiring a capital stewardship consultant.
- 2. We will postpone the start of our fourth campaign from October 2010 to January/February 2011.
- 3. We will ask all those who have been giving to Nehemiah 3 to continue giving for four additional months until we complete the new campaign.

As of right now, we are praying about campaign chairpersons and calendar, a theme and a support person. We are aware of the economic times we are in, yet we are also aware of the many opportunities. We also look forward to how much more we will be able to do once our loan is paid off.

So...pray. Through this whole process, we have seen God's hand at work. From the start of the vision to the design, the construction, the first gifts, and now the people whose lives have been changed. We are not alone – we chose to follow our God. We also pray that you will continue your Nehemiah 3 support until April 2011 at which time you will be challenged for a new commitment.

Praise God for His blessings!


## **Baptism Testimonies from Sunday, May 30**

# Most Effective Witness Profile of Rei Abe, Nichigo Secretary By Kathy Aiso

nknowingly, **Rei Abe's** father met a challenge, which positively influenced Rei. As a middle-school student in Japan, Rei hung out with six female and male friends.

#### **Misconceptions**

One day, one of these friends confided, his father's worldly behavior belied his saintly conduct at the Buddhist Temple. Appearing spiritual as temple master, this father would be out carousing during the week. This confidence brought up Rei's father, a Christian pastor. This friend also categorized Rei's father as having duo lifestyles. "My father is not like that," Rei responded.

#### Living honorable lives

Although Rei never doubted her father had nothing but upstanding behavior, she began observing him closely at night. "Did he sneak out to have some fun, like her friend's father?" she pondered. Within a short period, Rei concluded that both her dad and mom lived upright lives. A question then popped into her head, "My parents live right, but what if the religion is wrong?"

#### Comparing religious systems

God gave Rei an opportunity to compare Christianity to two major belief systems in Japan. The school's field trip to a Buddhist temple, afforded Rei the opportunity to learn more about Buddhism. Rei learned, Buddhists believed by their good actions, they would enter heaven. In contrast, she knew Christianity taught one could only go to heaven by accepting Christ as Lord and Savior.

At school, Rei was exposed to the evolution theory. Through a video, Rei later learned about the amazing ability of the bat to flawlessly navigate through dark places without use of its eyes. "This couldn't have happened by happenstance. God had to create the bat and the universe as well," Rei concluded.

In thinking about her parents' example, weighing Christianity against two major belief systems, as well as drawing the conclusion about God's existence after the video, Rei came to realize Christianity was true. In her heart, Rei knew God was real and sent His Son to die for our sins. She accepted Christ as her Savior and was baptized at her church.

#### Choice between church and basketball

A native of Ibaraki Prefecture in Japan, Rei grew up with two older brothers, Kaoru and Makoto and a

younger brother, Satoshi. They attended Mitsukaido Shalom Church, where her father, Pastor Kyoshi Matsuyama was pastor.

In high school, Rei had to choose between church and basketball. As a serious basketball player at Mitsukaido High School, Rei played center. On Sunday mornings, the team held mandatory practice, which conflicted with church. Rei couldn't do both so she wisely chose church.

even though, she really didn't want to quit the team. In tears, she announced to her teammates and coach, "I can't do this anymore.

God melted the hearts of her tough teammates and strict coach. The coach let Rei be the exception for not attending Sunday morning practice so she could attend church. She received overwhelming support in her choice from her teammates.

#### Rei meets her future husband

Following college, Rei worked as a kindergarten teacher, as well as a worker in an elderly home. Through a shared hobby, Rei later met her future husband, Aki Abe. They are the parents of three children, Samuel, Marie, and Sophie, ages 14, 11, and nine, respectively.

#### Loves riding her unicycle !!!

In the 1990s, the Abes moved to the U.S. so Aki could work here for an Internet related business. They attended a Taiwanese church in Lomita before coming to GVBC in 2002. After having their children attend VBS at GVBC, they felt led to join our church. Both Rei and Aki are actively involved in the Nichigo division. In January 2010, Rei started as the Nichigo secretary, a job which she enjoys. "The job and the pastoral staff whom I work with are so supportive and wonderful," she beamed. Outside of work and church, Rei enjoys riding the unicycle. It's a free-time pastime, which her husband and children enjoy doing too!

#### God's self-sacrificing love for us

Rei's favorite Bible verse, John 3:16 reminds her how self sacrificing, merciful, and unconditional God's love is.

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life."

Having three children, Rei can only imagine the anguish, heartbreak, and sacrifice God went through to allow His Son to die for us. His love inspires Rei to strive to be, like her parents, an effective witness for Him.

#### Mission Field

#### Jim and Leta Van Meter

Jim used the analogy about how a plant will only thrive if placed in rich soil, which has been given a lot of care and attention. Further down the line, the soil may need to be tilled and additional organic material added to create an optimum growing environment. Spiritually, Jim acknowledged that five years ago, his soul felt tired and dry, which led him to take a sabbatical.

"I came to realize I had taken my walk with the Lord for granted," Jim wrote. Jim realized he had failed to nurture and care for his soul. Like the gardening illustration, Jim needed to be aware of the condition of the soil of his soul and nurture conditions for optimum growth in the garden of his soul.

"As I care for and till the soil of my soul, then I am able to hear and receive life-giving words of love and appreciation from the Lord (2 Corinthians 3:18) — words that transform lifeless, hard, cracked soil into rich, moist garden-producing soil," he affirmed.

Jim listed the following factors as necessary for care of his soul: regular times of solitude and silence to hear from the Lord and His Word, regular day-long retreats, and weekly Sabbaths for worship and rest. This included getting out in creation to meditate and marvel at God's handiwork in nature. Jim came to the conclusion, the best thing he can bring to the missions community is the tilled soil of his soul.

"The condition of my soul is everything!" Jim shared.

Realizing tending to one's soul is paramount to an effective ministry, Jim and Leta are spreading this message. From May 21 — June 1, the Van Meters are encouraging missionaries in Costa Rica to regularly tend to the tilling the soil of their souls. They request prayer that they be sensitive to the leading of the Lord, as they seek to create an environment for receiving the lavish love of God.






