



What has living in England done for my life?

When I learned we were moving to London, England, I was most unhappy to leave my friends in South Carolina. The thing I know now is it was the best thing that could have happened to me!

Two years in London and what it meant to the rest of my life.

My father was either going to London or Norfolk, Virginia, for his next tour. In Virginia they closed all the public schools that year to keep from integrating them. It was a very messy year for them. Most of the churches opened their doors to see that the children had a year of segregated school. I am not sure who actually did the teaching.

I had a very interesting year in a British Girls school where I learned a lot and worked hard to excel. At the end of the year, I was included in the annual play of "Julius Caesar". I was the third guard. I had one line, "Halt, who goes there?" Which I said in my southern accent. The house broke down in hilarious laughter. I laughed too!

My year in the British school and my year at Bushy Park, which was like heaven really, had prepared me for a good senior year in an American school in California with 400 other new students.

A friend from South Carolina came to visit and stayed with my family. He was with us for a week. I did not study all week, but the fun week did not affect my grades at all. I attribute that to good training the year before at Bushy Park.

In college I pledged a sorority and what the girls in the different groups often wanted to talk to me about was being in England. It was my choice when pledge decisions were happening.

As an adult, I have enjoyed the friendships of many Brits because of my background and eventually I was invited to train American teachers in a New Zealand reading program called Reading Recovery (I am a reading teacher). That invitation included a year of free study at Ohio State University as a teacher's aide, and eventually exchanges in both New Zealand and Australia while we tried to figure what was different in New Zealand classrooms that made their program work so well. That was when school systems had money to spend on the education of low kids.

Now I am living in a military retirement community. Most of us have traveled a lot. And some of us are military juniors. I still fit in and have some great new friends. But so far, I have not met anyone who has been to Bushy Park. The unspoken words are – I never felt I fit in until Bushy Park. Thanks to all of you!!
