## Georgia-Vanderbilt Series

Georgia holds a 56-20-2 edge over Vanderbilt as the series dates back to 1893, however the Commodores notched a one-point victory in their last visit to Sanford Stadium. On Saturday, Georgia will have its first night game of the season when Vanderbilt comes to town. Game three this year against Middle Tennessee State was supposed to start at 7:15 p.m. but was moved to noon due to Hurricane Florence. Georgia's first-year wide receivers coach **Cortez Hankton** spent the previous three seasons coaching wide receivers for the Commodores. He joined the Bulldog staff in February, 2018.

## Homecoming At Georgia

Since 1922, Georgia is 76-18-2 in Homecoming contests. This year, the Bulldogs welcome Vanderbilt to Sanford Stadium, and the Commodores will be the Homecoming foe for the 25th time.

Georgia is 20-4 against the Commodores on Homecoming. The Commodores were the last team to beat Georgia on Homecoming, posting a 17-16 decision in 2016 to snap a streak of nine straight wins on Homecoming. In Georgia history, 10 different SEC teams have served as an opponent on Homecoming. In records dating back to 1922, Georgia has outscored its Homecoming opponents 2,536 to 1,192.

In 2015, Missouri nearly spoiled Homecoming for the Bulldogs as the game featured just five field goals, and the end result was a 9-6 Georgia win. It was the first time since 1995 against Kentucky that Georgia won a game without scoring a touchdown. Last year, Georgia dispatched Missouri 53-28 on Homecoming.

The Bulldogs went 6-1 in Homecoming games at Sanford Field (1922-28) before moving to their current home in Sanford Stadium. There have been two ties on Homecoming. In 1938, Georgia and Georgia Tech played to a scoreless tie while the 1962 game between the Bulldogs and Kentucky ended at 7-all.

Along with the game, the traditions include a Friday afternoon parade, former Redcoat Band members and UGA cheerleaders performing with the current squads during the game and at halftime. Also, a Homecoming King and Queen are crowned.

## Last Meeting in Sanford Stadium (2016): Vanderbilt 17, Georgia 16

Vanderbilt drove 75 yards in eight plays for the go-ahead touchdown with 9:43 left in the contest. The Commodores scoring drive was capped by a two-year run by Khari Blasingame. One of the key plays in the drive came when Vanderbilt converted a 3rd-and-13 screen pass that netted 37 yards to the UGA 11-yard line. On its final possession, Georgia failed to convert a 4th-and-1 when Zach Cunningham stopped Isaiah McKenzie with 56 seconds left. Cunningham led all tacklers with 19 stops. Vanderbilt grabbed the early momentum with a 95-yard kickoff return to start the contest and scored two plays later for a 7-0 advantage and led 7-6 at the half. The Bulldogs went ahead 13-10 in the third quarter following a 17-yard touchdown catch by **Isaac Nauta** from Jacob Eason. Georgia dropped to 4-3 (2-3 SEC) while the Commodores improved to 3-4 (1-3 SEC).

## 2017 Series Flashback: #5 Georgia 45, Vanderbilt 14

Georgia's ground game was in full force, tallying 423 yards on 54 carries to lead the Bulldogs to a 45-14 victory. Sony Michel (150 yards) and Nick Chubb (138) accounted for three touchdowns to pace the attack. Vanderbilt scored a touchdown right before halftime to make it 21-7 and that ended a streak by the Bulldog defense of 31 consecutive drives without giving up a touchdown. It was the longest streak since 2006 when the defense had another stretch of 31 consecutive drives without allowing a touchdown. Vanderbilt's final touchdown came following a Bulldog turnover that gave them the ball at the 1-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. The victory gave Georgia its first 6-0 start since 2005 and first six-game winning streak during a season since 2012.

## Head Football Coach



When Georgia looked for a new head coach after the 2015 season, the arrows pointed to Kirby Smart, longtime Alabama defensive coordinator and former UGA player and assistant. The 2017 *Associated Press* SEC Coach of the Year has not disappointed.

In his first year leading the Bulldogs in 2016, Georgia extended its school record to 20 consecutive bowl appearances and posted five fourth-quarter comebacks including wins over No. 8 Auburn and No. 22 North Carolina. He led UGA to an 8-5 final record, which included a

victory over TCU in the Liberty Bowl.

In 2017, Smart directed UGA to a 13-2 record, an SEC title, a win at The Rose Bowl Game during the CFP semifinal and a spot in the National Championship. He was named the **Maxwell Football Club's George Munger National Coach of the Year**. Before 2017, the Bulldogs last SEC title was 2005.

He has also made an immediate impact in recruiting, posting the nation's top-ranked class in 2018 and the third-ranked class in 2017. In addition to coaching, Smart oversees the Kirby Smart Family Foundation, which is focused on being champions in the community by supporting and giving back to needy children and families.

Smart officially came home to Georgia on Dec. 6, 2015. But he still had unfinished business at Alabama, which was chasing a national title. He juggled two jobs for a month until January 11, 2016, when the Tide won its fourth national championship in a seven-year span. Twelve hours later, he was at work in Athens.

### Quick Facts

\*2017 *Georgia Munger National Coach of the Year* finalist, leading UGA to a 13-2 record, a Rose Bowl Game victory and an appearance the CFP National Championship Game.  
 \*The Bulldogs' No. 2 AP ranking in 2017 was the team's top AP ranking since week three of the 2008 season when Georgia was No. 2.  
 \*Bulldogs captured the SEC Eastern Division by going 7-1 in 2017, including a perfect 6-0 in the division for the first time since the league split into divisions in 1992.  
 \*Seven fourth-quarter comebacks, including wins over #8 AU (2016), #22 UNC in Atlanta (2016), @ #24 Notre Dame (2017), vs. #2 Oklahoma in 2018 Rose Bowl Game.  
 \*Led UGA to its first win over a ranked team in a season opener away from Sanford Stadium in school history, posting a 33-24 win over #22 UNC during the 2016 Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Classic.

## High Octane Offense

\* Georgia is on pace to set a record for scoring average in a season. The Bulldogs scored 40+ points in their first four wins and 38 in their latest victory over the Volunteers. Georgia is averaging 43.2 points/game. The 2012 team owns the school record at 37.8.

\* The Bulldog offense has scored 24 touchdowns this season while the defense and special teams have each chipped in two scores apiece.

## Efficient Signal Caller

\* Sophomore QB **Jake Fromm** is on pace to shatter the school record in 2018. Georgia's school record is 67.9 by Hutson Mason in 2014. The SEC record is 72.3 percent held by Tim Couch (UK, 1998).

\* Fromm is 17-2 as a starter, including 5-2 versus Top 25 teams. He is ranked third in the nation in Completion Percentage at 72.5 percent. In game four of the year at Missouri, Fromm played past the third quarter for the first time.

\* Fromm is the national active leader in Passing Efficiency at 166.28.

\* During the Bulldogs' 5-0 start, Fromm has completed 66-of-91 for 924 yards, nine touchdowns and two interceptions.

\* Georgia also has true freshman QB **Justin Fields**, who was one of the nation's top recruits. After enrolling in January, he has seen action in all five games and is 15-for-19 with 147 yards and two scores.

\* Fields scampered for a career-high 45 yards on five carries during the win over the Vols and finished with two scoring runs.

\* In his career, Fromm has led his team to two comebacks when trailing at the half. One of Georgia's signature wins came with his 2018 Rose Bowl Game performance after the Bulldogs trailed 31-17 at the half and rallied to a 54-48 win in double overtime. Georgia trailed 45-38 with 3:22 remaining in the game before Fromm directed a game-tying drive.

\* Fromm's first career start came last year at #24 Notre Dame. Trailing 19-17 with 6:47 left in the contest, Fromm directed a nine play, 63-yard drive to set up the go-ahead field goal. He was 3-for-4 for 45 yards during the drive.

## A Look At The Line

\* The Bulldogs return four of five starters on the offensive line, including Freshman All-American tackle **Andrew Thomas**. Thomas went down with a left ankle injury against #24 South Carolina, and freshman **Cade Mays** filled in. Mays then started at LT versus Middle Tennessee State as Thomas continued his recovery. Thomas started and played briefly in the road win over Missouri and was back in his normal role against Tennessee.

\* This season, Georgia's starting line has featured Thomas/Mays (LT), redshirt sophomore **Solomon Kindley** (LG), senior **Lamont Gaillard** (C), redshirt sophomore **Ben Cleveland** (RG) and redshirt freshman **Isaiah Wilson** (RT). In the second half of the road win at Missouri, Cleveland went down with a leg injury and sophomore **Justin Shaffer** finished the game in that spot. Versus the Vols, Mays moved over to RG with Cleveland's absence.

\* The OL helped pave the way for 473 yards against #24 South Carolina, including 271 on the ground. In their second straight SEC road win, the Bulldogs piled up 445 yards of offense at Missouri before going for 441 against the Vols, including 251 on the ground.

## Spreading The Wealth

\* Georgia's quarterbacks have done a good job of spreading the ball around to receivers. Junior **Mecole Hardman** leads the group with 18 catches for 290 yards and four touchdowns.

\* Hardman had a career day at #24 South Carolina, hauling in six catches for 103 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown. This was Georgia's first 100-yard receiver since the 2016 Liberty Bowl versus TCU (Isaiah McKenzie, 4-103). He had a 70-yard punt return for a touchdown versus MTSU and a 54-yard touchdown catch at Missouri.

\* There has been a spirited competition to join senior **Terry Godwin** and Hardman at the top of the receiving ranks. Junior **Riley Ridley** is second on the team with 17 catches for 205 yards and three touchdowns. Against Missouri, he led the charge with five catches for 87 yards, including a 33-yard touchdown.

\* In the win over MTSU, a pair of Bulldogs caught their first touchdown pass. Sophomore **Jeremiah Holloman** snagged three catches for 90 yards and a score while senior **Jayson Stanley** had a 9-yard touchdown grab. Holloman made his lone catch against Missouri count with a 61-yard scoring catch.

\* Junior **Tyler Simmons** joins Stanley as two of the top contributors on special teams and blockers on offense. Against MTSU, Simmons did not have a catch, but took his only carry 56 yards for a touchdown. He sustained a shoulder injury at Missouri and then missed the Tennessee game.

\* The Bulldog tight ends have shown the ability to block and be options in the passing game. For example, junior **Isaac Nauta** had a team-high four catches for 47 yards against MTSU. Versus the Vols, Nauta collected a Fromm fumble and advanced it 31 yards for a touchdown and added a 17-yard catch.

\* Two of the Bulldogs' three longest runs this season have come from the receivers with Simmons' TD carry and redshirt sophomore newcomer **Demetris Robertson's** 72-yard TD run versus APSU.

\* **Demetris Robertson**, a native of Savannah, Ga., and graduate of Savannah Christian, arrived in Athens during pre-season camp and was cleared to play for Georgia this fall after spending the last two years at the University of California.



## Strong Start To 2018

\* Georgia is tied for third in the SEC in Scoring Defense, allowing just 13.0 points/game.

\* The Bulldogs held Tennessee scoreless in the first half, making it the second time they have held an opponent scoreless in the first two quarters in 2018 (Austin Peay). Georgia has held opponents scoreless in 11 of 20 quarters this season. With the Vols coming in averaging 205 yards rushing a game, the Bulldogs held them to 66 on the ground and only 209 total yards.

\* In the first half of the Bulldogs' win at Missouri, the Tigers ran 38 plays for 159 yards and were held to a single touchdown. Missouri entered the contest averaging 43.7 points. In the second half, the Tigers tallied 22 points and finished the game with 393 total yards on 85 plays.

\* Georgia's defense held #24 South Carolina to just 17 points, had a Red Zone stop and an INT in the SEC opener on the road.

\* The Bulldog defense posted a shutout in the season opener, limiting Austin Peay to 152 total yards (91 rushing, 61 passing) on 50 plays. Previously, Georgia's last shutout came on Sept. 30, 2017, when it beat Tennessee 41-0 in Knoxville.

## Looking For Leaders At LB

\* Senior OLB **D'Andre Walker** is emerging as the leader on the outside. Most recently, Walker registered five stops, including a sack and a forced fumble, versus the Vols. He recorded four tackles, including a pair of sacks, and forced two fumbles in the win at Missouri.

\* Walker's three forced fumbles through five games is tied for third nationally. Also of note, he has 13 tackles and five of those are TFLs, including a team-leading four sacks for loss of 23 yards.

\* After losing Roquan Smith at inside linebacker off the 2017 squad to the NFL, Georgia has senior **Juwan Taylor**, sophomore **Monty Rice**, junior **Tae Crowder** and senior **Natrez Patrick** vying for playing time at ILB.

\* Rice and Patrick each had five tackles in the victory over Tennessee and Taylor recovered his team-leading second fumble.

\* Crowder highlighted the Missouri game with a 43-yard interception return, marking the first pick of his career.

\* Rice had a career-high eight tackles versus the Gamecocks while Taylor was credited with a touchdown after DB **Deandre Baker** dropped the ball at the 1 yard line following a 55-yard INT return.

## Returning Starters Headline Defensive Line Group

\* A week after surrendering 172 yards on the ground at Missouri, Georgia has held South Carolina (54 on 20) and Tennessee (66 on 25) to a total of 120 yards during its 3-0 SEC start.

\* Veterans **Tyler Clark** and **Jonathan Ledbetter** anchor the defensive line.

\* Behind Clark, Ledbetter and junior **Julian Rochester**, Georgia is rotating in juniors **Michael Barnett**, **Michail Carter**, sophomore **Devonte Wyatt**, senior **DaQuan Hawkins-Muckle** and graduate transfer **Jay Hayes**. Hayes arrived in Athens during the summer after graduating from Notre Dame. He had seven tackles during the Bulldogs' win over the Irish in 2017.

\* The Bulldogs held Missouri QB Drew Lock to no touchdown passes in their trip to Columbia. Clark leads the interior linemen with 12 stops, including 1.5 TFL, while Ledbetter has eight tackles.

## Baker, Reed Back To Lead Defensive Backfield

\* Senior DB **Deandre Baker**, who was named a preseason All-American by several outlets, had six stops, two pass breakups and the team's first interception in 2018 (*along with a 55-yard return*) at #24 South Carolina. He was named the *Athlon National Defensive Player of the Week* following the contest. He followed that performance up with another pick and a fumble recovery in the win over MTSU. Versus Missouri, Baker had seven stops.

\* Georgia also welcomes back junior **J.R. Reed**. He finished

with three tackles against the Gamecocks and had a pick in the end zone to thwart a scoring chance. In the 2018 season opener, Reed was the leading tackler with six stops and had a team-best eight versus Missouri and six against Tennessee.

\* Sophomore **Richard LeCounte** has started all five games this year. He led the team with a career-high 10 tackles and a pass breakup at #24 South Carolina.

\* The candidates in the secondary who have seen action this season include: senior **Jarvis Wilson**, junior **Tyrique McGhee**, sophomore **William Poole**, **Deangelo Gibbs**, **Mark Webb**, red-shirt freshman **Eric Stokes**, freshman **Tyson Campbell**.

\* Campbell and Stokes had career highlights in the win at Missouri. Campbell started the game by forcing a fumble, recovering it and scampering 64 yards for a touchdown. Stokes blocked a punt and returned it eight yards for another of the Dogs' scores.

## Blankenship Back

\* Preseason All-American candidate PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** was named the *SEC Special Teams Player of the Week* following his two field goals (44, 45) and five PATs in the 41-17 rout at #24 South Carolina.

\* Honored as one of 11 players nationwide named to the

**2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team** for his dedication to the community combined with his on the field performance.

\* 27-for-27 in PATs this year and has made seven of his nine field goal attempts.

\* Leads the nation with 37 touchbacks out of 39 KOs this year.

\* Set a Rose Bowl Game record by drilling a career-long 55-yard field goal during the 2OT win over #2 Oklahoma. His performance included a 38-yard FG in overtime.

\* Last year, 67 of his kickoffs were touchbacks, which was a new school record. The old mark was by Kevin Butler (51 in 1981).

\* True freshman **Jake Camarda** started his career versus APSU with three punts for a 55 yard average (*fifth best in UGA history*), including a long of 63. He averaged 46.0 against MTSU and is averaging 44.9 this year, which ranks fifth in the SEC.

## SEC's Leading Punt Returner Back

\* Junior returner/receiver **Mecole Hardman** is leading the SEC in Punt Return average at 29.5 and is fifth in the league in all purpose yardage (107.0). He is back in the lineup after having 23 punt returns for 271 yards and an 11.8 average in 2017 (*all of those led the league*). Also, Hardman was second in the SEC in kickoff returns with a 25.2 average (20 returns for 505 yards).

\* Had a 70-yard PR for a touchdown versus MTSU. Hardman had his first kickoff return of the season at Missouri (3 for 91).

## Offensive Output

\* The Bulldogs scored 45 in the win over Austin Peay, 41 during the SEC road victory over #24 South Carolina, 49 while tallying their third win of the season in the matchup with Middle Tennessee, 43 at Missouri and 38 during their win over Tennessee to improve to 5-0. Currently, Georgia is averaging 43.2 points/game.

\* Last year, Georgia averaged 35.4 points per game during its run to the SEC title, a win at the Rose Bowl Game and a spot in the College Football Playoff National Championship.

## Tailback By Committee

\* While Georgia counted on a record-setting tandem in the backfield over the last couple of years, the Bulldogs are calling on a variety of tailbacks to lead the attack in 2018, including sophomore **D'Andre Swift**, juniors **Elijah Holyfield** and **Brian Herrien** and freshman **James Cook**.

\* Swift started the first four games, is tied with Holyfield for the most carries (52) and has 240 yards and a team-leading four touchdowns, including two versus the Vols.

\* In the last three wins over MTSU, at Missouri and versus Tennessee, Holyfield went for his first career 100-yard rushing performance (8 for 100) and scored his second touchdown of the year against the Blue Raiders, collected 90 yards on 14 carries versus the Tigers and then registered 78 yards on 16 carries against the Vols. He leads the team with 368 yards on the ground.

\* Herrien now stands third on the team with 26 carries for 156 yards, including 56 yards in the win over the Vols with 30 coming during one of Georgia's fourth quarter scoring drives.

\* Georgia is replacing tailbacks Nick Chubb and Sony Michel. They completed their Bulldog career in 2017 as the top pair in college football history, amassing 8,407 rushing yards and 77 rushing touchdowns.

\* Incidentally, Chubb (Cleveland Browns) and Sony Michel (New England Patriots) each scored their first NFL touchdowns this past Sunday.

## N.O.T. Just Scoring On Offense

\* The Bulldogs' 28 touchdowns this season have included 24 by the offense, two by the defense and two by special teams.

\* The latest N.O.T.s (*Non-Offensive Touchdowns*) came in the 43-29 road win over Missouri. Georgia had a 20-7 lead at halftime and the offense did not have a touchdown.

\* The Bulldogs' first score came on a forced fumble/64-yard return for a touchdown by freshman **Tyson Campbell**.

\* In the second quarter, redshirt freshman **Eric Stokes** blocked his first career punt and returned it eight yards for a score. This marked the 10th defensive/special teams score in the **Kirby Smart** era. In fact, Georgia's first TD in both of the first two SEC games this year were scored by the defense.

\* Also, it was the first time since 2015 at Tennessee that Georgia had registered a special teams touchdown and a defensive score in the same game. That year, current Chicago Bears linebacker Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.

## Blankenship Latest Good Works Team Rep

\* When junior PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** was named to the **2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team** for his dedication to the community, he joined a long list of Bulldogs who have garnered this honor.

# 2017 GAME SUMMARIES

## No. 5 Georgia 45, Vanderbilt 14

Oct. 7, 2017 • Vanderbilt Stadium - Nashville, Tenn.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** - The fifth-ranked Georgia Bulldogs used a profligate ground attack and a limiting defense to sink the Vanderbilt Commodores 45-14 Saturday at Vanderbilt Stadium.

On Georgia's opening possession, the Bulldogs marched 83 yards on seven plays – all on the ground – concluding with a 33-yard touchdown run by Chubb who tallied 69 yards on five carries in the drive.

The Bulldogs' second scoring drive started after the Commodores shanked a punt, leaving Georgia a short field to work with. On a 3rd-and-goal, Fromm connected with Swift out of the backfield for a 5-yard touchdown pass to put UGA up 14-0 early in the second quarter. Michel notched 46 yards on the ground on five carries in the eight-play drive.

Georgia's longest drive of the first half lasted 8:12 and ended with a 14-yard scamper by Chubb that made it 21-0. Earlier in the drive on a 3rd-and-14, Fromm found Godwin for a 23-yard gain that put Georgia on Vandy's side of the field. The last two plays of the drive consisted of a read-option keep by Fromm for 16-yards and Chubb's untouched score.

Vanderbilt broke Georgia's defensive streak of scoreless quarters at seven when the Commodores punched in a rushing touchdown in the final minute of the first half to make it 21-7.

It took all of one minute and 46 seconds and four plays for Georgia to strike in the opening possession of the second half. After a 20-yard gain by Michel, Fromm threw a dart to Godwin for a 47-yard touchdown, giving Georgia a 28-7 lead.

The Georgia defense forced a three-and-out of the Commodores on the next possession, giving the offense the ball again. The Bulldogs bested their last scoring drive by scoring on the third play this time. Michel busted through the middle and bolted 50 yards for a touchdown, which put him over the 100-yard rushing mark. The drive was all Michel as he carried it three times for 64 yards.

Redshirt sophomore place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship booted five touchbacks and added a 27-yard field goal in the 3rd quarter.

Georgia finished its scoring display in the fourth quarter with a 15-yard run by sophomore back Elijah Holyfield. Holyfield finished with 51 yards on seven carries.

The Bulldogs improved to 6-0 on the season for the first time since 2005 and moved to 3-0 in the conference. Vanderbilt dropped to 3-3 on the season and remains winless in the conference at 0-3.

### **Coach Kirby Smart said...**

"I was really proud of the offensive line today. They had a little bit of a chip on their shoulders from last year, because they didn't feel like they played their best game against that team. Obviously, they don't have some of the same guys back, but they have some of them – it was the same defensive lineman. We think our offensive line played physical and our backs ran hard. Jim (Chaney) called a good game and the offense did a nice job today."

### **Worth Noting...**

- Georgia amassed a season-high 423 rushing yards as senior running backs Nick Chubb and Sony Michel led the way with 138 and 150 yards, respectively. The 100-yard rushing game marked Chubb's 21st of his career and his two touchdowns moved him ahead of Todd Gurley and Lars Tate for career rushing touchdowns with 37.

- Defensively, junior inside linebacker Roquan Smith was the team's leading tackler for the fourth time this season as he collected seven total stops and added a pass breakup.

- When Vanderbilt scored the touchdown with 28 seconds left in the first half, it ended a streak by the Bulldog defense of 31 consecutive drives without giving up a TD. That stretch was the longest since 2006 when the Bulldogs defense also had a streak of 31 drives. Vanderbilt's TD was the first allowed by Georgia since the fourth quarter of the Samford game.

- Georgia went 4-for-4 (3 TDs, 1 FG) inside the Red Zone to remain perfect on the year now at 23-for-23 including 17 TDs and six field goals. Georgia is tied for first nationally in that category.

- This is the first time since the 2012 season that the Bulldogs have posted a six-game winning streak during a season. Georgia now leads the all-time series with the Commodores 56-20-2 dating back to 1893.

- Junior Juwan Taylor (ILB) made his first career start while sophomore Julian Rochester (DL) made his first of the year and seventh of his career. Redshirt freshman Solomon Kindley (RG) returned his starting role, it was his third of the year. Taylor becomes the 12th first-time starter this year.

# 2018 GAME SUMMARIES

## No. 2 Georgia 38, Tennessee 12

Sept. 29, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs fended off the Tennessee Volunteers Saturday afternoon 38-12 in front of a crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium and a CBS national television audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 5-0 overall and 3-0 in Southeastern Conference play with the victory against UT, which drops to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in league competition.

With the Volunteers entering the contest averaging 205 yards on the ground each game this season, Georgia limited Tennessee to 66 rushing yards while producing five rushing touchdowns on offense.

The rushing attack featured the first multi-touchdown outings on the ground for sophomore D'Andre Swift and freshman quarterback Justin Fields. Swift found the end zone on a 1-yard pitch in the second quarter, and later returned with a 14-yard score in the final period. Fields, who rushed five times for 45 yards, scored on a 12-yard scamper in the third quarter and followed with a 15-yard touchdown run to cement the 38-12 win.

On 3rd-and-9 in the first quarter, Tennessee redshirt junior linebacker Darrell Taylor forced the ball out of Fromm's hands, but the fumble found junior tight end Isaac Nauta, who ran for a 31-yard touchdown.

After Rodrigo Blankenship booted a 43-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter, Fields jumpstarted the scoring drive to end the half, contributing a 13-yard run. Fromm continued it, connecting with senior wide receiver Riley Ridley and sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman for 12 yards apiece. Swift finalized the 17-0 halftime margin with his first touchdown run pitched by Fromm and sealed by a Blankenship PAT.

Back from intermission, Georgia resumed on offense with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by Fields' touchdown with an elevated horizontal dive into the end zone. The Volunteers then connected on passing touchdowns of 37 and 35 yards, respectively, to cut the lead to 24-12 (Georgia denied both two-point conversions).

Nevertheless, the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in 7:39, finished by Swift's second TD, for a 31-12 lead. On the ensuing Tennessee drive, senior OLB D'Andre Walker forced a fumble recovered by senior ILB Juwan Taylor, and Fields sealed a 38-12 decision with his 15-yard score.

### Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We struggled at times. We didn't hit some of the plays we thought we could have. We must execute at a higher level to be successful. There were times when we didn't have much movement up front. But when we had to play well in the second half, we challenged them and they did so. It's big when you answer a challenge, but it shouldn't have to come to that. We preach good habits, competitiveness, physicality."

### Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs scored 38 in their latest win over Tennessee to improve to 5-0 overall, 3-0 in the SEC. Georgia has tallied 216 points for the year, for an average of 43.2. Georgia's point total through five games is the most since 2014 (225 and that squad was 4-1).

- Georgia's first points came in an unorthodox fashion. Junior TE Isaac Nauta scooped up a Jake Fromm fumble and ran it 31 yards for a touchdown on a fumble advance to give Georgia a 7-0 edge at the 8:52 mark in the first period. This marks the third consecutive SEC game that the Bulldogs have scored their first touchdown on a return following a fumble.

- Sophomore QB Jake Fromm completed the game 16-for-22 for 185 yards and got his 19th consecutive start at QB. Freshman QB Justin Fields also took some snaps and finished 1-for-2 for 5 yards and ran the ball five times for 45 yards, including scoring runs of 12 and 15 yards.

- Senior OLB D'Andre Walker had five stops, including a sack and forced fumble. Walker has 13 tackles on the year with five tackles for loss and four sacks.

- Junior DB Tyrique McGhee made his third career start and first since the 2017 Tennessee game. Freshman Cade Mays started at RG in place of the injured Ben Cleveland.



# 2018 GAME SUMMARIES

## No. 2 Georgia 43, Missouri 29

Sept. 22, 2018 • Memorial Stadium - Columbia, Mo.

**COLUMBIA, Mo.** - A defensive first half and offensive onslaught in the second half pushed the second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs past the Missouri Tigers, 43-29, Saturday afternoon at Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium in front of a nationally televised ESPN audience.

The Bulldogs headed into the half with a 20-7 lead after defense and special teams dominated the pace of the game. On third-and-nine, Campbell stripped Missouri's Albert Okwuegbunam and scoop-scored for a 64-yard fumble return to put the first points on the board.

After the Tigers evened the score, junior place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship connected on a 44-yard field goal to move Georgia back in front 10-7. On the ensuing drive, the Georgia defense produced another turnover – this time a 43-yard interception return by linebacker Tae Crowder. The takeaway turned into another Blankenship try, a 21-yard field goal, for the 13-7 lead early in the second quarter.

Special teams then made its splash later in the second to put the Bulldogs up 20-7. Georgia bombarded Mizzou punter Corey Fatony with Eric Stokes blocking the kick and scooping the football for an 8-yard touchdown.

A back-and-forth third quarter saw both teams trade touchdowns. First, Georgia with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Ridley capped the five-play, 59-yard drive. Mizzou responded with a long drive and score, but the Bulldogs struck on their second play from scrimmage. Fromm threw a jump ball to sophomore receiver Jeremiah Holloman who eluded the sideline to run free for a 61-yard touchdown.

The Tigers got the last touchdown in the third to put the score at 33-22, and the scoring commenced immediately in the fourth quarter. On the first play, Fromm connected with a wide-open Mecole Hardman for a 54-yard touchdown pass to finish the Bulldogs' longest drive of the game that spanned 77 yards in just five plays.

Missouri quarterback Drew Lock pulled the game to a 40-29 margin on an 11-yard run with 10:47 left in the game, but the Bulldogs ate nearly five minutes off the clock before Mizzou blocked a field goal, but the Georgia defense forced a turnover on downs to mitigate the loss. Another drive taking up 3:17 ended with a 40-yard Blankenship field goal, putting the game at 43-29 with less than two minutes remaining.

### Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"The flow of the game was about what I thought it would be, there was a lot of emotional big plays. I didn't see us having the big plays in the turnover game with the fumble recovery and blocked punt, but they were really big plays. We struggled some to stop the run today, which is not indicative of defense we want to have, and we struggled to run the ball. When you have that combination then you are going struggle some and we did. Give Missouri credit, they have a good football team. We knew that coming in. I've always respected them. They've won nine of the last 10 games and you don't do that by accident."

### Worth Noting...

- For the fourth straight game this year, Georgia (4-0, 2-0 SEC) scored at least 40 points for the first time since the 2012 season. In 2012, Georgia opened the year with five straight games of scoring at least 40 apiece. This season, Georgia now is averaging 44.5 points a game. The school record is 37.8, set in 2012.
- Missouri ran a total of 85 plays, which is four more than No. 2 Oklahoma ran in the Rose Bowl double-overtime game, the previous high against a Kirby Smart team.
- Eric Stokes' blocked punt with a TD marked the first since CJ Byrd in 2006 against UAB. Alongside Tyson Campbell's 68-yard fumble return, it was the first time since the 2015 road game at Tennessee that Georgia has scored a defensive TD and special teams TD in the same game. That year, Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.
- The Georgia defense held senior quarterback Drew Lock without a touchdown in the air. Senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker had two forced fumbles and two sacks of Lock. The Bulldogs had one sack coming in to the game, which also belonged to Walker.
- After a 6-for-14 first half, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm went 7-for-9 for 194 yards and three touchdowns in the second.

# 2018 GAME SUMMARIES

## No. 3 Georgia 49, Middle Tennessee 7

Sept. 15, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - Forty-nine Bulldog points and a definitive Georgia defense backed a resounding 49-7 victory against the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders at Sanford Stadium.

The Bulldog offense completed the contest with 484 total yards, including 382 in the first half. Averaging 45.3 points per game this season, the Bulldogs have scored 40-plus points through three consecutive matchups.

Junior tailback Elijah Holyfield led the Bulldog run game, becoming the first Georgia running back to record a 100-yard game this season, reaching the mark in the first half.

He was joined by sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm, who threw for an efficient 10-for-12 clip with three touchdowns and 128 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman paced the pass game with 90 yards on three catches, becoming the third different Bulldog receiver to do so in as many games.

The Bulldogs opened the contest with a seven-play, 87-yard drive, highlighted by Holyfield's career-long 66-yard rush. Three plays later, tight end Charlie Woerner provided a block to set up the Fromm-Hardman five-yard connection. Junior wide receiver Mecole Hardman leads the receivers with three touchdowns this season.

Senior defensive back Deandre Baker snagged his second interception of the season, which he returned for 26 yards. Holloman cemented the 14-0 lead with his first career touchdown.

To usher in the second quarter, junior wide receiver Tyler Simmons broke free for a career-long 56-yard rushing touchdown, the first of his career. Hardman widened the Georgia lead to 28 on a 70-yard punt return, the first since Isaiah McKenzie in 2016.

Senior wide receiver Riley Ridley capped a 4-play, 74-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown on a pass from Fromm for the 35-7 advantage. Freshman quarterback Justin Fields sent the Bulldogs into intermission with his first rushing touchdown of his career.

Georgia tacked on another career-first touchdown with a nine-yard pass from Fromm to senior wide receiver Jayson Stanley in the middle of the end zone.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Every player who goes in needs to perform like a starter. There's no room for error because we're one play away from those guys... I like the toughness we show during the week. We've created a standard the last couple of years, and now we're owning it with players holding other players accountable."

### Worth Noting...

- The 49-7 victory over Middle Tennessee gives Georgia its third consecutive win with at least 40 points. The Bulldogs last did that when they started the 2012 season with five straight 40+ point games.

- Junior TB Elijah Holyfield had a career-long 66-yard run on the Bulldogs' first possession to set up atouchdown three plays later. Holyfield completed the half with eight carries for a career-high 100 yards. The last back to hit the century mark was Sony Michel (181) and Nick Chubb (145) in the Rose Bowl Game win over Oklahoma last year.

- Junior WR Tyler Simmons took a handoff at the beginning of the second quarter a career long 56 yards for his first career touchdown of any kind. This capped a season-long scoring drive of 94 yards, which was six plays and lasted 2:40, and was Georgia's longest scoring drive since the Bulldogs went 98 yards on 11 plays in 6:34 versus Auburn in 2014.

- Mecole Hardman, junior WR who led the SEC in punt returns/yards/avg. last year, returned a punt 70 yards in the second quarter for his first career PR for a touchdown to give the Bulldogs a 28-0 edge. Isaiah McKenzie was the last Georgia player to return a punt for a score after he went 82 yards versus UL-Lafayette in 2016.



# 2018 GAME SUMMARIES

## No. 3 Georgia 41, No. 24 South Carolina 17

Sept. 8, 2018 • Williams-Brice Stadium - Columbia, S.C.

**Columbia, S.C.** - The No. 3 Georgia Bulldogs routed the 24th-ranked South Carolina Gamecocks Saturday afternoon 41-17 in front of a crowd of 83,140 at Williams-Brice Stadium and a CBS national audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 2-0 overall and earned their first Southeastern Conference win over USC (1-1, 0-1). The victory marks Georgia's seventh ranked win in 30 games under head coach Kirby Smart.

With an efficient 15-for-18 clip, 194 yards and a touchdown, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm guided Georgia (2-0, 1-0 SEC) to its highest point production in Columbia, dating back to 1894.

Five more Bulldogs joined Fromm with trips to the end zone: senior linebacker Juwan Taylor, running backs D'Andre Swift, Elijah Holyfield, Brian Herrien and wide receiver Mecole Hardman, who also led the receiving group with six completions for 103 yards – both career bests.

The Georgia defense produced a 7-0 Bulldog lead within the game's first minute. A deflected pass from Jake Bentley intended for running back Rico Dowdle found the hands of senior defensive back Deandre Baker, who returned it for 55 yards but fumbled inches before the end zone. Taylor trailed it and completed the touchdown.

Following a South Carolina three-and-out, a 30-yard Fromm-Hardman completion and a 15-yard Gamecock penalty positioned Georgia in the red zone. The next play, Swift sealed the two-touchdown lead with an untouched 17-yard rush. Place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship soon followed with a 45-yard strike for a 17-0 lead.

South Carolina answered back with 10 points on a halfback pass play from Deebo Samuel to Bryan Edwards and a Parker White 26-yard kick, but Blankenship boomed a second 45-yard field goal for the 20-10 lead at the halftime buzzer.

Back from the locker room, the Bulldogs directed a 6-play, 75-yard possession, capped by a 34-yard pass from Fromm to Hardman for the 27-10 advantage. Holyfield and Herrien each added trips to the end zone in the third quarter, and Georgia cruised from there to a 41-17 final.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"At the end of the day, they (South Carolina) just wore down ... You could just see the air coming out of them a little bit as they wore down physically. The big stop of the game to me was either the first or second drive in the second half. We had third-and-2 or third-and-3 and stopped them. They had to punt it right back to us. The defense was right back out there. That takes its toll. I think our conditioning showed through. A lot of credit goes to coach (Scott) Sinclair and the strength staff. They worked those kids hard all summer, so they could prepare for second halves like that.

### Worth Noting...

- Georgia carried a 20-10 advantage to halftime and posted a 41-17 win, marking the most points it has ever scored in Columbia in the series that dates back to 1894. The 24-point margin of victory was the most in Columbia since 1971. Georgia improved to 2-0 (1-0 SEC) on the year and has won four in a row over USC.

- Junior WR Mecole Hardman established a career-high for receiving yards with 103 on six catches. Hardman was the first Bulldog receiver to have a 100-yard game since Isaiah McKenzie (103) vs. TCU in the 2016 Liberty Bowl win.

- Senior DB Deandre Baker made his first interception of the year and the sixth of his career in the first quarter, returning it 55 yards before dropping it before crossing the goal line. Senior ILB Juwan Taylor scooped up the fumble and scored to put Georgia up 7-0. Taylor's touchdown marked Georgia's first INT returned for a TD since Maurice Smith took one 35 yards vs. Auburn in 2016.

- Junior PK Rodrigo Blankenship gave the Bulldogs a 17-7 lead late in the opening period on a 45-yard field goal and then made a 44-yarder as the first half expired. He is now 3-for-3 on the year and 12-for-18 in his career from 40+. He logged six more touchbacks on kickoffs today, improving to 14-14 on the season.

- Sophomores DB Richard LeCounte and ILB Monty Rice led the team with career highs in tackles: 10 and 8, respectively.

# 2018 GAME SUMMARIES

## Georgia 45, Austin Peay 0

Sept. 1, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

**ATHENS, Ga.** - A stout defensive effort coupled with an explosive Georgia offense lifted the Bulldogs to a 45-0 victory against the Austin Peay Governors in the season opener at Sanford Stadium on Saturday afternoon in front of a capacity crowd of 92,746 and an ESPN national televised audience.

As the Georgia defense held the Governors scoreless in the first half, every offensive possession from the Red and Black resulted in a Georgia score. The first of the 2018-19 season, a Rodrigo Blankenship 34-yard field goal capped a 10-play, 41-yard offensive drive directed by Fromm.

Following the first of many stands from the Bulldog defense, the Georgia offense conducted an 11-play, 80-yard march, featuring 46 total yards from Swift. Junior Riley Ridley claimed the first touchdown of the season and a 10-0 lead with a 10-yard connection with Fromm.

Thirty-nine seconds later, senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker placed the ball back into the hands of the Bulldog offense, recovering a fumble from Austin Peay quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall. The next play, Swift ran for an 8-yard touchdown, sending Blankenship to the field to secure the extra point and the 17-0 margin.

The Bulldog debuts continued into the second quarter: Fields entered the game and placed the ball in the hands of junior wide receiver Demetris Robertson. With a pair of blocks from the tight end tandem of Isaac Nauta and Charlie Woerner, the open field presented itself for the Cal transfer, cementing his first Georgia score on a career-high 72-yard run to set up the 24-0 lead.

After a three-and-out from Austin Peay, a 9-play, 69-yard drive was finalized with a handoff to Holyfield, who eluded multiple Governor defenders on his way to the end zone with a 17-yard touchdown. Junior Mecole Hardman closed out the half for the Bulldogs, using his speed to out-run the Austin Peay secondary to a 38-0 advantage with the help of a Blankenship extra point.

In the second half, a 36-yard run from Cook positioned the Bulldogs in Austin Peay territory, set up for a Fields-Nauta 12-yard touchdown. Blankenship sealed the final at 45-0.

### Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We're happy to get the win. It was a good way to start. The kids played hard. But there are a lot of things we can improve on. We knew we couldn't get better until we played a game. We'll learn from this one, learn from our mistakes. We'll get some things ironed out."

### Worth Noting...

- The shutout marked the first in a season opener since 2003 against Clemson. Before Austin Peay, the most recent shutout for the Bulldogs came against Tennessee in 2017 (41-0), and the most recent team to be held scoreless for two quarters was Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The Bulldog defense held the Governors to 152 total yards and seven first downs on 50 plays. In the first half alone, Georgia limited Austin Peay to 81 yards with one trip to the Red Zone.
- Offensive production was spread between 11 receivers from three different quarterbacks: sophomore Jake Fromm and freshmen Justin Fields and Matthew Downing.
- D'Andre Swift paced the backfield with eight carries and a career-high four completions. The Philadelphia, Penn. native primarily shared responsibilities with juniors Brian Herrien and Elijah Holyfield and freshman James Cook.
- Demetris Robertson's lone carry brought a 72-yard career high touchdown, the longest run by a Bulldog since Sony Michel went 75 yards in the Rose Bowl against Oklahoma.
- Georgia had six first-time starters on offense and defense, including one true freshman, as well as true freshman punter Jake Camarda: redshirt freshman OT Isaiah Wilson, junior WR Tyler Simmons, senior WR (and team captain for Austin Peay) Ahkil Crumpton, senior OLB D'Andre Walker, freshman DB Tyson Campbell and sophomore OLB Walter Grant.
