From the Principal

Welcome to week six. It seems hard to believe that we are officially half way through the term. Every term is busy, however term four is particularly busy in schools with end of semester assessment and reporting, end of year finalisations and early preparations for 2022. I cannot encourage the importance of every community stakeholder looking after their own wellbeing. We hope that all families generate and radiate positive and happy lifestyles, however the reality is, that from time to time changes and unfortunate turning of events can happen to anyone of us at any time. Hence the importance of looking after oneself and each other. If your child or your family ever need some additional assistance please don't hesitate to reach out to a member of our school community. We have a Guidance Officer Joanne Jackson who is onsite every Wednesday and our school Chaplain is onsite every Tuesday and Friday, should you have any wellbeing concerns that you would like to discuss. You can call the office to request to make an appointment or to request a call back. If your child or family requires assistance on an alternative day, please call as we can still direct your query to access a support service. Additionally, we have included below a resource which we previously shared with you during Mental Health Week last month. This resource includes helpful community points of contact that you may like to save, perhaps even print out and have somewhere handy at home.

Parent Survey

This year was the first year that all Queensland schools were required to create their student Code of Conduct outlining school expectations, responsibilities, and approaches to both negative and positive behaviour. Our student Code of Conduct codifies the Department of Education policy and procedures, and the department of education recommended Positive Behaviour for Learning evidence-based framework. We are seeking your feedback on our school, student Code of Conduct, and our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL), framework. Working in positive partnership with parents and carers is important to improving & enhancing outcomes and your feedback is highly valued. This week, we will be sending through a short survey which we would appreciate if you could please complete by Friday 19 November to the office, via the suggestion box.

2022 Planning

We are continuing to plan for our 2022 classes and at this stage we anticipate approximately 180 students who will be attending Gleneagle State School in 2022 next year, with indicatively 8 classes predicted for 2022. It's important to remember that every state school staffing is dependent upon the Day 8 enrolment census at the start of each new school year. Class composition, teacher year level allocations and class placements are all subject to adjustment or change in the days following the Day 8 Census, as Education Queensland adjusts each school's entitlement.

There are numerous variables which need to be considered in placing students in a new year level and class. It's important to acknowledge our current class teachers will have the best idea in relation to this placement of students as they see your child in the class context each and every day. They see the social interactions and whilst you may think a friendship is positive for your child, it may not be the best dynamic in the classroom context. Classroom teachers collaborate with our Student Support Services and Leadership team to formulate classes. While we know your students well and you know your child best, if there is any information you feel we need to take into account when placing your child in a class for 2022, could you please email the school on administration@gleneagless.eq.edu.au. This is not a pick a teacher or friends request, but information that may be pertaining to your potential changes, challenges affecting your child's health and wellbeing. While there is no guarantee that requests will be met, information will be taken into consideration and requests will be considered on a case by case basis. Please email by no later than November 16, 2021.

Before the end of term, we will inform students of their 2022 placement and introduce them to their 2022 class teacher. If you know of families in catchment or moving into catchment planning to enrol, please encourage them to contact our school. Out of catchment applications to attend Gleneagle SS can also be made and are subject to in catchment capacity, context and are subject to Principal approval. If your children will not be returning to Gleneagle SS in 2022, please let the office know ASAP.

Get Set for Prep and 'Yarn 'n Eats'

Thank you to those who have attended our Get Set for Prep program over the last few weeks. To celebrate, the school will be hosting a Yarn and Eats event. Traditional Mununjali Elders – Aunty Gerry and Aunty Janis, will join our future Prep students and families for a story time, providing an opportunity to hear about some traditional local stories, language and connection to Country. Our future Prep students and families are invited to stay for morning tea and have a yarn with Aunty Gerry and Aunty Janis.

Learn to Swim Program

The Learn to Swim Program will be completed this year between Wednesday 24 November and Thursday 2 December. This program aligns with the Education Queensland water safety and swimming program that aligns with the Australian Curriculum for students in Prep to Year 6. The P & C Association have kindly donated towards Travel & Pool entry costs, and with sporting grants received the reduced cost to parents this year is \$15.00 per student. Further details can be found on the permission slip, which was sent home last week. Invoices were also issued via email.

We would like to give a special thanks The Lions Club of Beaudesert who are providing Swim Shirts for our Year One students. The swim shirts will be distributed to the students later this term for use during the swimming program and can be kept by them for future use.

QuoCKa Reading

Quota International of Jimboomba volunteers recently donated their time to read with our Prep students and applied for grants to buy books for students and the school library. Students received a book of their own with an extra copy donated to the school library for schoolmates to borrow and read. Stickers were placed inside each book – student book stickers were signed and dated; library book stickers feature a logo of the organisation that donated the funds to buy it.



Student Code of Conduct

Our 'Student Code of Conduct' is based on the Department of Education updated behaviour procedures. This includes a clarity of whole school processes, including, minor and major responses to behaviour and our behaviour referral system, protocols around cyber safety, bullying and weapons in schools, and our whole school positive behaviour acknowledgement and rewards system and reflects our whole school Positive Behaviour for learning evidence-based approach. Our school is continuing to implement our revised whole school behaviour framework. Access the Student Code of Conduct here.

Our teachers are excellent dedicated professionals who continue to have a renewed focus on professional learning and who always endeavour to keep you informed. We hope that these feedback opportunities assist to keep you well informed. Effective communication is the key to all successful relationships.

Working together in positive partnership with parents and caregivers is beneficial to enhancing success for students. From time to time an issue may arise and it is vital how that issue is problem solved. It is never okay to abuse staff and this behaviour is not acceptable. We thank all parents and caregivers who always communicate respectfully with our team and who role model how to resolve any problems that may arise. The behaviour we role model is the behaviour we expect to see from our students, your children.

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Parent and Community Code of Conduct

The Parent and Community Code of Conduct (the Code) aims to support schools to clearly communicate the conduct expected of parents, carers and visitors while they're on state school grounds, at school activities and interacting with others in the school community.

Queensland Government is committed to tackling the growing issue of violent and abusive behaviour across school communities. The Respect our staff, respect our school campaign aims to create safer and more respectful communities across Queensland state schools. The safety of our students and staff is the number one priority and we can all play our part in ensuring that our schools are safe and respectful places to be. Violent or abusive behaviour will not be tolerated in our schools. It's not just a courtesy. It's the law. Access the Community and Parent Code of Conduct here.

Safe and respectful school community campaign

Your child, our student. One team. We all deserve respectful, safe and non-violent environments, so aggression and harassment of any kind—physical, verbal or otherwise—isn't acceptable. The Department of Education have recently launched a public awareness campaign that addresses occupational violence and aggression in state schools. This is a complex and disturbing problem that the department take very seriously. Safety is our highest priority and all school staff deserve to work in respectful, safe and nonviolent environments.

Antisocial behaviour covers a broad spectrum and while violence is clearly not acceptable in our schools - or in any other workplace - the campaign also covers other forms of negative behaviour that staff may experience via email or social media. Everyone has the right to be safe at work. Occupational violence and aggression (OVA) is any action, incident or behaviour that departs from reasonable conduct in which a person is threatened, harmed or injured by another person during, or as a direct result of their work. This includes incidents of online abuse and cyberbullying.

The department is committed to ensuring that all workers and others engaging with our workplaces understand the department's stance towards occupational violence. Some of you may have seen the campaign on social media - it consists of three short animations with one simple message: Your child, our student. One team. Parent tip sheets are also available here. The campaign is an initiative of the Occupational Violence and Aggression Prevention Strategy. The strategy sets out how the department plans to achieve its goal of reducing occupational violence and aggression towards school staff. The campaign and strategy will align with the parent and community code of conduct, included below.

Together, we can help build a safe and respectful school community for staff, students, parents and community members.

- Talk with your child about what's happening at school
- Talk to school staff.
- Always contact school staff respectfully.



Talk to your child's school

- Let your child know you're communicating with the school and the reason why.
- Follow the school's process for communicating with them.
- Organise a time in advance.
- Confirm agreed outcomes
- · Plan the next steps.



Communicate we

- Keep your contact details up to date.
- Read emails and newsletters, and regularly check the school's website, calendar and social media.
- Be patient and allow reasonable time for staff to respond to you.
- Let the school know when your child is absent.
- Keep your child's school in the loop when things change in their lives.
- Be polite and respectful.
- Be a team player: be open to new ideas and be willing to compromise.
