Throughout her career, Naomi has navigated from working in research psychology to applying those skills to non-profit and private sector work, all while buttressing

Off To A Good Start

You may remember, Women in Big Data commemorated International Women's Day 2022 by announcing the launch of its Global Mentoring Initiative. Our organization offered eight mentoring programs, four of which are newly designed programs. Here's what was accomplished these last three months.

Data Science Olympians

Data Science Olympians is one of the new programs offered this spring by the Women in Big Data Bay Area Chapter thanks to the efforts of Rupa Gangatirkar and Srabasti Banerjee. Eight teams consisting of fifty-three people were formed to advance technology and leadership skills through data science contest participation. The program is currently on-going and will conclude in August.

Emerging Technologist

Emerging Technologist is another new program offered by Women in Big Data this summer. Thirty-two mentors and mentees are engaged in activities for data science career development. Managed by Deborah Sgro, this program will conclude in late August.

Gayatri

Gayatri, a program to guide and nurture future tech leaders, is providing a six-month

mentoring engagement for two new pairs of participants. Thanks goes to Himashinee Venkatesh and Sowmya Moni from the Women in Big Data India Chapter.

Getting From Here To There

Getting From Here To There recently concluded a three month session. Nine participants successfully worked with Erika Lunceford and Deborah Sgro, from the Women in Big Data Bay Area Chapter, to develop skills necessary to create and execute a career advancement or new job search strategy.

Leadership Circle

Leadership Circle, a new invitation-only program designed to recognize and honor the contribution of our regional and chapter leadership, was attended by forty-one participants. During this three-month program, eight small groups discussed Dr. Ellen Snee's book "Lead: How Women In Leadership Claim Their Authority" and attended two fireside chat events. Thanks to Shala Arshi and Tina Tang, of our Executive Committee and board, for initiating this program.



Global Mentoring Initiative

Mentor in Tech International

Mentor in Tech International was offered by the EMEA region of Women in Big Data through the successful efforts of Elena Fedotova, Marina Alekseeva, and Olga Kasatkina. Fifty-six mentors and mentees participated in this program focused on the development of technical, leadership, product management, program management and/or entrepreneurial skills.

Shakti

Shakti, also offered by the Women in Big Data India Chapter, is currently supporting two women returning to a data career after an employment break. This 4-6 month program is managed by Srinthi Srinivasan, Meenakshi Arun, Vidhya Kidambi, and Sowmya Moni.

Toronto Mentoring

Toronto Mentoring, a newly offered program from the Women in Big Data Toronto Chapter, was launched through the efforts of Jasmine Sinden and Kaylie Tam. Twenty-six mentors and mentees participated in this three-month program, which was opened to Women in Big Data Canadian members for career advancement and skill development guidance.

Many of these programs will be offered again starting in September, and we will be adding new programs at that time as well. A Mentoring Admin will partner you through the program design, creation, execution and management.


