

### **Teaching Methods**

#### **Assessment Methods**

Assessments may include short written knowledge tests, discussions and oral communication demonstrations, case study exercises, written reports.

To perform at your best, you will need to work on the assessments outside of class time.

### Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

This pathway is only applicable for students working within the industry and has attained an Australian qualification related to the industry.

The RPL process allows students to apply for exemption into a specified INT Nurse Training award program based on approved study from other Education Institutions and / or past work experience. An exemption into a unit of competency exempts students studying for undertaking assessments for that unit of competency. The onus is on the student to present evidence to prove that they have sufficient knowledge and skills to meet the requirements of the unit of competency through other approved study and work experience. Application for RPL can be made at anytime. Please note that RPL cannot result in an international student having less than a full time study load (20 hours per week).






