



Rider's Gazette

Fellow Riders:

Over coffee the other day Terry & I were talking about the news of the day while social distancing of course. The subject of "Brand Bashing" of specific Motorcycle Brands & Groups came up. Now it appears from conversations with many like-minded motorcycle enthusiasts within our sphere of influence that this is very common. Terry and I have been recipients of "Brand Bashing" in one form or another, in fact enough to say it is "Systemic" within most Motorcycle groups.

Brand Bashing; motorcyclists love to pick apart problems they perceive to exist with brands of motorcycle different from the one they choose to own and ride. This obsession with brand bashing is usually just good-natured ribbing between friends, and not meant to be taken to heart.

However, in many instances that is not the case and outright rude obnoxious comments are often directed to riders of other brands under the guise of good-natured ribbing.

"Systemic" refers to something that is spread throughout, affecting a group or system, such as a body, economy, market or society as a whole. We hear lot about systemic discrimination lately, well, 'Brand Bashing' fits into this category. Some of you may have seen recent articles about this on the internet. Terry & I feel it is an important issue to be addressed.

This systemic brand bashing has many detrimental effects and causes angst within groups of riders. So why do we do it? What is the point? Actually, there is science behind all of this. In an Article written by ROBERT SAPOLSKY A professor of biological sciences and of neurology and neurological sciences, states:

"There are two kinds of people in the world: those who divide the world into two kinds of people and those who don't." In reality, there's lots more of the former. And it can be vastly consequential when people are divided into Us and Them, ingroup and outgroup, "the people" (i.e., our kind) and the Others.

He also goes on to say: "Humans universally make Us/Them dichotomies along lines of race, ethnicity, gender, language group, religion, age, socioeconomic status, and so on. And it's not a pretty picture".

Mr. Sapolsky continues, and this is an important one: "we detect Us/Them differences with stunning speed".

What does all this mean with respect to our discussion...well, to put it simply this form of prejudice is hard wired in our brains. Early in our evolutionary development it was a survival trigger, "us vs them" and avoiding trouble, disassociating ourselves from other groups or individuals that may cause us harm, a natural, normal, emotional, automatic response to visual and mental input. This has stuck with us and is linked to Xenophobia and Clannishness.

So, we are fighting basic human instinct...we have all been taught to be tolerant and respectful of others we should apply this to other riders, of motorcycle brands we may not like. If we want to be inclusive, we cannot buy into the emotional response of **Us & Them**. In the case of GWRRA we want to be inclusive and invite others to our organization and so we cannot be seen as treating non-gold wing riders as miscreants!

An organization's culture defines the proper way to behave within the organization. This culture consists of shared beliefs and values established by leaders and then communicated and reinforced through various methods, ultimately shaping members perceptions, behaviors and understanding.


If we are seen to be "Brand Bashing" our chances of recruiting new members diminishes quickly. The "so called" friendly ribbing about other people's choices of motorcycle brand is not a good notion. These instances of banter underpin the "natural divide" of riders into Us & Them that is not necessary in our lives.

We need to stop it. Why? Well if we practice brand bashing, we are also marginalizing these riders and after all they are people too. By forming opinions that classify these people, riders of other brands, as "second class" citizens...well that's just wrong.

We are all under the microscope when we are riding out in public. Optics are important, what potential members of our group and the general public sees and hears is the "brush we are tarred with".

Leadership will continue to foster the type of culture that is inclusive, non-judgmental, and comfortable for all members...remember perception is everything!

Until we see you all on the road again, Be Safe – Ride Safe.

MOTORCYCLE NEWS

Recently I drove a car with "adaptive" or "radar controlled" cruise control. What a great experience it was. I was driving the Pat Bay Hwy in cruise control, steadily creeping up on the car in front of me and then my car started slowing down and paced the car in front of me... perfectly. Then the car in front of me took the exit to the airport, and as soon as I was clear of it, my car automatically brought itself back up to it's original speed. I was amazed at how well it worked and started wondering when that sort of technology would come to motorcycles, so imagine my surprise today when I was surfing the web and found an article on just that! Adaptive Cruise Control for our beloved Goldwing.

I know that cruise control on a motorcycle isn't everybody's cup of tea, but neither is our beloved Goldwing. I for one however, love


the idea. It's also no surprise that if Honda is going to introduce this sort of technology to any of it's motorcycle models, it would be the GW, after all, it is Honda's flagship bike and just like Cadillac is to GM, the Goldwing is often the demonstrator of technology and luxuries that eventually trickle down to other models.

What really surprised me was that this sort of technology isn't new to the motorcyle world. Radar assisted cruise control and safety systems are already available as options on the 2021 Ducati Multistrada V4 and BMW R125RT. In addition, KTM and Kawasaki are also looking at introducing the tech to some of their models. Fortunately the Goldwing won't be out of this market for long. Honda is already focusing, not so much on the radar technology itself, but the challenges of mounting the radar on the Goldwing.

BMW and Ducati both use Bosch radar systems along with their own versions of software needed to operate it. Honda already has deals in place with Bosch to supply radars for some of its cars, so it may well end up using the same or similar components in the Goldwing, with reduced research and development time. This is good news because actually fitting the technology to the bike is what's really causing the hold up. While it might be relatively easy to fit thi technology into a car, it's understandably more more challenging on a motorcycle with much less room to work with, and size isn't the only issue. Have you ever noticed water cooled bikes with a big, retangular radiator stuck on the front like an afterthought? It's an asthetic nightmare. Honda outdid themselves with the Goldwing by attaching not just one, but two radiators in a manner that they are hardly noticeable and it looks like they're trying to

do the same with the radar by placing it behind the plastic panel between the headlights. This location is fairly flat and uncluttered, and the plan is to mount the radar on sturdy brackets extending from the existing framework that holds the front fairing and instruments.

Now for the big question, when do we get it? If Honda is following its rivals and using the Bosch-made system, it shouldn't take long for development to be complete and there may possibly be an introduction in the 2022 model. For now, we'll just have to wait and see.


- The same people keep volunteering until they just get too tired to continue


Over the last 6-months, the team has been working actively, with our partners and suppliers, to find a safe and viable way to produce the 2021 Motorcycle Show tour.
