REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL



Our mantra for the Lenten season are the words spoken to us as ashes were placed on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday: "Repent and Believe in the Gospel."

God led the people of Israel into the desert, to forge them into a new people. The Spirit led Jesus into the desert to clarify the meaning of his Messiahship. The Spirit leads us into the desert of Lent to reflect on how we have not always resisted temptation and have failed to love.

In the desert we seek mercy and forgiveness. Lent is God's gift to us to become more aware that we are God's redeemed and forgiven people.

In the Lenten season, we seek to enter the same space as Jesus. We are led by the Holy Spirit into the desert to experience fasting and self-denial and to be tempted and to be tested by the devil. As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are tested; we are tried during the Lenten season to gauge our commitment of turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. How do we deal with the Lenten call to embrace spiritual disciplines? What fasting are we willing to embrace in the Lenten season? What spiritual discipline of prayer can we make a commitment to? What almsgiving are we willing to tithe in the service of others?

We too are untested in the journey of discipleship if we do not focus ourselves on the call of God and the cost of discipleship in our lives. On this the first Sunday of Lent, the challenge I give you is to honestly ask you to make a decision, to make some good choices as to embracing the spiritual disciplines of Lent.

The story of Jesus' temptations reveals to us the deepest thing about him: he had total trust in his heavenly Father. Jesus turned to the Word of God in the face of temptation and expressed his trust, his obedience to God's plan for him.

What about ourselves? What tempts us? What do the temptations of our lives reveal about us? What are the areas of our lives in which Jesus is not yet Lord? Hopefully our temptations, our sinfulness reveal our need for God's forgiveness and mercy; and, indeed, we are the gracious recipients of the merciful love of Jesus.

At the end of the Lenten season, our ultimate goal is not to be perfectly disciplined, but rather the purpose of our Lenten journey is to encounter God. May our experience of the Lenten desert lead us to trust in God and in him alone.



The shoes can certainly be worn, but they can't be worn out. Anything with holes in the top canvas material or heavily worn soles cannot be sent overseas.

The people in Africa mainly need sneakers and adult casual shoes. However, you can bring any shoes or boots you have because I will donate any types not needed in Africa to the Hope House in Webster or Saint's Place in Pittsford. At Hope House, they provide food, clothing and household items to people in our area who need this support. Saint's Place mainly helps refugee families who need these same basic necessities to re-start their lives.

I am so thankful that our Youth Advisor, Miss Lisa, has offered to have a special **"Shoe Collection Weekend" on March 3-4, 2018 at St. Joseph's.** Thank you!!

You can drop off shoes and boots anytime that weekend (through Tuesday, March 6) in the collection box which will be in the Gathering Space. TRIDUUM CHOIR:

LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE As to the canonical laws of fast and abstinence:


• Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from eating meat. This discipline is required on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, and applies to all Catholics age 14 and older.

• Fasting is the practice of limiting food to one full meal and two additional smaller meals each day, and then not eating between meals. This discipline is required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and applies to Catholics ages 18 to 59.

Those who are excused from fast or abstinence: Besides those outside the age limits, those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, laborers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving great offense or causing enmity, and other situations of oral or physical impossibility to observe the penitential discipline are excused from the obligations of fast and abstinence.

ENCOUNTER MAJD

Eight-year-old Majd thought his family was going on a picnic. His mother, Lamya,said they would be back home in a week. But when ISIS attacked their home in northern Iraq, the family fled for good.

"What worried me the most were the kids,"

Lamya says. "Our life was stable and we were doing well; we had a very big house. Our children had everything they needed. But when we

fled, I was not able to bring anything for them-not even food."

Fortunately, the family found an apartment to rent with other displaced families. It is much smaller than the home they had, but it's safer. The children enrolled in a CRS-sponsored school, where the routine provides hope, stability and a sense of belonging. "Education is very important," says Lamya, especially in Iraqi culture.

Lamya received training from CRS and became a teacher at the school. Now she has hope for the future. "I really love children, so when I go to class I feel like I am with my family," she says.

Her son, Majd, also loves going to school. "Majd is so motivated to go to school. He just wants it to be morning so he can go," Lamya says. "He is relaxed, having fun and more confident." For Majd, school means a normal life—now and in the future.



HOMELESS OUTREACH EXPERIENCE PLEASE JOIN US ON FEB 27

Volunteers are needed for a Homeless Outreach experience the evening of Feb 27. St. Joseph's is participating with the Southeast Rochester Catholic Community and other faith communities for this outreach. During this encounter volunteers go out in a group to offer assistance and overnight shelter to those who find themselves homeless. Along with volunteers, the team will include various dedicated professionals: social workers, case managers, doctors, nurses, medical students, nursing students, social work students, representatives from service agencies, a driver for the bus used for transportation, and police officers as escorts.

The focus of this ministry is to help homeless people connect to the social service system so they might find permanent housing and access benefits for which they may qualify. Our role is to offer food and a listening ear.
