

General Meeting

<u>Correspondence/Illnesses:</u> Mark reported that Carole H. had surgery and is home.

<u>Minutes:</u> The Dec. 4 2013 ,Meeting Minutes were reviewed. It was moved by Carl C. and 2nd by Mark Mo. to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Announcements:</u> Mark mentioned, in addition to the 50/50 drawing, Jeff and Denise of Star Automotive have donated a Catback Exhaust System installation, valued at \$500, and it must be used by Dec. 31, 2014.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Jason reported the income was from Dues, MCA Dues, Dec. 50/50 Raffle, Holiday Party, Oct.-Dec. Merchandise, Star Automotive Advertisement, and Bodytech Advertising renewal. Instead of just being at the event and a sponsor of the event, Ford Motor Company will actually become a partner with the MCA in the planning and organization of the Mustang 50th Birthday Celebration. With this new partnership, the MCA will benefit from Ford support in many different areas including facility help and layout support, set up and parking support, PR and Marketing Support and Simulcast/ Broadcast to those who can't attend the Celebrations. They will also be working to secure Ford Stars, including the Ford family and senior Ford executives, performers from the recording industry including American Idol stars, and many racing stars of today, tomorrow and the past.

Parties/receptions at the 50th Birthday celebration: Thursday, April 17th Mustang 50th Birthday dinner - \$40 – Cabarrus Arena & Event Center, 7 to 10pm – Ford execs to be there; Friday, April 18th, Charlotte Welcome Party - \$25 – Embassy Suites, 7 to 10pm; Saturday, April 19th, Main Event Banquet – \$75 - Embassy Suites, Doors open at 6pm. Also, there will be open track and drag events. Ed passed around the MORE Program – pass out binder. If we get 20 people to register, we can park together right outside the entrance. This parking area has in and out privileges during the day. (Inside parking does not.) We need to submit our list by Mar. 15, 2014. Let Ed know if you want to park in the MORE lot. (We have 18 Mustangs on the list at this time.) There was a discussion about several Mustang caravans coming through Pittsburgh to the various event cities.

Ken Ba. suggested doing a Can-Am caravan.

Also discussed was the Irwin Car Cruise scheduled for Sat., April 26.


As for guests, we typically can accommodate a few, sometimes a lot.. Check with me first so we can make sure we will have room. And of course, club members & families get first dibs.

Member Submission: Mark and Betsy Bedel Ordering Our 1985 Mustang GT

I decided that after watching the horsepower gradually increase with the inception of the new 1979 Fox platform introduction, that when this figure surpassed 200 horsepower, (seems very weak by today's offerings), that I would pull the trigger and buy one. Car & Driver Magazine's Editor David E. Davis, Jr. test drove an early release and pronounced this one of the most exciting Mustangs that he had driven in a long time! I actually have Ford's promotional poster with his quote on the bottom, something like, "Stab the throttle and then watch the trees blur!" This synched the deal for me. After convincing Betsy my wife that this would be a great purchase, we went searching. Since we lived in the North Hills, McCrackin and McCain were the two closest stores. Both had offerings with either every option on them or almost none, and no bright red exterior. I figured that if I was purchasing new, I wanted the options I/we preferred. Ordering is what was then suggested. We did.

This is where the saga began. How soon I asked would the car arrive once the order was placed? Oh, about 3 to 4 weeks. Great, I replied. Not wanting to be a pest, I waited until four weeks were just about up before I called to check on our order. I was told quite surprisingly that our Mustang might not be made! The reason offered was the newly adjusted CAFE requirements imposed by the government, (Corporate Annual Fuel Economy Standards). Ford had apparently not manufactured enough 4 cylinder units to offset the eight cylinder units, and heavy fines were on the line if this balance was violated.

We can certainly refund your deposit I was told. I didn't want my deposit back I responded, I wanted the car. What followed was a series of calls and referrals which led further up the dealer chain of command which if I recall accurately ended with the regional manager. Bi-weekly calls went on for several months before we finally received a call that informed us that Ford was finally in compliance and our bright red GT 5-Speed with the grey interior would be made. Two weeks later it showed up at McCrackin and with great relief we drove the object of our desire off the lot and home where we have had it ever since.

It has been babied. Never been driven in snow, (kind of pointless with rear drive and significant amounts of torque at low RPM's), seldom has it even seen rain. Today it has just over 45,000 miles on it. Less than 1,000 per year for the last decade or so, but has pleasured us with several long road trips in the past. A trip to Washington DC to visit my wife's brother and his wife. A memorable 10th wedding anniversary weekend stay at the Century Inn along quaint Route 40 in southern PA. It's become as my daughter puts it, a part of the family. Both she and my son have learned to drive a manual on the Mustang since with its copious low end torque, it is very forgiving to a new student.

Mustang's run deep in the Bedel bloodline though. My father purchased a new 1965 metallic blue coupe, 289 with a 3 speed automatic and uniroyal double red ring sidewall tires. My uncle, his brother, bought a 1969 Mach 1 with a 351. I've always loved the styling of that iteration and clearly the designers of the current models do also. My father later bought a 1985 canyon red GT with an automatic and my brother bought a used 1986 V-8 LX shortly thereafter. My uncle then purchased a 1989 yellow GT convertible while my brother also purchased an early 90's GT and most recently restored a 1968 coupe. On my wish list...a late model GT 500 coupe, race red would be sweet. Love to experience 662 horsepower! Time will tell.
