How to Make a Djembe



What You Will Need:

Two Paper Cups, a Paintbrush, a Plastic Bag, Glue, Sticky Tape, a Mixing Bowl, Paint, String, Old Newspaper, Scissors, a Rubber band, Flour

Instructions:

Step 1: Cut the bottoms out of the cups, then tape the two ends together. Mix a cup of flour with two cups of water and a squirt of glue to make a papier-mâché paste. Tear the newspaper into strips.

Step 2: Now, paint a layer of the paste onto the cups. Next, dip the newspaper strips into the paste, then stick them over the cups until they're both totally covered.

Step 3: When the papier-mâché has dried, paint the cups white so that the newspaper doesn't show through. When that's dry, start decorating your drum – use more paint, textures or other craft materials. Be as creative as you like!

Step 4: Cut a circle out of the plastic bag, stretch it over the top of one end of the cups (this will be the top of the drum), and use the rubber band to hold it in place. Next, trim off the extra plastic around the edges.

Step 5: Wrap a length of string around the middle of the drum several times, then tie it in a knot. Do the same around the top of the drum. Next, weave a new piece of string from the top to the middle of the drum to make a zigzag shape all around it (we added more string to the bottom of the drum, too, for decoration). Now it's ready to play!
