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SECTION C: SUMMARY

QUESTION 5

The following seven points form the answer to the question. They need not be in any specific order.

NOTE: The quotations in the left column serve only as a **reminder** of what the direct quotations are.

	QUOTATIONS	OWN WORDS/POINTS
1.	'Positive self-talk helps you tap into your inner strengths.'	Positive self-talk (PST) helps you to see your own abilities/strengths.
2.	Make positive statements about yourself on a daily basis.'	Use positive comments about yourself daily.
3.	You could make a recording of calming music.'	Record calming music to listen to when stressed.
4.	Picture yourself in a positive light.'	See/visualise yourself in positive situations.
5.	'Remind yourself of past successes.'	Recall past situations in which you were successful.
6.	'Consider the bigger picture too.'	See the situation in perspective/Note how the situation affects you now.
7.	'Work on things you can control.'	Do not stress about things you have no control over.

NOTE: Accept other answers which are suitable to the topic.

The summary should be marked as follows:

- Mark allocation
 - > 7 marks for 7 points (1 mark per point)
 - > 3 marks for language

- Distribution of language marks when learner <u>has not</u> quoted verbatim:
 - ➤ 1–3 points correct award 1 mark
 - ➤ 4-5 points correct award 2 marks
 - ▶ 6–7 points correct award 3 marks
- Distribution of language marks when the learner <u>has</u> quoted verbatim:
 - ▶ 6–7 quotes award no language marks
 - 1–5 quotes award 1 language mark

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NOTE:

Word count:

- Verify the number of words used (50–60 words).
- > Do not deduct any marks if learner fails to indicate the number of words used or if the number of words used is indicated incorrectly.
- If the word limit is exceeded, read up to a maximum of 5 words above the stipulated upper limit and ignore the rest of the summary.
