

Lamb feed recalled

The Land O'Lakes Purina Feed plant in Fremont, Neb., has initiated a limited voluntary recall of four lamb feed products, packaged in 50-pound bags, due to the potential for higher than acceptable levels of copper.

The products and lot numbers involved in the recall were produced at the Fremont, Neb., feed plant only, and are described as: Lake Country® Honor Show Lamb Grower DX Pellet; Lake Country® Honor Show Lamb Starter DX Pellet; Lake Country® Honor Show Lamb Grower B30 Pellet and LAND O LAKES® Lamb Grower-Finisher B30

Lot numbers range from Jan. 1, 2008, to May 30, 2008, and are listed on the bag as 8JAN01FRE1 to 8MAY30 FRE1 inclusive.

On bagged products, the lot numbers are printed on both the tag and sewing strip of each bag. Lot numbers are formatted as follows: Example 8MAY30FRE1 - 8=Year / MAY= Month / 30=Day of Month / FRE1=Plant Code.

The recall was initiated after receiving a customer complaint regarding lamb mortalities. The presence of copper above acceptable levels can cause serious health issues, and at high levels, mortality in sheep.

Retailers have been contacted to quarantine these products and notify customers who purchased the product. The affected product should not continue to be stored or used.

CFTC proposes initiatives to improve ag futures markets

The Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) has announced several policy initiatives addressing concerns in the ag futures markets. These actions are the result of an April 22 roundtable discussion on issues including the lack of convergence between futures and cash, the impact of higher margin requirements and the role of speculators and commodity index traders.

CFTC asked its Agricultural Advisory Committee, under the leadership of Commissioner Michael Dunn, to develop solutions for improving convergence. The committee also will discuss how exchanges determine margins, daily price limits and methodologies for setting settlement prices.

The commission will continue to work with ag lenders to facilitate an understanding of financing issues faced by market participants. This is increasingly important as commodity prices have risen and financing margin levels becomes more difficult for producers and commodity merchandisers. Commissioners have voted to

withdraw the proposed rulemaking that would have increased federal speculative position limits on certain ag futures contracts and would have created a risk management hedge exemption from speculative limits for ag futures and options contracts.

Another initiative announced by CFTC would subject traders to additional reporting and classification. The commission will develop a proposal to require more detailed information from index traders and swaps dealers in the futures markets, and review whether classification of these traders can be improved for regulatory and reporting purposes.

Other actions taken by the commission are designed to review and propose revisions to improve agricultural trade options and provide greater market transparency.

"The commission is committed to ensuring that our agricultural futures markets function properly in their risk management and price discovery roles," the commissioners wrote.

4-H projects changing with times, state project winners announced

This year, Kansas' state 4-H project award winners' projects range from staging a tech camp for kids that organizers say is "taking off" to a restored 1944 John Deere B tractor.

"We have a waiting list for our robotics track," said Beth Hecht, Kansas State University Research and Extension 4-H youth development agent in Leavenworth County, who is working with Jacob Reynolds, state 4-H space tech project winner, to organize the technology camp for kids. The high-tech offering will include robotics, rocketry and GPS and GIS technologies, said Reynolds, a high school junior who will teach 4th through 6th graders about rocketry and the principles of flight. The camp concept was introduced by Reynolds' older brother Ben, a former state 4-H project winner who is now a Marine.

While Reynolds' project focused on Space Age technologies, Shane Blaes' project would seem a step back in time. Blaes, from Montgomery County, restored a 1944 John Deere B tractor and for his efforts, is the state's self-determined 4-H project winner. Choosing such a project allowed him to match learning opportunities to his interests. His project involved investing 350 hours restoring the tractor and about 600 hours restoring a 1956 720, which also was made by John Deere. Both tractors originally belonged to his grand-

father, Donald Blaes, and will stay in the family, Blaes said. He is studying agronomy and agriculture education at Kansas State University, and noted that farm mechanics work well with his career path.

The young men's projects offer a glimpse of the variety apparent among the 34 state project award winners honored at the Emerald Circle Banquet in Manhattan June 5, said Gary Gerhard, professor of 4-H youth development at Kansas State University. The 2008 project awards are given in recognition of accomplishments during the 2007 4-H year, said Gerhard, who also serves as the chairperson

for the 4-H state awards program.

The annual banquet and awards program is sponsored by the Kansas 4-H Foundation. State 4-H project award winners earn the opportunity to attend National 4-H Congress in Atlanta Nov. 28-Dec. 2, 2008 and a \$400 travel award from the Kansas 4-H Foundation.

Kansas 4-H'ers often identify attending National 4-H Congress as a highlight in their 4-H career, said Gordon Hibbard, president of the Kansas 4-H Foundation. "The Kansas 4-H Foundation's Patron Sponsors Program provides significant support to 4-H through trips,

awards and medals," he said. "Our foundation's leaders and donors know the opportunity to attend the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta is a pinnacle for Kansas 4-H project winners, providing them with a national 4-H leadership experience and a lifetime of memories."

How are state project winners selected?

"4-H projects typically introduce a topic, and then provide the next steps in developing an interest and building skills that often serve as the basis for a career interest or lifelong hobby," said Gary Gerhard, professor of 4-H youth development at K-State and chair person for the annual 4-H state awards program.

To qualify for a state 4-H project award, a Kansas 4-H member must first earn the top award in his or her county, he said. County award recipients are asked to complete a state 4-H award application before advancing to the Extension area level, where two to three of the area projects are selected for judging at the state level.

One state winner is selected for each project. A youth may be named a winner in a project subject matter only once; however, they can apply in other project areas for competition. Since a member is eligible to attend National 4-H Congress only once, if a state winner has previously earned the top award in another project category, a project award runner up — or alternate — is eligible to attend, Gerhard said.

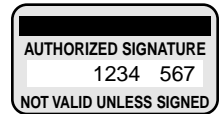

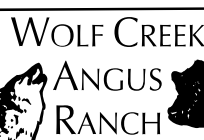

K-State Powercat Tractors team tops international competition for seventh time

For the seventh time in the 11-year history of the event, a team from Kansas State University has won the International Quarter-Scale Tractor Design Competition.

This year's competition was May 29-June 1 in Peoria, Ill. It is sponsored by the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers.

The K-State Powercat Tractors Quarter-scale Design Team placed first overall out of 24 team from schools across the U.S. and Canada by accumulating the most points in the competition categories of performance, written report, oral report, design judging and maneuverability. K-State was first in the 1,050-pound performance pull and tied for first in the 1,300-pound performance pull.

In addition, the K-State X-Team placed third overall in the X-team competition, including receiving first place on the oral report part of the event. The X-team is made up of freshmen and sophomores who compete using last year's tractor.

Members of the team are K-State biological and agricultural engineering majors from the College of Engineering and agricultural

technology management majors from the College of Agriculture. Faculty advisers include Darrell Oard, research assistant in biological and agricultural engineering; Pat Murphy, professor of agriculture and natural resources; Randy Price, assistant professor of biological and agricultural engineering; Ed Brokesh, instructor of biological and agricultural engineering; and Lou Ann Claassen, senior administrative assistant

in the department of biological and agricultural engineering. "I continue to be very impressed with the K-State Powercat Tractors Quarter-Scale Design Team," said Gary Clark, professor and head of K-State's department of biological and agricultural engineering. "They are hard working, dedicated and very talented students who also exhibit very professional behavior and great sportsmanship."

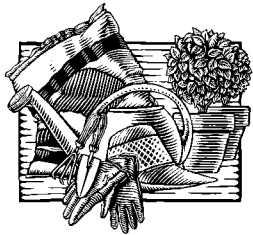

Yard & Garden Tips

By Gregg Eyestone

Perennial of the Year

Grasses are great plants for our growing environment. For the non-gardener, they are great because they don't need any attention. Gardeners like them for the same reason so they can concentrate on those that do. The perennial of the year is the grass 'Karl Foerster' Feather Reed Grass (Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster').

If you were one of the 425 participating in our Extension Master Gardener Garden Tour this year, you would have seen them in several of the landscapes. Its narrow upright growing habit is striking when planted in mass. That same habit is useful in our smaller landscapes to fit in nicely between other plants to add some height, texture or contrast.

I use it to screen the outdoor utility box. Another use is in containers which it usually survives the winter without extra protection.

Most plants like water and feather reed grass is no different. It is a cool-season grass and does best with adequate moisture. With good moisture, it will get 4-5 feet tall with the flower extending the height another foot or two. Mine that is growing in heavy clay with little additional moisture reaches 4 feet in bloom.

Many of our ornamental grasses are well-behaved. This hybrid grass does not produce viable seed to spread across the landscape.

It doesn't self-sow or spread by underground stems (rhizomes). Like tall fescue, it is a clump-forming grass.

Right now the feather reed grass is in bloom. Bloom time for this cool-season grass is mid-June. The inflorescence (bloom) is loosely feathered and ingeniously purplish when they first appear. By late summer, the narrow vertical plumes become a buff color which contrasts with the green leaves. The plumes remain through the winter as weather allows.

There is one related cultivar, 'Overdam' has longitudinally striped cream-white and green leaves. It is a smaller plant. Also, it needs a cooler environment than 'Karl Foerster' with more shade from the afternoon sun and plenty of moisture.

Since these are cool-season grasses, they start to green up in early March. The dead foliage should be cut off to about 5 inches at that

time. Then or in the fall, they can be divided or transplanted. This grass is one plant that will provide you with a long season of interest.

Oskaloosa man charged with fraud

Jay Wagner, 38, Oskaloosa, was charged in federal court last week with conspiring to defraud the owners of a Jefferson County ranch. Wagner could be sentenced to 30 years in federal prison and ordered to pay a fine of up to \$1 million if convicted of conspiracy to commit bank fraud and to engage in monetary transactions with funds derived from unlawful acts, according to an indictment. The crime allegedly occurred from 2003 to Dec. 5, 2007.

Wagner and an unindicted, unnamed co-conspirator allegedly defrauded the owners of the J Bar Ranch. They are accused of creating counterfeit documents that fraudulently increased the actual average weight and cost of cattle. Other counterfeit documents stated that the cattle had been checked by a veterinarian.

Other allegations include false invoices from trucking firms and engaging in monetary transactions involving the funds obtained.

Advocate for Kansas' kids earns state 4-H award

Marilyn Pence Galle is capable of wearing many hats — her teaching career has spanned 30 years and she also has worked to develop a successful business.

Galle is a wife and mother, with a strong sense of community. She believes it is important to volunteer to improve one's community. Throughout her life, no matter which hat she was wearing at the time, she has volunteered as an advocate for 4-H youth development, said Gary Gerhard, speaking on behalf of Kansas 4-H. That organization is honoring Galle with a 2008 Distinguished Service Award.

The honor recognizes exemplary service to 4-H youth development in providing growth and development opportunities for youth and the volunteers who work with them, he said.

The award is one of only two given in the state this year, and it was presented at Friends of 4-H Day at the Rock Springs 4-H Center near Junction City, June 13, said Gerhard, who is a professor of 4-H youth development at Kansas State University and chair of the Kansas 4-H awards program.

Galle has first-hand experience with the power of youth development, Gerhard said.

She grew up on a diversified farm in Shawnee County, and was attending

a one-room school when she joined Kansas 4-H.

"4-H offered educational experiences that weren't available in the classroom," said Galle, who embraced the opportunities to practice leadership and citizenship that 4-H programs offered.

During her 4-H career, she earned the opportunity to attend National 4-H Congress (in Chicago) and would later meet her future husband, Nelson Galle, while attending a 4-H conference at K-State.

Galle considered studying agriculture at K-State, but was encouraged instead to choose elementary education. In addition to a teaching career, she worked with her husband and family to build a successful agribusiness — the Central Kansas Turkey Hatchery in Moundridge.

"The business, which hatched four million turkeys annually, was the only one of its kind in Kansas," said Galle, whose responsibilities included

serving as chief financial officer for the corporation.

In speaking about her 4-H experiences and involvement as a 4-H volunteer and parent, Galle said: "I think 4-H taught us to work together as a family. We've built a relationship while helping each other that's made us closer — and stronger. Family involvement is a unique part of 4-H that I think is important."

Galle has served as a 4-H leader for 19 years, as a member and chairperson of the executive committee

of the McPherson County Extension Council, and as a member of the Kansas 4-H Foundation Board of Trustees.

"Marilyn Pence Galle has provided dedicated leadership to 4-H youth development in many capacities," said Gordon Hibbard, president of the Kansas 4-H Foundation. He noted that Galle served four years as the board chair and led several special and standing committees for the foundation during her tenure.


"Marilyn is able to speak with clarity — and

sincerity — about the vision and the power of 4-H youth development," Hibbard said. "She has played a valuable role in mentoring and encouraging others, including new trustees, friends of 4-H, prospective volunteers and donors who share her desire to enhance opportunities for youth."

Marilyn Pence Galle and

her husband, Nelson Galle, a retired educator and agribusiness professional who recently chaired the Kansas Board of Regents, are parents to three grown sons: Russell, Randall and Ronald.

The family was previously honored as the Kansas 4-H Family of the Year.
