They learn about fish and wildlife conservation, the safe use of firearms, and outdoor skills. Camp activities are educational and fun, offering many creative hands-on experiences.

One way you can help is to encourage young men and women to attend one of the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department's Conservation Camps. You have the opportunity to give a young person the chance to learn about Vermont's natural resources while canoeing, hiking, camping, fishing, hunting and more.

Parental Policy and General Information:

Date of Application Submission & Acceptance:

Your child's GMCC application is considered "submitted" at the time you e-mailed/or paper application arrives at Fish & Wildlife Office. Applications must be reviewed by the department before they can be processed.

Any questions regarding missing information or unclear information on a GMCC application will be sent to the e-mail address for Parent/Guardian #1. Please note failing to respond to in a timely manner to questions regarding your child's application will hold up enrollment and could result in your child not getting into his/her preferred session.

Age Requirements:

Basic Sessions: Camper must be 12-year-old before session starts or have 12th birthday during the week they are at camp and may not yet have turned 15-year-old. **No Exceptions**

Advanced Session: Camper must have passed one of **our** Basic sessions and cannot yet be 17 years of age.

Communication with Parent/Guardians

All communications, including session assignment information, will be through the e-mail account listed for Parent/Guardian #1 as shown on the application.

Medical Information & Medical Certificate:

While some medical information is requested on the application, a link to the full medical certificate will be in your session assignment information. You must use our Medical Certificate. Substitutes will not be accepted. A completed medical certificate, along with a copy of your child's medical insurance card must be brought to check in time. I Understand That Without These Form My Child Will Not Be Admitted to Camp.

Medical Insurance Coverage:

I understand that I, the parent or guardian, am responsible for health insurance and all bills associated with a camper' stay. GMCC Has No Health/Medical Insurance Coverage for Campers.

Physical Exams:

A physical exam for any child who would like to attend GMCC must have been completed within the previous two years prior to the camp session chosen.

Pre-Session Reading:

Are required for all students attending a GMCC Basic Session and for those doing Advanced week trapper certification. Please go to the material shown in the URL's shown on your session Assignment informational letter. No registration is required after opening the link(s), simply scroll down and open the chapter information and read.

Cancellations:

A two-week written notice of cancellation is required by <u>all_GMCC</u> campers Written notice can be as easy as an e-mail to: <u>FWgmcc@vermont.gov</u>. Failure to give the required two-week notice means funds paid by credit card or check will not be refunded. Parents of students on GMCC scholarship or sponsored by an outside community organization, and who fail to give the required 2-week written notice will be billed for the amount of their scholarship or sponsorship.

Refunds:

All refunds for tuition will be done at the end of the camp season, even if my child is placed on a waiting list and is unable to attend.

Wait List

I understand that my child may be put on the wait list for his/her first-choice session if all requested session(s) are full at the time my child's application is deemed complete. I further understand that my check will be cashed, or credit card charged even if my child is put on a wait list. Refunds for wait listed campers will be done at the end of the camp season. If I do not wish to keep my child on a waiting list I will contact the Education Programs Registrar and submit a WRITTEN request so that a refund can be made back to me.

Bunking requests:

Bunking requests are filled at check-in time. Be sure to coordinate with the other parent(s) and arrive at on the early side of check in and arrive together.

Choice of Curriculum:

I understand all campers attending a basic session will participate in the Hunter Education/Bow Hunter education course, among their other camp activities. There is no alternate curriculum.

Advanced camper must choose one course of study to take while at camp. They can take Trapper Education, Waterfowl hunting, or an advanced backpacking course.

Parental Consent To Participate in Hunter Education While at GMCC

All students under 16 years of age are required to have their parent/guardian consent to the student's participation in the hunter education portion of the GMCC curriculum. Please indicate your agreement by choosing Yes below. Refusing this consent will mean your child cannot enroll as a GMCC camper. If you have any concerns or questions, please contact the GMCC office. I, the legal parent/guardian, give consent for my child to participate in the hunter education portion of the curriculum taught at the Green Mountain Conservation Camp. I understand that participation in this program may expose my child or ward to the many risks associated with learning firearm safety. I understand that the activities will include, but not be limited to, risks associated with outdoor recreation; handling firearms and bows and arrows, and target shooting. I expressly assume these and all other risks associated with the Hunter Education Course. I hereby release and forever discharge, the State of Vermont, the Department of Fish & Wildlife, its agents, employees, volunteers, and other officers, from all actions, causes of action, damage claims, demands or judgments, which my child, I, our heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns may have against the Department, its agents, employees and other officers, for all injuries, of whatever nature, including injuries to property, caused by or arising out of, the above described program. I also understand that course instructors shall make the final decision as to whether a student is qualified to receive a hunter education certificate, based on standards established by the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Hunter Education Program.

Disclosures and Reminders

I understand that the age limit for Basic session camper is 12 through 14 years old, unless the child is attending an Advanced Session. Children must reach their 12th birthday before or during the week they are at camp. NO EXCEPTIONS.

I understand that the age limit for Advanced Sessions is 12 through 16 years. I understand that in order for my child to attend an Advanced Session they must have graduated from a GMCC Basic session AND have successfully completed a Hunter Education course.

I understand all campers attending a basic session will participate in the Hunter Education/Bow Hunter education course, among their other camp activities. There is no alternate curriculum.

I understand that my child must have a complete physical examination within the previous two years of the camp session chosen. I understand it is my responsibility to complete the Parental page of the Medical Certificate and that my child's doctor must complete and sign the Physician's page. I further understand if is my responsibility to bring the completed medical certificate, and a photocopy of my child's medical insurance card to session check in time. I UNDERSTAND THAT WITHOUT THESE FORMS MY CHILD WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO CAMP.

I understand that I, the parent or guardian, is responsible for health insurance and all bills associated with a camper' stay. GMCC HAS NO HEALTH/MEDICAL COVERAGE FOR CAMPERS.

I understand that no refund will be issued, and/or that parents will be billed for the tuition cost unless WRITTEN notice that the camper will not attend has been received in our office TWO (2) WEEKS in advance of the camper's session. An e-mail sent two weeks prior is considered written notice.

I understand that all refunds for tuition will be done at the end of the camp season, even if my child is placed on a waiting list and is unable to attend. I also understand that my check will be deposited or my credit card will be charged even if my child is placed on a waiting list. If I do not wish to keep my child on a waiting list I will contact the Education Programs Registrar and submit a WRITTEN request so that a refund can be made back to me.

I understand that if my child is being sponsored by an outside organization or receives a GMCC Scholarship, and who further does not attend camp without giving a **2 week notice** prior to the start of the session date that I will be billed for the amount of the sponsorship or scholarship.

I understand that if my child's application is incomplete an e-mail requesting the missing information will be sent to whomever is listed as parent/Guardian #1 on the application. FAILURE TO RESPOND TO THIS E-MAIL IN A TIMELY MANNER MAY DELAY YOUR CHILD'S APPLICATION, AND JEOPARDIZE THE CHANCE OF GETTING INTO HIS/OR HER PREFERRED SESSION.

***Due to COVID-19 and the requirements necessary to keep staff and campers safe and healthy, please be aware that although registration will open with all camp weeks available to the full number of campers as in past years, the specific details of how camp may run are subject to change based on the guidance from the Vermont Department of Health and Governor's orders.
