News from the Companie of Ayreton Archers

We are under 2 weeks away from our first practice in over a year! And with that, we have some changes to help everyone feel safe if they choose to attend. First, our practice will begin on July 7th at 7 pm and every Wednesday just like before. However, the range times have changed due to the shutdowns and re-openings. The range at Custom Archery in Forest Park now closes at 7 pm, BUT the staff at Custom Archery is willing to accommodate us by staying open till 8 pm. Beginning Monday July 5th, and every Monday after that, I will be posting on Facebook for a roll call of attendees for that week's practice. If no one is going to attend that week, then I can let the range know ahead of time.

Now, does this mean if you don't confirm on Monday, you won't be able to attend? Absolutely not! Everyone is more than welcome to join us. This Monday post, again, is to let the staff know we will be there for the extra hour. But, if no one answers regarding the Monday post, the range's regular hours of operation will apply so please, pay attention to these Monday posts in the Companie of Ayreton Archers Facebook Group.

We will still be using the uber forms when attending practices, and with the new rules and guidelines, we are requiring either a phone number or email address when you sign in for contact tracing purposes. This information will not be used in any other way, and the uber form for that week will be kept with me and not at the range for privacy purposes.

To help everyone feel more comfortable with in person practices, I will be buying sanitizing wipes, hand sanitizer, disposable masks, and wooden golf tees which will be kept in our target box upstairs. Normally I am the first person at the range, so I will wipe down the tables and chairs. The wooden tees are for anyone who does not wish to touch the pins offered by the range.

For social distancing, we will have every other lane closed depending on the number of attendees. And if we have to, we will run multiple lines. Please be sure to pull YOUR arrows ONLY.

Please remember to inspect your gear before shooting. There are plenty of warranted marshals in our group who are more than willing to inspect your gear if you are unsure. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to myself or Dietrich (David Cook).

Any after practice activities, such as dinner, will be done at your own discretion and is not part of the weekly practice. Lastly, if you are unsure or are still concerned about returning to in person practices or events, please do not feel obligated to attend. When you are ready to join us, you will be more than welcome. I am looking forward to seeing everyone again at the range when you're ready. You are all missed.

A Medieval Miscellany By Librarian Alexandria

Picts or It Didn't Happen - Part One

"The barbarians push us to the sea, the sea pushes us back to the barbarians; between these two kinds of death, we are either slaughtered or drowned." — "The Groans of the Britons," a letter sent to General Aetius in Gaul, quoted by Gildas.

Thus, the plaint of the Britons in the fifth century CE, after their abandonment by Rome. (At least, that's what Gildas* says.) But who were these barbarians? They seem to have been three separate entities who took advantage of the Roman legions' absence: the Irish, the Saxons, and the Picts.

Plenty is known about the Irish and Saxons, but even today the Picts remain a bit of a mystery. Popular culture tends to paint (more on this later) them as a race of fierce tribesmen roaring with bloodlust. And, well, yeah. Like their cousins to the south, the various tribes later lumped together under the term "Pict" had a reputation for ferocity. They were primarily small farmers and herdsmen, probably of a Celtic culture based on contemporary Latin records, and, again probably, spoke a Brythonic Celtic language. ("Brythonic" means based on the island of Britain, like Welsh and Cornish. Breton is also a Brythonic language, as many Celts fled to what is now Brittany during the Anglo-Saxon era. The Celtic language of Ireland is a Goidelic language – or Gaelic. The two are not mutually intelligible.)

There are a lot of probabilities where the Picts are concerned.

The term "Pict" didn't appear in records until the late 3rd century; prior to that the people living north of Hadrian's Wall were called the Caledonii by the Romans. It's postulated that it was a Roman slur (the word meant "painted," based on the concept that they were either tattooed or painted themselves). The Romans were pretty ticked off that the northern tribes had kept them from conquering the Caledonian territory. And it didn't help that they kept raiding and burning Roman forts throughout the next century.

The land in the north of the island is rough terrain and not the best for farming, so herding was a primary occupation. Herds take up a lot of space, more than farming does, so there was always a struggle for land, and cattle raids were common. The Irish have legends of cattle raiding, and it's not a stretch to imagine the same in this case. It certainly would explain the reputation for ferocity. And given that they were able to hold off the Romans, they must have been ferocious.

They were also able to hold off—mostly—the Irish Scoti who had settled in the southwest. This was the eastern offshoot of an Irish kingdom known as Dal Riata, that stretched


from what is now Belfast, across the sea to Britain. (If you look at a map, you'll see that the islands are very close here.) It may have been the Dal Riandans that gave the Picts the knowledge of sea-faring; they hadn't been before, but took to it like a duck to... er, water... Especially once they found out they could avoid the Wall and Roman forts just by sailing around them.

*Gildas was a 6th century British monk whose main claim to fame is a scathing sermon about the failure of the Britons to prevent the Anglo-Saxon incursions. He's worth investigating, though. Have a question about some aspect of medieval history or culture? Let your Librarian help!

Neurodiversity in the SCA:

A society superpower

For those who have spent any period of time in our society, the idea that our inclusiveness spans continents, ideologies, age differences, gender and sexual orientations, racial and ethnic identities, the way our brains are wired, and so on, does not require any demonstration. It is self-evident.

What hasn't been evident, to me at least, is why this is the case. We have all seen flurries of messages and policies written reactively to specific cultural flashpoints. I would however argue that in such cases, our built-in values of inclusivity allow us to readily reaffirm existing identities and even incorporate emerging identities and accommodations with grace and celebration.

Since early in my time with the society, I knew it was an environment that benefits people who experience intense, even uncontrollable anxiety in social situations. The level of competence in the maintenance of said environment bordered on expert professional. But how do we thank our organizers and leaders, when the SCA doesn't name inclusivity and accommodation as an explicit goal? This has been my 20-year conundrum. As an entity that was clearly present, awesome, and fairly unique for a participant-organized non-profit, I do not think this was accidental or a side effect, but there is no evidence of a mind at work here either, not to the clearly holistic effort to include everyone. It just came into being

In this time of virtual events, I am now studying to be an ADHD coach. One of the key therapies to benefit those with ADHD and other neuro-diverse conditions is to build an environment that supports and accommodates the challenges that come with our wirings.

Looking at the SCA in this way: as an environment, we have created a distinctive culture that encourages nurturing and therapeutic safe spaces in the following ways:

Choosing a persona / Identity Reset

Every participant is invited to create a persona. The persona allows a participant to explore a time in period, a place in the known world, cultures, values, professions, and crafts. Allowing participants to create an alter ego can be liberating for people who have experienced trauma and/or anxiety, or who are in a process of transitioning to a more authentic version of themselves.

Guilds, households, and camps / Family Reset

There are many such groups in the society: guilds that encourage craftsmanship and practice, martial arts clubs that motivate members to achieve physical fitness, and local groups that offer companionship and support. Many participants create a found family in the SCA.

Pelican, Laurel, Knight / Parental Reset

There are many examples of excellence in the society. We acknowledge superb research, compassion, and physical excellence in many ways, but peerage comes with an ability and responsibility to teach. This creates a multitude of opportunities in the society to apprentice, squire, or become a protege.

Pennsic University, R.U.M., event classes / School Reset

This is interest-based education. Learn what interests you, leave if it doesn't

Dance & Combat / Nonverbal social engagement and interaction

This is huge for people who are not able to communicate verbally with any sort of ease. Putting your body into the communication process can add stability.

Arts and Sciences / artistic expression

Another way to speak without words. The way we celebrate creativity and artistry, even for beginners, is supportive and empowering. Everyone gets to be a little great.

An Award system that rewards personal excellence over perfection and competition.

In many SCA contests, judges measure against a universal rubric, instead of pitting participants against each other. This allows participants to focus on personal excellence over strategy or vanity. Research is treated like a marathon, and digging deep is a virtue, not a source of amusement. Awards and advancements put value on excellence as its own reward.

When members embrace a value of personal excellence, they find greater rewards within themselves, and a confidence that's better than any scroll, title or recognition. They advance and are begged to pay their lessons forward.

The SCA is by-no-means perfect. There are sometimes controversies over who gets to advance, and the Society has some ways to go to include Black and indigenous people of color. But with our unique ability to celebrate deep research, accommodate different abilities, and reward excellence outside a metric of competitiveness, I believe we're perfectly poised to achieve greater levels of inclusivity. There is a semi-conscious vector our society has developed to mend the chaotic environment we are raised in, that works with our adult selves to create a new more authentic self. In this artificial expression of time, we can proof-of-concept our true identity, eventually mending the one created in our youth.
