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## **Section 1: Getting Started**

## **Understanding this User Manual**

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 195.

Also included is important safety information beginning on page 162 that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from the Home screen. To get to the Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, see "Securing Your Device" on page 12.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your device, depending on the software version on your device, and any changes to the device's Settings. **Note:** Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's Settings.

## **Text Conventions**

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent frequently-used steps:

Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in procedures. For example:

"From the Home screen, touch **### Apps → Settings → Wi-Fi**."



Many settings use an On/Off switch. Touch and slide the On/Off switch to turn a setting On or Off.

#### **Special Text**

In this manual, you'll find text that is set apart from the rest. These are intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, to define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature or menu.
- **Tips**: Provides quick or innovative methods, or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings to your attention important information to prevent loss of data or functionality, or even prevent damage to your device.

## **Setting Up Your Device**

Install the 4G LTE SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card and optional memory card, then charge the battery to begin using your device.

#### **SIM Card**

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, available optional services, and many others features.

Caution! Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. Do not bend or scratch the SIM card. Take care when handling, installing, or removing the SIM card, and avoid exposing the SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt. Keep the SIM card out of reach of small children.

#### Installing the 4G LTE SIM Card

- Open the SIM card slot cover on the top of the device.
- With the Verizon Wireless logo facing up, carefully insert the 4G LTE SIM Card into the slot, pressing gently until it locks into place (1).
- 3. Close the slot cover securely (2).







## Warning! Check that you are opening the SIM card slot cover, and NOT the microSD memory card slot.

Note: If the card is not inserted correctly, the device will not detect the SIM card. Re-orient the card back into the slot if the SIM is not detected.

## Removing the 4G LTE SIM Card

- Open the SIM card slot cover on the top of the device.
- Press the 4G LTE SIM Card in gently to release the lock, then carefully slide the card out of the slot.
- 3. Close the slot cover securely.


## **Battery**


Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) is included with the device, for charging the battery.

#### **Charging the Battery**

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Outlet Connector, Charging Head, and USB cable) to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

- 1. Carefully slide the Outlet Connector into the Charging Head. Make sure the connection is secure.
- 2. Connect the USB cable to the Charging Head.
- Insert the USB cable into the device's Charger/ Accessory Port.
- Plug the charging head into a standard AC power outlet.
- When charging is complete, unplug the Charging Head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.





## **Battery Indicator**

The Battery Icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see "Battery" on page 136.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.


**Important!** You cannot charge the battery using the USB cable and your PC.

Note: If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the USB power adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

## **Turning the Device On**

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key until the device vibrates and starts up. For more information, refer to "Unlocking the Device" on page 13.



## **Turning the Device Off**

- 1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.
- At the Device options prompt, touch Power off.
- 3. At the Power off prompt, touch OK.

## **Setup Wizard**

The first time you turn your device on, Setup Wizard will guide you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, set up accounts, enable location services, and learn more about your device.

You can also use the Setup Wizard to quickly configure your device at any time.

## **Your Google Account**

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, Google Talk, the Play Store, and more. With a Google Account, Google applications will always be in sync between your tablet and computer.

## **Creating a New Google Account**

If you did not create a new account with the Setup Wizard when you first turned your device on, follow these steps:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Gmail.
   The Add a Google Account screen displays.
- 2. Touch **New** to create a new Google account.

## **Your Samsung Account**

Create a Samsung account for access to Samsung apps on your device, including Media Hub, Music Hub, and AllShare Play.

If you did not create a new account with the Setup Wizard when you first turned your device on, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → Add account.
- 2. Touch S Samsung account.
- 3. Follow the prompts to create a new Samsung account.

## **Memory Card**

Your device supports removable microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards with maximum capacities of 64 GB (depending on the memory card manufacturer and type). Memory cards are used to store music, photos, videos, and other files.

For more information about using memory cards, see "Memory Card" on page 122.

Warning! Check that you are opening the microSD memory card slot cover, and NOT the SIM card slot.

## **Installing a Memory Card**

- Open the microSD memory card slot cover on the top of the device.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully insert the memory card into the slot, pressing gently until it locks into place (1).
- **3.** Close the slot cover securely (2).





## Removing a Memory Card

Important! To prevent damage to data stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Storage.
- 2. Under SD card, touch Unmount SD card. Touch OK.
- Open the microSD memory card slot cover on the top of the device.
- **4.** Gently press down on the memory card, so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.
- **5.** Close the slot cover securely.

## **Securing Your Device**

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can unlock the device using one of the default Unlock screens or, for increased security, use a personal screen unlock pattern.

## **Locking the Device**


Press the Power/Lock Key.

## **Section 2: Understanding Your Device**

This section outlines key features of your device and describes the screen and the icons that appear when the device is in use. It also shows how to navigate through the device.

#### Front

The following items can be found on the front of your device as illustrated.

- External Speakers: Used in music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.
- Light Sensor: Used to control screen brightness automatically and when taking photos with the front-facing Camera.
- Front-facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- 4. Display Screen: The orientation of the display screen rotates with the tablet as you turn it. You can turn this feature on and off. For more information, refer to "Auto-Rotate Screen" on page 154.



## **Top View**

The following items can be found on the top of your device as illustrated.

- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume.
   During music playback, press to adjust volume.
- Memory Card Slot: Install a memory card for storage of files.
- Infrared Blaster: Used to emit infrared signals used for controlling external devices. For more information, refer to "Smart Remote" on page 108.
- 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in for headphones.
- SIM Card Port: Insert your SIM card here.



#### **Back and Bottom Views**

The following items can be found on the back and bottom of your device.

- Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- 2. Microphone: Used for video chat.
- Charger/Accessory Port: Plug in a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.



## S Pen

The S Pen<sup>™</sup> is a stylus that assists you in performing different functions. By using the Pen button, you can minimize having to switch between touch and pen input.




- **1. Pen button**: By pressing the Pen button, you can add functionality to the S Pen.
- Stylus tip: The tip of the S Pen is used for tapping the screen.

## Removing S Pen

S Pen stores inside your device, for convenient access.

 Slide S Pen from your device using the notch on the end of the S Pen.



## Rich S Pen Functionality

- Air View: Hover S Pen over the screen to preview information.
- Effectively Express Yourself: Write/draw directly on an email, or the calendar, annotate Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and PDF documents, capture your ideas in S Note, and write a note on the back of the picture.
- Quick Command: Launch Quick Command to activate frequently used applications or actions. Press the S Pen button and then drag the S Pen up the screen to display the Quick Command window
- Easy Clip: Instantly outline and crop anything on the screen and freely edit or share with others.

#### Air View

Hover S Pen over the screen to preview content, or view information about an item on the screen. For example:

- Hover over an email in a list to preview the message before opening it.
- Hover over a photo album to preview the contents, or see a picture enlarged.
- Hover over the time line during video playback to preview and navigate to specific scenes.
- Hover over an icon or screen button to view the item's title

For more information about Air View, and to configure settings, touch  $\implies$  Apps  $\rightarrow$   $\implies$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  S Pen  $\rightarrow$  Air View.

## Write on Any Screen After Capture

To take a screen capture of any screen:

- 1. Grasp the pen and press the Pen button.
- Pressing the Pen button then touch and hold the screen for 2 seconds takes a screen shot.
- With the screen capture shown, use the pen to draw or write on the screen.

## **Idea Note**

Express your ideas with an image. Add illustrations by handwriting keywords on the Idea Note pad.

To use Idea Sketch:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch  $\longrightarrow$  Apps  $\rightarrow$   $\bigcirc$  S Note.
- 2. From the toolbar, select the Add icon, then choose Idea

  Note from the menu.
- Write a search term for something you want to draw or insert into your S Note. Or, select List and choose a category.
- 4. S Note displays images matching your search term. Select an image to insert it into your S Note. You can edit the image, or draw on it, and changes are saved in the note.

#### **Photo Notes**

Handwrite a note on the back of pictures to add detail to your memories.

#### To add a Photo Note:

- 2. Select a picture, then select Menu → Draw on image.
- Use S Pen to write a note on the back of the picture, then select **Done** to save the note with the picture.

**Note:** Photo notes are saved with the picture on your device, but are not transferred when you share the picture.

#### Other S Pen Gestures

You can perform other functions with S Pen, for example:

- Go back: Press and hold the S Pen button, then draw on the screen
- Open menu: Press and hold the S Pen button, then draw on the screen.
- Screen capture: Press and hold the S Pen button, then touch and hold S Pen on the screen.
- Select text: Press and hold the S Pen button, then touch and drag S Pen over the text to select

#### **Launch S Note Lite**

S Note Lite is an application that you can launch from any screen to take quick notes or jot down ideas.

#### To launch S Note from any screen:

- Grasp the pen and press the Pen button.
- Quickly double tap the screen to display the S Note Lite app.

## S Pen Settings

Configure S Pen settings, including options for sounds and for tracking S Pen when it's not stored in your device.

#### **Quick Command**

Multi-task like never before. Launch Quick Command pad from any screen, to hand-write tasks. Use S Pen to draw a Quick Command to launch a feature, or draw a Quick Command followed by a keyword to personalize the command. For example, draw a question mark "?" to search the Internet, or draw a question mark followed by a search term to search on the term.

#### To launch Quick Command:

 Press and hold the S Pen button and swipe upwards on the screen.

## Easy Clip

Instantly outline and crop images displayed on the screen in any shape to share or paste with Easy Clip. Once desired image is selected, users can freely edit the cropped content, or personalize with their own handwriting.

To take a selective screen capture:

Note: These steps allow you to capture selected areas of a screen based on a freehand area drawn on-screen.

- Grasp the pen.
- In a single motion, press and hold the Pen button then quickly draw a free form enclosed shape on the screen to select the area you want to capture.

Note: The shape you draw must be completed by ending over the same point at which you started. This creates a closed shape.

After a second, confirm the newly captured image appears on-screen. **Note:** Additional options are available by scrolling left across the bottom of the screen

4. Tap a destination for the newly captured image from the bottom of the screen. Tap one of the following options: Scrapbook (creates a scrapbook folder in your S Note application), S Note, Email, Kindle, Bluetooth, Gmail, Google+, Group Cast, Paper Artist, Picasa, or Wi-Fi Direct.

**Note:** If you take no action, after approximately 5 seconds, the image is automatically stored in the clipboard.

#### **Home Screen**

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device. Place shortcuts, widgets and other items to customize your device to your needs.



Google Search: Search the web by typing or speaking.
 For more information, refer to "Google" on page 100.

- 2. Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. These widgets are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 32.
- Current Screen: Indicates which Home screen is being displayed. For more information, refer to "Extended Home Screen" on page 23.
- 4. Apps: Displays the Apps screen.
- 5. Back: Return to the previous screen, option, or step.
- 6. Home Screen: Returns to the center Home screen.
- 7. Recent Apps: Open a list of thumbnail images of apps you have worked with recently. Touch an app to open it. Touch and drag an app to the right to delete it, or touch Delete all to delete all apps. Touch Task manager to display the Task Manager.
- 8. Screen Capture/Quick Launch: This soft key can be set to launch several different applications. The default setting is Screen capture. For more information, refer to "Quick Launch" on page 135.

- Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features.
   These shortcuts are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 32.
- 10. Mini App Tray: Shortcuts to apps that you can use anytime, such as a calculator, email, and a music player. For more information, refer to "Mini App Tray" on page 35.
- 11. Notification Icons: Presents icons to show notifications from the system or from an application. Touch a Notification icon to display more detail. For a list of icons, see "Status Bar" on page 30.
- **12. Time**: The current time. For more information, refer to "Date and Time" on page 154.
- 13. Status Icons: Indicate the status of your tablet. Touch the Time/Status icons area to display the Status Details panel. For more information, refer to "Status Bar" on page 30.

#### **Extended Home Screen**

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus three panels on each side that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts and widgets.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the top of the display shows your current position.

## **Customizing the Home Screen**

To customize the Home screens to suit your preferences:

- 1. Navigate to one of the Home screen panels.
- Touch and hold on the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays.
- 3. Customize the Home screen:
  - Touch Set wallpaper to set the wallpaper for the Home screen, Lock screen, and Home and lock screens. For more information, refer to "Wallpaper" on page 34.
  - Touch Add apps and widgets to add app or widget shortcuts to a Home screen.
  - Touch Add folder to add a folder to a Home screen. For more information, refer to "Folders" on page 33.
  - Touch Add page to add or remove a Home screen (up to a total of 7 screens). For more information, refer to "Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels" on page 24.

## **Display Settings**

You can customize display screen settings to your preferences. For more information, refer to "Display" on page 133.

## **Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels**

Your device comes with 7 Home screen panels. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding panels.

**Note:** The panel in the center position displays when you touch **Home** 

- From a Home screen, pinch the screen from the left and right side to the center to display the editing screen.
  - or -

Touch and hold on the screen until the **Home screen** popup displays. Touch **Add page** to add an additional panel (up to 7 total).



- **2.** Use these controls to configure panels:
  - Delete: Touch and drag a panel to the Trash
    Can to remove the panel from the Home
    screen.
  - Add: Touch to add a new panel, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven panels have been added.
  - Default Home Page: Touch the Home icon at the upper right corner of a panel to set it as the default home screen.
- To rearrange the order of panels, touch and drag a panel to a new location.
- 4. Touch "Back to return to the Home screen

## **Navigation**

Navigate your device's features using the command keys and the touch screen.

Warning! Please note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a non-metallic stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. #### **Back**

Touch **⇒ Back** to return to the previous screen, option, or step.

## **Recent Apps**

Touch rightarrow Recent Apps to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you have worked with recently. Touch an App to open it. Touch Delete all to remove all apps. Touch Task manager to display the Task Manager.

#### Screen Capture/Quick Launch

Touch Screen Capture to save an image of the current screen to the Screenshots album in Gallery. For more information, refer to "Gallery" on page 82.

**Note:** This soft key can be modified to launch other applications. For more information, refer to "Quick Launch" on page 135.

## Other Buttons Google Search

Touch  $\bigcirc$  Google Search to search the web or your device.

#### **Context-Sensitive Menus**

Context-sensitive menus offer options for features or screens. To access context-sensitive menus:

- Touch **Menu** to display a list of options.
- Touch an option in the list.

## **Application Bar**

The Application Bar is the area along the top of various application screens. It usually contains the Search and Menu icons, as well as other icons that are used to display options and settings.

## **Screen Navigation**

#### **Touch**

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Touch a menu item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

#### **Touch and Hold**

Activate on-screen items. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

#### Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- Unlocking the screen.
- Scrolling the Home screens or a menu.

#### **Pinch**

Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to make an inward pinch motion on the screen, as if you are picking something up, or an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out.



#### For example:

- Pinch a photo in Gallery to zoom in or out.
- Pinch a web page to zoom in or out.

#### **Notifications**

When you receive a notification, the Notification icon displays in the System Bar, to the left of the Time. Notifications indicate the arrival of Gmail, Email, alarms, and more.

Touch a Notification icon for more detail. For example, touch a Gmail Notification icon to see who sent the message.

Touch the Time field to open the Notifications list to view all of your current notifications. Touch a Notification in the list to display the item. For example, touch a Gmail entry to open the Gmail application and view the message.

Most apps that send notifications, such as Gmail and Google Talk, have individual settings that can be configured. See the settings for individual applications in the applicable section of this user manual.

## **Quick Settings**

To view and control the most common settings for your tablet, as well as accessing the complete Settings application, open the Quick Settings panel.

Touch the **Time** in the System Bar.
 The Quick Settings pop-up displays.



- 2. Touch the Time at the top of the pop-up to display a Date and time pop-up. Touch Automatic date and time or Automatic time zone to use network-provided date and time or time zone. Touch Use 24-hour format to enable the 24-hour format. Touch Manual setup to display the Date and time settings screen. For more information, refer to "Date and Time" on page 154.
- 3. The Quick Settings are:
  - Bluetooth: Touch to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 116.
  - GPS: Touch to enable or disable standalone GPS services.
     For more information, refer to "Standalone GPS Services" on page 138.
  - Sound/Mute/Vibrate: Touch to enable or disable sound mode.
  - Airplane mode: Touch to enable or disable Airplane mode. For more information, refer to "Airplane Mode" on page 123.
  - Screen rotation: When On the screen rotates automatically from landscape to portrait and vice versa. When Off the screen is fixed in the current mode, either portrait or landscape.
     For more information, refer to "Auto-Rotate Screen" on page 154.

Sweep the pop-up to the left to see additional settings.

- Power saving: When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power. For more information, refer to "Power Saving Mode" on page 136.
- Smart stay: To conserves battery power, the device uses the front-facing camera and face recognition to detect when you are actively watching the screen, and adjusts the screen brightness accordingly.
- **Driving mode**: New notifications are read aloud when enabled.
- AllShare Cast: Scans for available devices to connect with.
- Sync: Synchronizes your device with the network.
   Synchronizes contacts, email, time, and a variety of accounts.
- Brightness: Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness or touch Auto to allow the device to set brightness automatically based on available light and battery charge status. For more information, refer to "Brightness" on page 134.
- Settings: Touch to open the Settings application. For more information, refer to "Settings" on page 123.
- Notifications: Displays system notifications. For more information, refer to "Notifications" on page 27.

- Touch Clear to remove Notification icons from the System Bar.
- **5.** Touch a notification entry to display the details.
- Close the Quick Settings by touching X in the upper, right corner of the Quick Settings pop-up or by touching outside the Quick Settings screen.

Quick Settings also display icons under the Notifications heading to alert you to activity on the tablet such as new messages, application downloads, software updates, and more. The following table lists those icons.



**Download Successful:** A recent application download or update completed successfully.



**New Email Message**: You have new email. Touch Reply to view and answer the email.



**New Gmail Message:** You have new Gmail. Touch the icon for additional information.



**Google Talk Invitation**: Someone has invited you to chat using Google Talk.



**Wi-Fi networks available**: An open Wi-Fi network is in range.



**Wi-Fi Connected**: Your device is connected to a Wi-Fi network.



**Samsung account**: Set up your Samsung account. For more information, refer to "Your Samsung Account" on page 11.



**Software update**: There is a software update available for this device.



**Updates Available:** Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available.



**No SIM**: A SIM card has not been installed in your tablet.



**Signal Strength**: Displays your current signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.

#### **Status Bar**

The Status Bar is part of the System Bar and displays icons to show network status, battery power, and other details.



**Battery Fully Charged**: When the battery is fully charged, this indicator is displayed.



Battery Level: Shown fully charged.



Charging Indicator: Battery is charging.



**Device Power Critical**: Battery has only three percent power remaining. At about 15 percent power remaining, a popup is displayed to remind you to charge immediately.



USB Connection Indicator: The device is connected to a computer using a USB cable, but it is not charging. The battery is only charged while connected to a computer, if the device is turned off. When the device is off, press the Power/Lock key to see the battery charging indicator.



**Download in progress:** An application is being downloaded to the device.



Airplane Mode: Indicates that the Airplane Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.



**Set up input methods**: When the keyboard is being displayed, touch this icon to display a menu of quick keyboard settings.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 116.



Bluetooth Connected: Your device is connected to a Bluetooth device.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Wi-Fi Direct: Displays when Wi-Fi Direct is active and your tablet is connected to another device. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Direct" on page 112.



GPS Active: Displays when GPS is active.



Alarm Set: Displays when you set an alarm to ring at a specified time. For more information, refer to "Alarm" on page 98.



**Event**: This is a notification for one or more events.



Screenshot Captured: A screenshot has been captured. For more information, refer to "Quick Launch" on page 135.



Nearby Devices: The Nearby devices setting is enabled. For more information, refer to "Nearby Devices" on page 131.



**3G Connection**: Device is connected to a 3G network. The arrows are colored when data is being transferred.



46 LTE Connection: Device is connected to a 46 LTE network. The arrows are colored when data is being transferred.



No Network: No wireless network is available.

# **Primary Shortcuts**

Primary Shortcuts appear at the bottom of the display. You can edit the Primary Shortcuts, except for **Apps**.

# **Editing the Primary Shortcuts**

- To add a Primary Shortcut, touch and hold a shortcut, then slide it from the Home screen to the Primary Shortcuts area.
- To remove a Primary Shortcut, touch and hold the Primary Shortcut, then slide it on top of Remove.

# Widgets

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on the Home screens to access your favorite features.

When you first turn on your tablet, there are various widgets on the center Home screen. They can also appear on the Home screens to the left and right of the center Home screen.

### Adding Widgets to a Home screen

- Navigate to the Home screen on which you want to place the Widget.
- 2. From that Home screen, touch ### Apps.
- 3. Touch the Widgets tab.
- Touch and hold the widget's icon, then slide your finger where you want to place the icon and release it.

**Note:** There must be room on the screen where you want to place the widget, otherwise the widget will not add to the Home screen.

5. Touch **Back** to return to the Home screen.

# **Removing Widgets**

To remove a Widget, touch and hold the Primary Shortcut, then slide it on top of Remove.

### **Shortcuts**

Use App shortcuts for quick access to applications from the Home screen. Your device comes with app shortcuts already placed on the Home screen, and you can add your favorites.

# **Adding Shortcuts**

## **Adding Shortcuts from the Home screen**

- Navigate to a Home screen panel, then touch and hold on the screen to display the Home screen menu.
- 2. Touch Add apps and widgets.
- Touch and slide an app to place it on the Home screen panel.

## **Adding Shortcuts from Apps**

- 1. Navigate to a Home screen panel.
- 2. Touch Apps.
- 3. Touch and hold an app until the Home screen panel appears, then slide the app to place it on the panel.

## **Removing Shortcuts**

■ Touch and hold the shortcut until Remove appears, then slide the shortcut to the Remove icon.

#### **Folders**

Place folders on the Home screen to organize items.

### **Adding Folders**

- Navigate to a Home screen panel, then touch and hold on the screen to display the Home screen menu
- Select Add folder.
- Name the folder, then touch OK. The folder displays on the Home screen. Touch and hold the folder, then slide it to relocate it on the Home screen.

## **Removing Folders**

Touch and hold the folder until Remove appears, then drag the folder to the Remove icon.

# **Wallpaper**

Choose a picture to display in the background of the Home screen. You can choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images, or select a picture you've taken with the Camera or downloaded.

- From the Home screen, touch and hold on the screen to display the Home screen menu, touch Set wallpaper. Touch to select Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.
- **2.** Choose a source:
  - Gallery: Choose a picture stored on your device or on an optional installed memory card. Touch a picture to select it, then use the crop tool to resize the picture, if desired. Touch Done to set the picture as wallpaper.
  - Live Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded animated wallpaper images. Touch a wallpaper, then touch Set wallpaper.
  - Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images. Touch a wallpaper, then touch Set wallpaper.

**Note:** You can also set Wallpaper in Settings. For more information, see "Wallpaper" on page 133.

### **Apps**

Apps holds all applications installed on your device. Applications that you download and install are also added to Apps.

The Apps screen is like the Home screen, it consists of panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space. Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows your current position.

For more information about applications, see "Applications" on page 95.

You can place shortcuts to apps on the Home screen, for quick access to the app. For more information, see "Adding Shortcuts from Apps" on page 33.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Apps.
- 2. Slide your finger left or right to scroll the Apps screens.
- **3.** Touch an icon to launch the application.

# **Mini App Tray**

There are shortcuts available that link to apps that you might need while working in other apps, such as Alarm, Calculator, Calendar, Email, Music Player, Task manager, and World Clock. In some cases, these shortcuts are actually links to the part of the app you need most and they contain a link to the actual app where you can use other functions.

1. From any screen, touch Mini App Tray at the bottom, center of the screen.

The Mini App Tray icons display.



- Touch one of the icons to display a mini app pop-up.
   The pop-up varies depending on the application.
   Various controls display at the top of the pop-up, and other information is displayed in the body of the pop-up.
- 3. Touch options (such as +) to create new app items (such as alarms or events).

- **4.** Touch items in the body of the pop-up, such as an email entry or keys on the Calculator.
- **5.** When finished, touch  $\times$  to close the mini app pop-up.

## **Customizing the Mini App Tray**

You can choose applications to display on the Mini App Tray and arrange them in any order.

- 1. From any screen, touch Mini App Tray at the bottom, center of the screen.
- 2. Touch Edit at the right side of the tray.
- Touch and drag apps in and out of the tray or to another position in the tray.
- 4. Touch **Done** to save your changes.

# **Task Manager**

Your device can run apps simultaneously, with some apps running in the background. Use Task Manager to see which apps are running on your device, and to end running apps to extend battery life. You can also uninstall apps from your device and check memory usage.

- From any Home screen, touch Recent Apps, then touch Task manager.
- Touch the Active applications tab to view apps running on your device. Touch End, or End all to close apps.
- Touch the Downloaded tab to view information about apps you've installed on your device. Touch Uninstall to remove an app from your device.
- Touch the RAM manager tab to display the amount of RAM (Random Access Memory) in use. Touch Clear memory to clear processes to increase available RAM.
- Touch the Storage tab for internal system storage and SD card memory statistics.
- Touch the Help tab to view information about managing RAM, and tips for extending battery life.

Note: To end a single app, touch  $rac{}$  Recent Apps, then touch and drag the app to the right.

# **Entering Text**

## **Text Input Methods**

Your device offers three text input methods, Samsung keyboard, Google voice typing, and Swype.

You can set a default text entry method in Settings. For more information, see "Keyboards and Input Methods" on page 145.

To choose a text input method at any time:

- While entering text, touch the select input method notification icon.
- 2. Touch to select Google voice typing, Samsung keyboard, or Swype to switch input methods.
- 3. Touch **\Rightarrow** Settings to configure each input method.
- Touch set up input methods to configure the Keyboards and input methods settings.

### **Using the Samsung Keyboard**

The Samsung keyboard is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring optional predictive text. Input characters by tapping the on-screen keys with your finger, or use speech recognition.

You can enable predictive text, to have the Samsung keyboard match your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

### **Configuring the Samsung Keyboard**

Configure the Samsung keyboard to your preferences. For more information, see "Samsung Keyboard" on page 146.

 While entering text, touch Select input method, then touch Settings next to Samsung keyboard.


#### **Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters**

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching the Shift key to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

- Touch once to switch from abc to Abc mode
- Touch and hold to switch to ABC mode

#### **Entering Symbols and Numbers**

- To enter common symbols, touch <u>Sym</u> to switch to symbol mode, then touch the corresponding key.
- To enter less-common symbols, touch Sym → 1/2, then touch the corresponding key.
- Return to letters and numbers by touching ABC.



### **Using Google Voice Typing from the** Samsung Keyboard

When you enable the Voice input setting for Samsung keyboard, you can access Google Voice Typing from the Samsung keyboard.

Touch , then speak your input. For more information, refer to "Using Google Voice Typing" on page 38.

#### **Using Predictive Text**

By using Predictive text, you can have next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for pressing the wrong keys on the QWERTY keyboard.

Note: Enable Predictive text in Samsung keyboard settings, to have the Voice Input appear on the keyboard. For more information, see "Samsung Keyboard" on page 146.

While entering characters, potential word matches display in the Predictive text area above the keyboard. Touch a word to insert it into your text.

## **Using Google Voice Typing**

Use your voice to enter text using the Google Voice typing feature.

- 1. While entering text, touch the Select input method notification icon. Then touch Google voice typing.
  - or -

While entering text, touch ...

- 2. The Google Voice popup appears. Touch **Tap to speak.**
- 3. At the Speak now prompt, speak your text. As you speak, the text is displayed in the text field.
- 4. Touch **Speak now** on to stop or pause the voice typing feature.
- 5. To return to using the Samsung keyboard, touch



## **Using Swype**

Swype allows you to enter a word by sliding your finger or stylus from letter to letter, lifting your finger between words. Swype uses error correcting algorithms and a language model to predict the next word. Swype also includes a touch predictive text system.

- 1. While entering text, touch the Select input method notification icon. Then touch Swype.
- The Swype keyboard appears. Enter words by touching and holding the first letter of a word, sliding to each subsequent letter to spell out the word, then releasing the last letter.

## **Section 3: Contacts and Accounts**

This section explains how to manage contacts and accounts.

# Accounts

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

- Samsung account: Add your Samsung account. For more information, refer to "Your Samsung Account" on page 11.
- Backup Assistante Plus: Back up contacts, photos, music, documents and videos to a secure, online storage cloud.
- **Email**: Add an Email account to sync Contacts. For more information, refer to "*Email*" on page 53.
- Facebook: Add your Facebook account to sync Contacts.
- Google: Add your Google account to sync your Contacts, Calendar, and Gmail. For more information, refer to "Gmail" on page 60.
- LDAP: Add an LDAP account to find entries in an LDAP directory server.
- Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync: Add your Exchange account to sync Contacts, Calendar, and Email.

## **Setting Up Your Accounts**

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts and sync** setting.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Add account.
- Touch the account type you want to set up. Select from Samsung account, Backup Assistant Plus, Email, Facebook, Google, LDAP, or Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync.
- **3.** Follow the prompts to enter your account information to complete the setup process.
- 4. The device communicates with account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account displays in the Accounts area in Settings.

#### Contacts

Store contact information for your friends, family, and colleagues to quickly access information or to send a message.

### **Creating Contacts**

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts → Add contact.
- If you have multiple accounts set up, you can select which account to save the contact to (the default is the device). If prompted, touch **Device** or an account.
- Touch the Photo icon to set up a photo to identify the contact. Select from:
  - Image: Choose a photo from the Gallery.
  - Take picture: Display the Camera and take a new photo.
  - S Note: Choose a photo from S Note.
  - Tagged picture: Choose a photo from those with tags.
- Touch contact fields to display the keyboard and enter the contact's information.

Tip: Some fields may have multiple entries. Touch ← Add to add an additional entry. Touch ← Delete to remove an entry.

Tip: Touch the screen and swipe up or down to display additional fields, or touch **Next** on the keyboard to move to the next field.

- Name: Enter a name for the contact. Touch to enter a Name prefix, First name, Middle name, Last name, and Name suffix.
- Phone: Enter a phone number, then touch the Label tab to choose a label from Mobile, Home, Work, Work Fax, Home Fax, Pager, Other, Custom, or Callback.
- Groups: Touch this field to display the Select Group screen. To
  assign the contact to one or more groups, touch the check box
  next to each group. When enabled, a check mark 
  appears in the check box. Touch 
  Save. (For more
  information about groups, see "Groups" on page 49.)

- Touch Add another field to enter additional information for this contact. Select from:
  - Phonetic name: Enter a phonetic spelling to assist with this contact's name.
  - Organization: Enter an organization and Job title.
  - Email: Enter an email address, then touch the Label tab to choose a label from Home, Work, Other, or Custom.
  - IM: Enter an instant messaging address, then touch the Label tab to choose a label from AIM, Windows Live, Yahoo, Skype, QQ, Google Talk, ICQ, Jabber, or Custom.
  - Address: Enter an address, then touch the Label tab to choose a label from Home, Work, Other, or Custom.
  - . Notes: Enter notes for this contact.
  - Nickname: Enter a nickname for this contact.
  - Website: Enter a website address.
  - Events: Touch the Date tab to enter an event date. Touch the Label tab to choose a label from Birthday,
     Anniversary, Other, or Custom to create a custom event.

- Relationship: Enter a relationship, then touch the Label tab to choose a label from Assistant, Brother, Child,
   Domestic Partner, Father, Friend, Manager, Mother, Parent,
   Partner, Referred by, Relative, Sister, Spouse, or Custom.
- **6.** When you finish, touch **Save**.

Tip: Display a contact's record and touch the Email field to send an email, touch the Address field to display the address on a map, or touch the Website field to link to the website.

#### **Deleting Contacts**

To delete a contact:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information, and then touch Delete.

## **Updating Contacts**

To update an existing contact:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information, then touch Edit.

- or -

Touch and hold a contact, then select **Edit** from the menu.

**3.** Edit the contact's information. For more information, refer to "Creating Contacts" on page 41.

### **Managing Photo IDs**

To remove or update a contact's Photo ID:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Apps** →
  - Contacts.
- Touch Edit.
- Touch the Photo icon to set up a photo to identify the contact. Select from:
  - Image: Choose a photo from the Gallery.
  - Take picture: Display the Camera and take a new photo.
  - S Note: Choose a photo from S Note.
  - **Tagged picture:** Choose a photo from those with tags.

#### Send Email from Contacts

To send an email to one or more contacts:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch ∰ Apps →
  - Contacts.
- 2. Touch **■** Menu → Send email.
- Touch each contact you want to send an email message or touch Select all. A check mark indicates contact selection.
- 4. Touch V Done.
- Touch Email or Gmail. (Touch Always if you want the same selection each time.)
- 6. Compose your email, then touch Send.

## **Contacts Display Options**

There are various ways to display your Contacts:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- **2.** Touch **Groups**, **Favorites**, or **Contacts**, above the Contacts List, to view contacts in various ways:
  - Groups: Displays the possible Groups, such as Not assigned, Co-workers, Family, Friends, and so on. The number of contacts in the group is displayed next to the group name.
     Touch a group name to show only contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Creating a New Group" on page 49.
  - Favorites: Show only your favorite, or starred, contacts. For more information, refer to "Favorites" on page 51.
  - **Contacts**: Show all your contacts. Touch the **Search** field and enter a keyword to list contacts that contain that keyword.

#### **Groups View**

- From the Groups list, select a group and then touch
   Menu to display these Group-specific options:
  - **Search**: Search the group for a contact.
  - Delete groups: Touch one or more groups and touch Delete.
  - Edit: Change the Group name or touch Add member to add a new member to this group.
  - **Add member**: Add selected member(s) to this group.
  - Remove member: Remove selected member(s) from this group.
  - Send email: Touch to select each contact you want to send a
    group email to. Touch Done, then select the account to use for
    the email.
  - Change order: Changes the order of how the groups display.

#### **Favorites View**

- From the **Favorites** list, touch **■ Menu** to display these Favorites-specific options:
  - Search: Search favorites for a contact.
  - Add to favorites to add selected contacts to favorites.
  - Remove from favorites: Remove selected contacts from favorites.
  - Grid view: View favorites by Photo IDs.

#### **Contacts List View**

- From the Contacts list, touch Menu to display all or some of these options:
  - Backup. Backup contacts.
  - Delete contacts. Touch to select each contact you want to delete. Touch Delete.
  - Send email: Touch to select each contact you want to send a group email to. Touch Done, then select the account to use for the email.
  - History: Displays previous activity information about the selected contact.
  - Join contact: Join a contact to one or more other contacts. For more information, refer to "Joining Contacts" on page 47.

- Mark as default: If a contact has multiple email addresses, for example, touch the field that should be the default value.
- Share namecard via: Shares the selected namecard using Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, or through Wi-Fi Direct.
- Print contact info: Select the fields you want to print and touch
   Done. You can only print on a Samsung printer.
- Add shortcut to home: Adds a shortcut of the selected contact to your current home screen.
- Contacts to display: Select the contacts you want to display in this particular inbox. Options are: All contacts, Device, SIM, Google, Email, or Customized list. Touch Settings for more options.
- Import/Export: Use the USB cable to import contacts from, or export contacts to, a storage device such as a PC. Import contacts from the SIM card. Contacts may also be shared using the namecard format. For more information, refer to "Importing and Exporting Contacts" on page 48.
- Accounts: Displays the Sync settings screen so you can manage or synchronize this account.

- **Settings**: Configure contact settings:
- Only contacts with phones: Touch to check the box to only display contacts that have phone numbers.
- List by: List contacts by First name or Last name.
- Display contacts by: Display contact names as First name first or Last name first.
- Contact sharing settings: Sets parameters for sending contact information:
  - Send all namecards: Allows you to transmit all of your current Contact entries at a single time. If the recipient device does not support this feature, some or all Contact entries might not be received.
  - Send individual namecards: Allows you to transmit single contacts, one at a time. The recipient must accept each namecard as it is received. This method of transmission ensures all contacts are received.

#### **Linked Contacts**

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person.

Linking, or *joining*, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts is automatically updated the next time you synchronize with the account.

### **Joining Contacts**

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch **■** Menu → Join contact.
- Touch the contact you want to join together.
   The joined contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.
- **5.** Repeat Step 3 and 4 to join other contacts.

#### **Separating Contacts**

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- Touch 
   A list of Joined contacts displays.
- Touch Remove to separate a joined contact.
   The contact is removed from the list.

### **Sharing Contact Information**

You can send a contact's information using Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, or Wi-Fi Direct.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices accept contacts and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch **■** Menu → Share namecard via.

**Tip:** Set up a contact record for yourself to share your information with others.

- 3. At the prompt, choose a sending method. Options are:
  - **Bluetooth**: For more information, refer to "*Bluetooth*" on page 116.
  - Email: For more information, refer to "Email" on page 53.
  - Gmail: For more information, refer to "Gmail" on page 60.
  - Wi-Fi Direct: For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Direct" on page 112.
- 4. Follow the prompts to send the contact information.

## **Importing and Exporting Contacts**

To back up and restore your contacts information, you can export your contacts list to a storage device, such as a PC, or import your contacts list (previously exported) from a storage device.

- Use the USB cable to connect your device to the storage device.
- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch **■** Menu → Import/Export.
- Touch Import from USB storage, Export to USB storage, Import from SD card, Export to SD card, Import from SIM card, or Share namecard via, then follow the prompts to complete the operation.

## **Synchronize Contacts with Accounts**

To synchronize your contacts with an account:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch **■** Menu → Accounts.
- Touch Auto sync app data to turn on auto-sync. Autosynch controls whether changes made to information on your device or on the web are automatically synchronized with each other.
- Touch an account to configure the account's sync settings.
- Touch Add account to set up a new account.

## **Groups**

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster or to quickly send messages to group members.

## **Creating a New Group**

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch **Groups** above the Contacts List.
- **3.** Touch +.
- **4.** Touch the **Group name** field and use the keyboard to enter a new group name.
- Touch Add member to add a member to the group. For more information, refer to "Adding Group Members" on page 50.
- **6.** Touch **Save** to save the new group name.

**Tip:** Contacts can belong to more than one group. Just touch the contact's **Groups** field and touch each group.

Once you create a new group, the Contacts List can be set to display only the contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Contacts Display Options" on page 44.

### Renaming a Group

To rename a group that you created:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps →
  - Contacts.
- **2.** Touch **Groups** above the Contacts List and then touch the group you want to rename.
- 3. Touch  $\blacksquare$  Menu  $\rightarrow$  Edit.
- **4.** Touch the **Group name** field and use the keyboard to enter a new Group name.
- 5. Touch save to save the new group name.

## **Deleting Groups**

To delete a group that you created:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch Groups above the Contacts List.
- Touch Menu → Delete groups.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each group to delete.
- Touch Delete to delete the groups. Choose from Group only or Group and group members.

### **Adding Group Members**

To add a contact to a group or groups, edit the contact's Group field. For more information, refer to "Updating Contacts" on page 43.

To add multiple contacts to a group:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch Groups and then touch the group to which you want to add members.
- 3. Touch **■** Menu → Add member.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to add.
- **5.** Touch **Done** to add the contacts to the group.

## **Removing Group Members**

To remove contacts from a group:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch Groups and then touch the group from which you want to remove members.
- 3. Touch **■** Menu → Remove member.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- 5. Touch **Done** to remove the contacts from the group.

# **Favorites**

Mark contact records with a gold star  $\bigstar$  to identify them as favorites.

## **Adding Favorites**

To add a contact to the Favorites list:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it.
- Touch the star next to the contact name so that it turns gold .

**Tip:** You do not have to edit the contact to change the Starred status.

## **Accessing Favorites**

You can view your favorites two ways for fast viewing or messaging.

To view your favorites list:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch Favorites above the Contacts List.

Note: Touch Groups above the Contacts List and then touch Starred in Android to list the Favorites that are being saved on your Google account.

### **Removing Favorites**

To remove one or more contacts from your favorites list:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **### Apps** →
  - Contacts.
- 2. Touch Favorites above the Contacts List.
- 3. Touch **■** Menu → Remove from favorites.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- **5.** Touch **Done** to remove the contacts.

To remove one contact from your favorites list:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **## Apps** →
  - Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it.
- Touch the star next to the contact's name so that it turns gray to remove it from the Favorites list.

# **Section 4: Messaging**

# **Types of Messages**

Your device supports these types of messages:

- Email: Send and receive email from your email accounts, including Corporate mail.
- Gmail: Send and receive Gmail from your Google account.
- Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.
- Messenger: Chat with other Google+ Messenger users.

Note: Messaging service availability depends on your network and service plan. Compatible Device required. Consult Verizon Wireless for more information.

### **Email**

Send and receive email using popular email services.

### **Setting Up Email Accounts**

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Email**
- Choose an account to set up. Options are Corporate or Others.

**Note:** For information about setting up a Gmail account, see "Gmail" on page 60.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account. If you need assistance, contact your email service provider.

#### **Adding Additional Email Accounts**

To add additional email accounts:

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Email.
- 2. Touch **■**, Menu → Settings → Add account.
- 3. Enter the Email address, Password, and so on.

### **Viewing Your Email Accounts**

You can view email you receive for all accounts in the **Combined view** screen or you can view email accounts individually.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Email**.
- Touch the drop-down menu at the top left of the screen to select:
  - Combined view: View all email accounts in a combined inbox.
  - Priority sender inbox: Views email from contacts tagged as priority senders from all accounts. (Priority sender emails will still appear in their original inboxes.)
  - < Account Name >: View email for individual email account.
- Touch Q Search to search for text within emails.

- Touch Sync to sync this account (or combined accounts).
- **5.** Touch **\equiv Menu** for these options:
  - **Sort by**: Choose a method for listing your email conversations.
  - **View mode**: Choose how to view your email conversations. Choices are: Standard view and Conversations view.
  - Create folder: Create a new main folder or touch an existing folder to create a sub-folder. (This option is not available for all email accounts.)
  - Delete all: Delete all items for this email account.
  - Font Size: Select a font size for reading emails. Options are: Use device font size, Tiny, Small, Normal, Large, or Huge.
  - Settings: Display the settings for this email account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Email Accounts" on page 53.

### **Composing and Sending Email**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Email → Compose.
- 2. If you have more than one email account, touch the From field and select an account.
- 3. Enter the recipient's email address in the To field.
  - If you are sending the email message to several recipients, separate the email addresses with a comma. You can add as many message recipients as you want.
  - Touch Add contact to add a contact to the field.
  - Touch +Cc/Bcc to add additional carbon copy recipients.
    - Use the **Cc** field to carbon copy additional recipients.
    - Use the **Bcc** field to blind copy additional recipients.
  - Touch +Me to add yourself as a recipient.
- 4. Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.
- Touch the body of the email to enter the text of your email.

- 6. While composing a message, the following options may be displayed:
  - Scheduling: Set a time and date to send the email.
  - Priority: Set the email priority. Options are: High, Normal. or Low.
  - Tracking options: Touch Read receipt or Delivery receipt and then touch OK to set the tracking options for this email.
    - Security options: Set the email security options. Options are: Encrypt and Sign.
    - Attach: Choose an attachment to add to the message from the listed apps, such as Memo, My Files, Picture, Audio, Video, and so on.
  - Undo: Erase the previous input.
  - Redo: Restore the previously erased input.
  - Insert: Choose an item to insert into the message from the listed apps, such as Picture, Memo, Contacts, and so on.

- Insert quick response: Insert text that you frequently use in email.
- Font size: Choose a text font size of 9, 10,12,14, 17, 21, 24, 28, or 36 points.
- B Bold: Bold the following text. Touch again to turn off bold.
- Italics: This action italicizes the subsequent entered text.
- **T** Font color: Set the color of the text font. The bar changes to the selected color.
- **Background color**: Set the color of the background of the email.
- **Spell check**: Perform a spell check on the email.
- 7. Touch Send to send the message.
  - or -

Touch Save to save the email to the Drafts folder.

## **Managing Your Email Conversations**

You can change the status of one or more email conversations in an account.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Email.
- Touch the check box to the left of one or more conversations to select, then choose one of the following options:
  - Star ★: Mark conversations with a gold star they will appear in the Starred folder. Touch ☆ to remove from the Starred folder.
  - Mark as Read / Mark as Unread : Mark the conversations as read or unread. Once a conversation is marked as read, it has a gray background.
  - **Delete**  $\overline{\mathbf{m}}$ : Delete the conversations.

### **Email Settings**

Use settings to configure handling of your email.

**Note:** Available settings depend on the account type. Contact your service provider for more information.

### **General Email Settings**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Email**. Touch **Menu** → **Settings**.
- 2. Touch General preferences. Configure the follow options:
  - Auto-advance: Choose the screen to display after you delete, move a conversation. Select from Next message, Previous message, or Message list.
  - Message preview line: Choose the number of lines of email text to display in the preview screen. Select from None, 1 line, 2 lines, or 3 lines.
  - Email title: Choose how emails are titled in the preview screen.
     Select from Subject or Sender.
  - Confirm deletions: When enabled, Email will prompt you to confirm when you delete messages.
  - Quick responses: View and manage text phrases that you can insert into emails.

- Priority senders: Emails from contacts marked as priority senders are placed in the Priority senders inbox.
- Email notifications: When enabled, notifications appear in the status bar when new emails arrive.
- **Select ringtone**: Select a ringtone to sound when email arrives from a priority sender.
- Vibrate: When enabled, device will vibrate when email arrives from a priority sender.

#### **Email Account Settings**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Email. Touch Menu → Settings.
- 2. Choose an email account to configure the following options:
  - Account name: Enter a name to identify this account.
    - Your name: Enter a name to be used on email.
    - Signature: Touch the Signature sider to the right to turn Signature On. Touch Signature and enter a signature to add to email from this account.
    - Default account: When enabled, email from your device is automatically sent from this account.
    - Always Cc/Bcc myself: Lets you manage whether your email address is included in the Cc or Bcc lines.

- Forward with files: Enable to include any file attachments when you forward an email.
- Show images: Display images in an email.

#### Data usage:

- **Sync email**: When enabled, email from your account is synchronized with your device's email.
- Email check frequency: Set how often to check for new email sent to this account during. Options are: Never, every 15, or 30 minutes, every hour, every 4 hours, or once a day.
- Auto download attachments: Enable or disable auto-download of files attached to recent messages when connected through Wi-Fi.
- Size to retrieve emails: Set the maximum email retrieval size.
   Options are: Headers only, 2, 50, or 100 KB, All, or All including attachments
- **Auto resend times**: Set the number of auto send times. Options are: No limit or 1, 3, 5, or 10 times.

#### **Exchange ActiveSync settings:**

- Period to sync email: Set whether to store All, 1 or 3 days, 1 or 2 weeks, or 1 month of email on the tablet.
- **Empty server trash**: If available, indicates whether to delete the contents in the server trash.
- Sync schedule: Set up your peak and off-peak schedule controls, which determines when your tablet checks the email service for new email.
- Out of office settings: Lets you set how email is handled for a defined period of time, while you are unable to check your email.
- Size to retrieve emails: Set the maximum email retrieval size.
   Options are: Headers only, 0.5, 1, 2, 5,10, 20, 50, 100 KB, or All.
- Period to sync Calendar: When enabled, events from your account are synchronized with your device's Calendar.
- Security options: Set various security options for the account.
- In case of sync conflict: Set whether to update the server or your tablet if there is a conflict of information between them.
- Auto resend times: Set the number of auto send times.
   Options are: No limit or 1, 3, 5, or 10 times.

#### **Notification settings:**

- Email notifications: When enabled, the New Email icon appears in the Status Bar when a new email arrives.
- **Select ringtone**: Choose a ringtone for email notifications for this account.

#### Server settings:

- Exchange server settings: Configure incoming server settings.
  - or -

**Incoming settings**: Configure incoming server settings.

- $\bullet \ \ \textbf{Outgoing settings} \hbox{: Configure outgoing server settings}.$
- Sync Email: When enabled, email from your account is synchronized with your device's email.
- Sync Contacts: When enabled, contacts from your account are synchronized with your device's Contacts.
- Sync Calendar: When enabled, events from your account are synchronized with your device's Calendar.
- Sync Task: When enabled, tasks from your account are synchronized with your device's tasks.

### **Syncing Email Accounts**

Syncing refreshes your device with the account's servers. When you set up an email account, you can choose whether the account syncs in the background, or manually.

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Email.
- 2. Touch an account to sync, then touch Sync.
- Touch Combined inbox → Sync to sync all accounts.

## **Deleting Email Accounts**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Email.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings →

  Delete account.
- Select email account(s) for deletion, then touch Delete.

#### **Gmail**

Send and receive emails with Gmail, Google's web-based email.

# **Setting Up Your Gmail Account**

If you did not set up a Google account during the initial configuration, the first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Gmail.
- 2. Follow the prompts to sign in, or create a new account.
- The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email.

#### **Composing and Sending Gmail**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Gmail.
- Touch Compose, then touch the text fields to compose the message. While composing, touch Menu for options.
- 3. To send the message, touch > Send.

### **Syncing Your Gmail Account**

Syncing refreshes your device with the account's servers. When you set up an email account, you can choose whether the account syncs in the background, or manually.

■ From the Home screen, touch ### Apps → \$\infty \text{Gmail} → \$\infty \text{Sync}\$.

### **Gmail Settings**

Use settings to configure your Gmail preferences.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Gmail.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings for options.

Note: For more information and detailed instructions on using Gmail's features, touch Apps → Gmail, then touch Menu → Help.

#### Talk

Chat with other Google Talk users.

■ From the Home screen, touch ### Apps → talk Talk.

# Messenger

From the Home screen, touch  $\boxplus$  Apps  $\rightarrow$   $\blacksquare$  Messenger.

### **Section 5: Multimedia**

This section describes the various multimedia applications available on your device such as Media Hub, Music Player, Google Play Music, Video Player, Gallery, Camera, and Camcorder.

#### **Media Hub**

Samsung Media Hub is your one stop for the hottest movie and TV content. With hundreds of titles available at your fingertips, entertaining on the go has never been easier. You can rent or purchase your favorite content and conveniently watch anywhere. Featuring the stunning viewing quality Samsung is known for, Samsung Media Hub is your gateway to mobile video like you have never experienced it before.

**Note:** Media Hub service requires a Samsung account and depends on service availability. For more information about Media Hub, visit <a href="mailto:samsung.com/mediahub">samsung.com/mediahub</a>.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Media Hub.
- To rent or buy media, you must have a Samsung account. Touch Menu → My Profile to sign in to your Samsung account or to create an account. Follow the prompts to log in.
- 3. Browse content using these options:
  - What's new: Recently-added titles for rent or purchase.
  - Movies: Movies you can rent or purchase.
  - TV Shows: TV shows you can rent or purchase.
  - My Media: Content you have previously purchased or rented.
- 4. When you find media you want to view, use these options:
  - View trailer: View a short clip from the movie or show.
  - **Buy**: Purchase the media for unlimited viewing on your device. Follow the prompts to enter payment details.
  - **Rent** (if available): Purchase a time-limited download of the media. Follow the prompts to enter payment details.

#### **Media Hub Notices**

- Any media item (Media Content) may be rented or purchased after you create an account in Media Hub.
- Media Content that is downloaded may be viewed concurrently on up to five (5) devices with Media Hub that are also registered to the same account.
- You may choose to remove a device from your account no more than once every 90 days.
- You may remove Media Content from a device as many times as you like. You will have the ability to re-download the Media Content at a later point in time subject to content re-download availability and studio permissions.
- You MUST be in network coverage to license Media Content you have acquired through the Service.
- You can use 3G, 4G, or Wi-Fi connectivity in order to download Media Content.
- Unlike purchased Media Content, rented Media Content will be viewable on only 1 device in your account.
- · Media Content is downloaded and saved onto the SD card.
- Your Media Content may pause/stop or not download in networks where there is a weak signal.

- You may begin watching downloaded Media Content as soon as

   a) license acquisition has occurred and b) sufficient amount of the
   Media Content has been buffered.
- You must finish watching rented Media Content within 24 consecutive hours of start of playback.
  - Stopping, pausing, or restarting rented Media Content does not extend the available viewing time.
- In no event will rented Media Content be available for a period of more than thirty (30) days (or shorter on a title-by-title basis) after the Media Content has been rented (e.g., if you begin viewing rented Media Content on the 29th day after the rental transaction, but do not finish viewing the entire title, that rented Media Content may not be available for the entire twenty-four (24) consecutive hour period if such period would extend the viewable time beyond the thirty (30) day rental window).
- You cannot play any media content downloaded from Media Hub through any output on your mobile device, including All Share.

# **Music Player**

Music Player plays music and other audio files that you copy from your computer.

- 1. From the Home screen, select **## Apps** →
  - Music Player.

The Music Player application searches your device's internal storage for music and playlists. This can take from a few seconds to several minutes, depending on the amount of new music added since you last opened the application. It then displays your music in several ways.

- Touch Songs, Playlists, Albums, Artists, Genres, Folders, Composers, Years, or Music square to change the way you view the contents of your library.
- Touch the Music Player application icon at the top-left of the Application bar to return to the previous Music screen.

## **Managing Your Music**

### **Searching for Music**

To find music in your library:

- 1. From the Home screen, select **Apps** →
  - Music Player.
- 2. Touch Q Search.
- Type the name of an artist, album, or song.
   Matching songs are displayed in a list below the search box.
- **4.** Touch a matching song to play it. Touch a matching album, or artist to view a list of its songs.

### **Creating a Playlist**

- 1. From the Home screen, select **## Apps** →
  - Music Player → Playlists.
- 2. Touch → New playlist.
- 3. Touch the name field to enter a name for the playlist.
- 4. Touch **OK** to save the new playlist.

#### **Adding Songs to Playlists**

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Music Player.
- 2. Touch and touch a playlist.

- or -

Touch **Playlists**, touch a playlist, and then touch **Add music**.

All songs are displayed.

Touch next to each song you want to add or next to Add all to add all songs to the playlist.

The songs appear under the playlist to the right of the songs list.

4. Touch Done to save the playlist.

#### **Renaming a Playlist**

- 1. From the Home screen, select **Apps** →
  - Music Player.
- 2. Touch Playlists, touch a playlist, and then touch

   Menu → Rename playlist.
- Touch the name field to enter a new name for the playlist.
- 4. Touch **OK** to save the new playlist.

#### **Removing Songs from Playlists**

- 1. From the Home screen, select **Apps** →
  - Music Player.
- 2. Touch and touch a playlist.

All songs are displayed to the left of the playlist and the songs in the playlist are displayed on the right, under the playlist name.

- 3. Touch to remove a song from the playlist.
- 4. Touch **Done** to save the playlist.

#### **Changing Music Settings**

To change settings in the Music application:

- 1. From the Home screen, select **## Apps** →
  - Music Player.
- 2. Touch Menu to display the following options:
  - Delete: Touch the box for any song or album you want to delete
    or touch the box for Select all to select every song or album. A
    check mark indicates the song or album is to be deleted.
    Touch Delete to delete the selected items.
  - Share via: Share your music by using Bluetooth, Dropbox, Email, Gmail, Group Cast, or Wi-Fi Direct. Select the songs you want to share and touch Share.
  - **Set as alarm tone**: Choose a song and touch **Set** to use the song as an alarm tone.
  - **Scan for nearby devices**: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.

• **Settings**: The following settings display:

#### Advanced

- Sound settings: Choose SoundAlive and Play speed settings.
- Lyrics: Display the lyrics of the song, if available.
- Music auto off: Set the option Off or set your music to turn off automatically after 15 minutes, 30 minutes, 1 hour, 1 hour and 30 minutes, or 2 hours.

#### Music menu

 Music menu: Enable or disable the music display options that appear on the main music screen. A check mark a next to an option means that it is enabled.

#### **Changing the Order of a Playlist**

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Music Player.
- 2. Touch Playlists and touch a playlist.
- Touch Reorder to change the order of the songs.
   Touch the grid on an entry and drag the entry to a new position in the list.
- 4. Touch **Done** to change the order and save the playlist.

#### **Deleting a Playlist**

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Music Player.
- 2. Touch Playlists and touch a playlist.
- 3. Touch Delete in the Application bar.
- Touch the box next to a playlist title. A check mark indicates the playlist is to be deleted.
- Touch Remove and then touch OK to delete the selected playlist.

#### **Playing a Playlist**

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Music Player.
- Display the Playlists library view.
- Touch Favorites, Most played, or Recently added, or touch a playlist title that you created.
- **4.** Touch a song to start playing the playlist at that song.

# **Listening to Music**

You can listen to music by using your device's built-in speakers, through a wired headset or through a wireless Bluetooth stereo headset.

For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 116.

Touch the **Volume Key** on the side of the device to activate on-screen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key to adjust playback volume.

#### **Playing Music**

To play a song:

- 1. From the Home screen, select **## Apps →** 
  - Music Player.
- 2. Touch a song in your library to listen to it.

   or –

While viewing a list of albums or genres, touch the album thumbnail and then touch a song in the list of songs on the album.

The song you touch starts to play. The tracks in the current list play in order until you reach the end of the list (unless you choose a repeat option). Otherwise, playback stops only if you stop it, even when you switch applications.

# Accessing the Music Player


If you navigate away from the **Music Player** application and music is playing, you can change songs or easily return to the Music Player:

- **1.** Touch the Music notification icon **1** in the System Bar.
- In the Status Details, touch the song title to display the Music Player. You can also pause and resume playback and skip to the next or previous song in the panel. For more information, refer to "Notifications" on page 27.

#### **Using the Music Player**

Music Player plays music and other audio files that you copy from your computer.

- From the Home screen, select Apps → Music Player.
- Touch a song or playlist to begin playback.
   The music player displays below (portrait mode) or to the right (landscape mode) of the music listing.
- Touch Window to turn the music player into a floating popup window.
- 4. Touch the screen to display sound and playlist controls.



- **5.** During playback, use the sound and playlist controls:
  - **Favorite**: Touch the star  $\bigstar$  to mark the current song as a favorite.
  - Volume: Touch to toggle Silent mode and Sound mode, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key on the side of the device to adjust playback volume.
  - SoundAlive: Touch to view and set SoundAlive options.
  - Info: Touch to view information about the current song.
  - List Mode: Touch to switch to the list of songs.
  - **Shuffle**: When enabled, songs play in random order. When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view.
  - **Progress Bar**: Touch and drag the end of the progress bar to scan forward or backward through the current song.

- Playback Controls: These buttons control the playback of songs:
  - Touch ►►I to advance to the next song. Touch and hold ►►I to scan forward through the current song.
  - Touch I◄◀ to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold
     I◄◀ to scan backward through the current song.
  - Touch to pause playback. Touch ▶ to resume playback.
- Repeat: Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable repeat mode.

# **Options While Playing a Song**

There are various options and controls available while a song is playing:

- From the Home screen, select Apps →
   Music Player, touch a song or an album, and then touch a song.
- 2. Touch the music player to enlarge it.
- **3.** Touch Menu to display the following options:
  - Add to playlist: Add the song to a new playlist or an existing playlist.
  - Via Bluetooth: Play the current song by using a Bluetooth device.
  - Share via: Share the current song by using Bluetooth, Dropbox, Email, Gmail, Group Cast, or Wi-Fi Direct.
  - Set as alarm tone: Use the current song as an alarm tone.
  - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.
  - Settings: Displays Music Player settings. For more information, refer to "Changing Music Settings" on page 66.

# **Play Music**

The Play Music app contains a music player that plays music and other audio files that you copy from your computer or store online.

Note: Some options described in this manual may not be available until you sign in to your Google account.

# **Google Play Music**

Google Play Music is a service from Google that gives you instant access to your personal music collection on the Internet and your compatible Android devices without the hassle of wires or syncing. For more information, visit <a href="play.google.com">play.google.com</a>.

## Accessing the Music App

1. From the Home screen, touch **# Apps** →



The Play Music app searches your online library and your device's internal storage for music and playlists. This can take from a few seconds to several minutes, depending on the amount of new music added since you last opened the application.

It then displays a carousel view of your new and recent music, organized by album.



- 2. Swipe left or right to spin the carousel and browse through your new and recent music.
- 3. Touch an album to open it.
- Return to the Library screen from most other screens in the Play Music application by touching at the top-left of the Application bar.

# **Changing Library View**

You can change the way you view the contents of your library.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Play Music**.
- 2. Touch the name of the current view, such as **Recent**, near the top-left of the Application bar.
- Touch an option to set how you view your library.
   The choices are: Recent, Albums, Artists, Songs, Playlists, or Genres.

**Note:** The contents of your library display in a scrolling grid, list, or carousel, depending on the view.

# **Searching for Music**

To find music in your library:

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Play Music.
- 2. Touch Search.
- Type the name of an artist, album, song, or playlist.
   Touch on the keyboard to remove the keyboard.
   Matching songs are displayed in a list below the search box.
- 4. Touch a matching song to play it, touch a matching album, artist, or playlist to view a list of its songs, or touch next to an item in the list to play it, add it to a play queue, add it to a playlist, or shop for other music by the artist online.

#### **Changing Music Settings**

To change settings in the Music application:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → Play Music.
- 2. Touch Menu.

The following options display depending on the library view:

- Shuffle all: Play all songs in a random order.
- New playlist: Create a new playlist from the Playlist view. For more information, refer to "Creating a Playlist" on page 78.
- Hide now playing bar / Show now playing bar: Hide or show the Now Playing bar that displays at the bottom of the screen.
   You can return to the Now playing screen from other Music screens by touching the name of the current song in the Now Playing bar.

- Choose on-device music: In addition to playing the music that you add to your online library, you can play music stored on your device's internal storage. Then you can listen to music when you have no Internet connection. To do this, make some of your online music available offline. For more information, refer to "Making Online Music Available Offline" on page 79.
- On device only: Display only the music that is available on your tablet.
- Hide labels / Show labels: Hide or show labels. This option is not available in all library views.
- Settings: Displays the Settings screen. Choose a Google account to use to connect to Google Play Music and set the Music settings as indicated on the screen. The Music app version is also displayed.
- Help: Opens the Browser with information about the Music application.

# **Listening to Music**

You can listen to music by using your device's built-in speakers, through a wired headset, or through a wireless Bluetooth stereo headset. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 116.

Touch the **Volume Key** on the side of the device to activate on-screen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key to adjust playback volume.

# **Options While Selecting a Song**

The following options are available for playing songs, albums, or playlist, finding more information about artists, finding more music, and deleting songs:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **## Apps** → **Play Music**.
- 2. Touch an album or song.
- 3. Touch the label area under an item. The following options display depending on the item view:
  - Play: Plays the selected song, album, or playlist.
  - Add to queue / Remove from queue: Add the song to or remove the song from a queue of songs to be played.
  - Add to playlist: Add the song to a new playlist or an existing playlist.
  - More by artist: View any other music in your library by the artist that performs this song.
  - Shop for artist: Launches Google to search for more songs by the selected artist.
  - Delete: Delete the song.

#### **Playing Music**

- 2. Touch a song in your library to listen to it.
  - or -

While viewing a list of songs, touch next to a song and touch **Play**.

- or -

While viewing a list of albums, artists, playlists, or genres, the label area under an item and touch Play.

The Now playing bar displays at the bottom of the screen and the song you touched or the first song in the album or playlist starts to play. The tracks in the current list play in order until you reach the end of the list (unless you choose a repeat option). Otherwise, playback stops only if you stop it, even when you switch applications.

Note: If you navigate away from the Now playing screen in the Music application, the Now Playing bar displays at the bottom of the screen. You can use this to control playback or touch ■ Menu → Hide now playing bar.

# **Displaying the Now Playing Screen**

Touch the Now playing bar to display the Now playing screen. If you navigate away from the Now playing screen, to return to the Now playing screen from other Music screens:

- Touch the name of the current song in the Now Playing bar.
  - or –

Touch the Music notification icon in the System Bar, and in the Status Details panel, touch the song title.

You can also pause and resume playback and skip to the next or previous song in the Status Details panel. For more information, refer to "Notifications" on page 27.

## **Options While Playing a Song**

When you play a song, the Now playing screen displays. There are various options and controls available while a song is playing:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **## Apps →** Play Music.
- **2.** Play a song. For more information, refer to "Playing Music" on page 75.

The Now playing bar displays.

- Touch the Now playing bar.The Now playing screen displays.
- 4. Touch on the Now playing screen to display all songs in the queue to be played.
- 5. Touch next to a song to add it to a playlist, remove it from the queue, view information about the artist associated with this song, shop for the artist, or delete the song.

- **6.** Touch **Menu** to display the following options:
  - Equalizer: Displays an equalizer.
  - Clear queue: Remove all songs from the play queue.
  - Save queue: Create a playlist of the songs currently in the play queue.
  - Settings: Displays the Settings screen. Choose a Google account to use to connect to Google Play Music and set the Music settings as indicated on the screen. The Music app version is also displayed.
  - Help: View online help from Google.
- 7. Touch the Now playing screen to display the following buttons that you can use to control the playback of songs, albums, and playlists:



Touch Thumbs up or Thumbs down to add the song to a Thumbs up or Thumbs down playlist.



Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable repeat mode.



Touch to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold to scan backward through the current song.



Touch to pause playback.



Touch to resume playback



Touch to advance to the next song. Touch and hold to scan forward through the current song.



When Shuffle mode is enabled, songs play in random order. When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view.

#### **Creating a Playlist**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Play Music.
- 2. Touch the **Playlists** library view.
- Touch Menu → New playlist.
   The New playlist pop-up displays.
- **4.** Touch the **NAME** field to enter a name for the playlist.
- 5. Touch **OK** to save the new playlist.

#### **Adding Songs to a Playlist**

To add a song to a new or existing playlist while the song is playing:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Play Music**.

- Touch Add to playlist.The Add to playlist pop-up displays.

The playlist is saved with the song added to it.

#### Playing, Renaming, or Deleting a Playlist

The following options display:

- Delete: Touch OK to delete the playlist. Only the playlist is deleted. To delete individual songs.

To view information about finding and buying music:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch ### Apps → Play Music.

- 3. Touch Music.

#### **Making Online Music Available Offline**

In addition to playing the music that you add to your online library, you can play music stored on your device's internal storage. Then you can listen to music when you have no Internet connection. To do this, make some of your online music available offline.

To make your online music available offline on your device:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **## Apps** → Play Music.
- Change your library view to Albums, Artists, or Playlists. For more information, refer to "Changing Library View" on page 72.
- Touch Menu → Choose on-device music and touch the album or playlist you want to make available offline.
  - A white pin indicates that the item is already available offline.
  - Gray pins appear next to the items you can make available offline.
  - A bar at the bottom of the screen shows how much space is available on your device for music and other files.
  - Dim blue pins indicate songs or albums that you copied directly from a computer to your device.

- Touch the gray pin next to each item you want to make available offline.
  - or -

Touch a white pin to stop making it available offline.

You can switch to other views of your library to make other kinds of items available offline as well.

Touch **Done** in the bar at the bottom of the screen.The Music application starts downloading the items to your device.

## Video Player

Use Video Player to view and manage videos.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Video Player.
  - or –

From a Home screen, touch  $\boxplus$  Apps  $\rightarrow$   $\blacktriangleright$  Video Player.

- 2. Touch the **Thumbnails**, **List**, or **Folders** tab.
- Touch Search and use the keyboard to enter a search term. The current folder is searched and results are displayed. Touch X to remove the search field.
- **4.** While viewing the list, touch **Menu** for options:
  - List by: Display videos by Name (default), Date, Size, or Type.
  - **Share via**: Share the video with Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Google+, Picasa, Wi-Fi Direct, or YouTube.
  - Delete: Touch videos to select them for deletion or touch Select all to delete all videos. Touch Delete to deleted the selected videos.
  - Auto play next: Touch to enable or disable automatic playing of videos in the order they appear.
  - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.

- Touch a video to play it. While playing a video, touch the screen to display or hide on-screen playback controls.
- Touch the icon in the upper left corner of the display screen while the video is playing to change the Display Mode from original size to full screen in ratio or full screen.
  - Original Size ( ): Changes the display mode to the original size
  - Full-Screen in Ratio View (III): Changes the display mode to the full-screen in ratio option. The video is enlarged as much as possible without becoming distorted.
  - Full-Screen View (SS): Changes the display mode to full screen. That is, the entire screen is used, which may cause some minor distortion.

- 7. Touch SoundAlive to set the sound quality to Normal, Voice, Movie, or Virtual 7.1 ch.
- While the video is playing, touch Bookmark to mark your favorite areas of the video. A yellow mark displays on the progress bar.
- **9.** During playback, press Menu for options:
  - **Share via**: Send the video by Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Google+, Picasa, S Note, Wi-Fi Direct, or YouTube.
  - Chapter preview: If chapter information is recorded in the video file, display the chapters. Touch a chapter to begin playing the video at that point.
  - Trim: Trim the original video or trim the video and create a new video.
  - Via Bluetooth: Turn Bluetooth on to use Bluetooth services.
  - **Video Editor**: Open this video in the Video Editor app. For more information, refer to "Video Editor" on page 108.
  - Bookmarks: If bookmarks have been set for this video, a thumbnail and time are displayed for each bookmark. Touch to remove a bookmark.

- Details: Provides details about the video, such as Name, Size, Resolution, Duration, Format, and Date modified.
- Video auto off: Automatically turn off the video. Options are:
   Off, After playing, After 15 min, After 30 min, After 1 hour, After
   1 hour 30 min, or After 2 hours.
- Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.
- **Settings**: Touch this option to view the following:
  - Play speed: Touch and drag the slider to decrease or increase play speed.
  - **Subtitles**: View subtitles for the video. if available.
  - Color tone: Choose the color tone of the video. Options are: Normal, Warm, or Cold.
  - Outdoor mode: Increase the brightness of the display for better viewing outdoors.

Use Gallery to view, capture, and manage photos and videos.

# **Organizing Photos and Videos**

1. From a Home screen, touch Gallery.

From a Home screen, touch **## Apps → M Gallery**.

All photo albums are displayed.

- Touch Category in the top left corner to select a category to display. Options are:
  - Albums: Photos and videos organized in album. Touch an album to display it on the left, with the album's contents displayed on the right. Touch any item to view.
  - **Time**: Photos and videos sorted by date.
  - **Locations**: Photos sorted by location on a map. Touch each pin to view photo. (Photos must be GPS tagged to be displayed.).
  - **Person**: Photos with face recognition tags.
  - Group: Photos and videos assigned to groups.
  - Favorites: Photos and videos tagged as favorites.

- Thumbnails are arranged in three views: Grid view, Timeline view, and Spiral view. Touching any of the three icons will rotate to the next view.
  - **Grid view**: Items arranged by folders.
  - Timeline view: Items by date.
  - Spiral view: Items arranged in a spiral design.
- **4.** Touch Menu to display the following options (not all options are available in all views):
  - Slideshow: Displays items as a slideshow. For more information, refer to "Viewing Slideshows" on page 85.
  - New album: Creates a new album.
  - View by: Filter content by All content, Content in device,
     Content in Facebook, or Content in Picasa.
  - Select album: Allows albums to be selected.
  - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.
  - Settings: Displays accounts and data usage.

## **Selecting Items**

- Show on map: This option displays if a Location exists for the photo. A Location is added to the photo if GPS tag is set On in the Camera settings. Touch this option to open the Map app and display the Location where the photo was taken.



- GPS tag: Enable or disable tagging of photos with your GPS location.



- 9. Touch SoundAlive to set the sound quality to Normal, Voice, Movie, or Virtual 7.1 ch.
- **10.** Press **Back** to return to the Camcorder.

# **Uninstalling Apps**

# **Customizing the Apps Screens Choosing a View**

By default, app icons appear in Grid view. You can change the view to list view.

- Create folder: Create a new folder to contain apps.
- Uninstall: Remove an app that you downloaded from your device. Preloaded apps cannot be uninstalled.
- Downloaded applications: Display all apps you've downloaded.
- **View type**: Configure the apps screen.
- Share apps: Select apps you've downloaded (not available for pre-loaded apps) to share via Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Google+, S Note, or Wi-Fi Direct.
- Hide applications/Show hidden applications: Control
  whether app icons are visible in Apps. Hiding an icon does not
  remove the app from your device.

## **GPS Applications**

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPSenabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- · inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- · in poor weather
- around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.

#### Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- Access the Internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

### **Turning Wi-Fi On or Off**

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.
- 3. Touch and slide the Wi-Fi slider to the left to turn Wi-Fi Off.

Note: Wi-Fi may also be enabled using the Notifications panel.

# Scanning and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections, then displays them on screen.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.
- Your device automatically scans for available Wireless Access Points.
- 4. When the scan is complete, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the Wi-Fi network is open, your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

### Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.
- Touch Add Wi-Fi network, then enter network information:
  - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point (WAP).
  - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.

Note: Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required, such as a Password.

- **Password**: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.
- Touch Save to save the settings, or touch Connect to save the settings and connect to the network.

#### **Wi-Fi Direct**

Wi-Fi Direct is a standard that allows devices to connect to each other directly via Wi-Fi, without a Wi-Fi network or hotspot, and without having to set up the connection. This type of connection is commonly called peer-to-peer.

For example, your device can use Wi-Fi Direct to share photos, contacts and other content with other Wi-Fi Direct devices.

### **Turning Wi-Fi Direct On**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi Direct to turn Wi-Fi Direct On.

### **Connecting to Wi-Fi Direct Devices**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → Wi-Fi.
- Touch Wi-Fi Direct at the top of the screen. Your device automatically scans for nearby Wi-Fi Direct devices, or you can touch Scan to start scanning.
- After scanning for devices, select a device, then follow the prompts to complete the connection.
  - or -

Touch **Multi-connect** to create a connection to devices that support multi-connect. Touch **Scan** to search for available multi-connect devices, then select the devices and follow the prompts to complete the connection.

- **4.** Touch **\equiv** Menu for additional settings:
  - Rename device: Rename the device.
- **5. Help:** Get more information about using Wi-Fi Direct.

# **AllShare Play**

AllShare Play allows your tablet to stream photos, music, and videos from its memory to other DLNA certified (Digital Living Network Alliance) devices. Your tablet can also play digital content streamed from other DLNA certified devices.

# **Configuring AllShare Play**

You must first connect both of your communicating devices to the same Wi-Fi and be using an active and registered Samsung account prior to using this application. ### **Using Group Cast**

While using various applications, such as **Section 5 Share** to share a file, you see Group Cast as an option.

Group Cast is an easy way to share files in real time with others who are on the same Wi-Fi network. Group Cast can be used when you want to share documents, images, music, and so on.

You can use Group Cast for meetings, sales presentations, conferences, and classes. All you need is a Wi-Fi network that works with Group Cast, and most do.

To share a file, such as a photo, using Group Cast:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Gallery.
- 2. Navigate to the file you want to share and touch

  Share → Group Cast.

Note: After the initial Group Cast request, touch

group Cast instead of <

Use the keyboard to enter a PIN code and touch **Done**. This process makes sure only desired recipients can view your shared image.

The AllShare Play – Group Cast screen displays and the device waits for other connected recipients to accept the connection and enter the PIN on their screens.

Touch OK to start the group cast process while other users connect

You can now interact and draw with the on-screen image, and users will instantaneously see the same gestures and also be able to interact.

Note: The newly altered image (with markups and comments) can not be saved, but you can take a screen shot of the current image and save it to your Clipboard. For more information, refer to "Screen Capture/Quick Launch" on page 26.

# **Mobile Hotspot**

Use Mobile Hotspot to share your device's internet connection with a PC or other device through Wi-Fi, using your device as the mobile hotspot.

Note: Mobile Hotspot may require a subscription to Mobile Hotspot/Mobile Broadband Connect service. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information.

Mobile Hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While the Mobile Hotspot is active, your device's applications will use the Mobile Hotspot data allowance.

### **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet. You don't need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Your device can use Bluetooth to share photos, contacts and other content with other Bluetooth devices.

### **Turning Bluetooth On or Off**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch and slide the **Bluetooth** slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On.
- 3. Touch and slide the **Bluetooth** off slider to the left to turn Bluetooth Off.

# Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Note: When paired, the paired icon displays in the Status Bar. If you receive a new request for pairing while paired with a Bluetooth headset, a new Bluetooth icon displays at the left of the Status bar and Notifications displays the pairing request.

- 2. Touch and slide the **Bluetooth** slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On.
- **3.** Activate the target device's discoverable mode.
- 4. Touch Scan.
- 5. From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
  - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch **OK**. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.
  - If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device will attempt to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.
- Once your tablet is paired with the target device, touch next to the device name in the Paired devices list.
  - Touch **Rename** to change the named of the paired device.
  - Touch **Unpair** to unpair from the paired device.
  - Touch other options under Profiles as required.

# **Disconnecting a Paired Device**

Disconnecting a paired device breaks the connection between the device and your tablet, but retains the knowledge of the pairing. At a later point when you wish to reconnect the device, there is no need to setup the connection information again.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → Bluetooth.
- Touch a previously paired device.A Disconnect? pop-up displays.
- 3. Touch OK.

**Note:** Disconnections are done manually, but often occur automatically if the paired device is out of range of the device or the device is powered off.

# **Deleting a Paired Device (Unpair)**

Deleting a device from your Paired devices list removes its connection record. Once a device is unpaired, reconnection requires that you enter all the previous pairing information.

- Pair with the Bluetooth device from which you want to receive data. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 117.
  - A Bluetooth authorization request pop-up displays when a Bluetooth device sends data to your device.
- Select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive data. A File received message displays.

Note: Received data is saved to the Bluetooth folder. If you receive a contact, it is saved to your contacts automatically.

#### **VPN**

You can use your device's VPN (Virtual Private Network) feature to connect to VPNs.

Note: You must enable screen security before setting up a VPN. For information about screen security, see "Security" on page 142.

#### **Adding a VPN**

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
   Settings → More settings → VPN.
- Touch Basic VPN → Add VPN network to set up a connection to a VPN, using the following settings:
  - Name: Enter a name for the VPN connection.
  - Type: Choose the type of VPN.
  - Server address: Enter the IP address of the VPN server.
  - PPP encryption (MPPE): Touch to enable or disable encryption.
  - Show advanced options: Touch to show more options.
     Available options depend on the type of VPN you are adding.
- Touch Advanced IPsec VPN to use VPN Client to manage VPN connections

# **Tethering**

# **USB Tethering**

Use USB tethering to share your device's network connection with a computer that connects to your device via USB cable.

- Touch Mobile Broadband Connect to turn tethering On or Off.

Important! Tethering consumes battery power and increases your data usage. Roaming while using tethering will incur extra data charges.

# **Nearby Devices**

Share files with nearby devices using DLNA (Digital Living Network Alliance) standards, over Wi-Fi.

To share with nearby devices, you must connect to a Wi-Fi network. The devices you wish to share files with must also be connected to the same Wi-Fi network and must support DLNA.

Important! Use care when enabling file sharing for nearby devices. When enabled, other devices can access data on your device.

#### **Configuring File Sharing**

  - Shared contents: Choose the type of content to share, from Videos, Photos, or Music.
  - Device name: View or modify your device's name.

  - Not-allowed devices list: View and manage devices restricted from connecting to your device.
  - Download to: Choose a location to save downloaded content, from USB storage (device memory) or SD card.
  - Upload from other devices: Choose how to handle incoming files from other devices, from Always accept, Always ask, or Always reject.

# **Connecting as a Mass Storage Device**

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

**Note:** The file directory of the memory card displays as **Card** folder, separate from the internal memory, which is displayed as **Tablet** folder.

- Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Auto Play screen.
- Click the option to Open device to view files. You should see a Card and a Tablet folder.
- Copy files from the PC to the memory card (Card folder), or from the PC to the internal memory (Tablet folder).
- When finished, close the PC folder and disconnect the USB cable.

# **Memory Card**

Your device supports removable microSD $^{TM}$  or microSDHC $^{TM}$  memory cards for storing music, pictures, videos, and files.

Important! To prevent damage to data stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

# **Mounting and Unmounting a Memory Card**

  - Scan: Search for available Wi-Fi networks.
  - Wi-Fi Direct: Configure Wi-Fi Direct.

#### **Other Wi-Fi Settings**

- 2. Touch **Menu** for additional settings:
  - · Advanced:

- Auto-connect: When enabled, your device will automatically connect to known Wi-Fi networks when you launch a high datausage application, even if Wi-Fi is turned off. A known Wi-Fi network is one that you previously added.
- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to switch from Wi-Fi to mobile data for data communications, when the device goes to sleep (when the backlight goes out). This setting can affect your data usage, and the behavior of devices you connect to your device, such as when tethering or using Mobile Hotspot.
- Check for Internet service: Check for Wi-Fi Internet service when connected to a Wi-Fi access point.

- Object Exchange: OPP v1.0 profile allows sending and receiving of contact name cards (vCard 2.1) and calendar events (vCalendar) between devices. PBAP v1.2 supports exchange of Phone Book Objects.
- Human Interface Devices: HID v1.0 profile supports certain interface devices.
- Personal Area Network: PAN 1.0 supports exchange of data with other devices.

# **Application Manager**

You can download and install applications from the Google Play Store or S Suggest, or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your device. Use Application manager to manage applications on your device.

  - Reset app preferences: Resets all preferences for disabled apps, disabled app notifications, default applications for actions, and background data restrictions for apps. No app data will be affected.

#### **Personal**

#### **Location Services**

Location services control your device's use of GPS signals. Some apps may require one or more location services be turned On for full app functionality.

GPS signals may be affected by your surroundings, including:

- Buildings
- · Tunnels or underground structures
- Weather conditions
- · High-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- Tinted windows

Important! Verizon Wireless values your privacy. Because of this, your device is defaulted to only acquire your location when you dial 911. To use Location-Based Services, you must first enable location services on your device.

#### VZW Location Services

Enable or disable location service from Verizon Wireless.

**Note:** VZW location services must be enabled to use some applications.

Important! By selecting VZW location services, you are enabling Verizon Wireless and third-party authenticated and validated location services to access certain location information available through this device and/or the network.

#### **Standalone GPS Services**

Enable or disable location service from GPS satellites.

By selecting Standalone GPS services, you are allowing access to all location information by any third party through web access or any software or peripheral components you choose to install, download, add, or attach to the device or any other means. Enabling this functionality could pose certain risks to users of this device.

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Tab. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Tab. Read this information before using your mobile device.

# Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

## Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

# Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

## **Interphone Study**

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a

slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

## International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

## Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries. Additional information about MOBI-KIDS can be found at

## Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. #### **Cell Phone Industry Actions**

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

## Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

## **Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy**

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

#### **Hands-Free Kits**

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

## Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

#### **Children and Cell Phones**

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your wireless mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile device.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model mobile device are performed in positions and locations as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC SAR quidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. This mobile device

Maps, directions, and other navigation-data, including data relating to your current location, may contain inaccurate or incomplete data, and circumstances can and do change over time. In some areas, complete information may not be available. Therefore, you should always visually confirm that the navigational instructions are consistent with what you see

before following them. All users should pay attention to road conditions, closures, traffic, and all other factors that may impact safe driving or walking. Always obey posted road signs.

### **Emergency Communication**

GALAXY is not designed for use as a phone. However, like other internet-capable devices, Galaxy may support Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services. Such VoIP services should not be relied upon for essential communications (e.g., 911 emergency calls).

#### **Care and Maintenance**

Your mobile device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years:

#### Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

#### Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits

If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer,

because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion. Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

#### Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F.

#### Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

#### **Dust and Dirt**

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

#### Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

#### Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

#### Paint

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

## **Responsible Listening**

#### Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations.

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices).

Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential

hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.

- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you
  choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment,
  use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background
  environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise,
  noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music
  at lower volumes than when using earbuds.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss.
   Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
  experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or
  experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your
  portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

## **Operating Environment**

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

## Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives

#### **Implantable Medical Devices**

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:
- Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;

 Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your wireless mobile device with an implantable medical device, consult your health care provider.

#### **Other Medical Devices**

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your mobile device off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### **Vehicles**

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Although your mobile device is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

This device is capable of operating in 802.11a/n mode in 5 GHz. For 802.11a devices operating in the frequency range of 5.15 - 5.25 GHz, they are restricted for indoor operations to reduce any potential harmful interference for Mobile Satellite Services (MSS) in the US. Wi-Fi Access Points that are capable of allowing your device to operate in 802.11a/n mode (5.15 - 5.25 GHz band) are optimized for indoor use only. If your Wi-Fi network is capable of operating in this mode, please restrict your Wi-Fi use indoors to not violate federal regulations to protect Mobile Satellite Services.

## **Other Important Safety Information**

Only qualified personnel should service the mobile device. Faulty service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.

Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment used in your vehicle are securely mounted.

Check regularly that all wireless mobile device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.

When using a headset in dry environments, static electricity can build up in the headset and cause a small quick static electrical shock. To minimize the risk of electrostatic discharge from the headset avoid using the headset in

extremely dry environments or touch a grounded unpainted metal object to discharge static electricity before inserting the headset.

Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the mobile device, its parts, or accessories.

For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment near or in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Switch your mobile device off before boarding an aircraft. The use of wireless mobile devices in aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the aircraft's operation. Check with appropriate authorities before using any function of a mobile device while on an aircraft.

While using your device, leave some lights on in the room and do not hold the screen too close to your eyes.

Seizures or blackouts can occur when you are exposed to flashing lights while watching videos or playing games for extended periods. If you feel any discomfort, stop using the device immediately.

Reduce risk of repetitive motion injuries. When you repetitively perform actions, such as pressing keys, drawing characters on a touch screen with your fingers, or playing games, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, neck, shoulders, or other parts of your body. When using your device for extended periods, hold the device with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, and take frequent breaks. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.

### **Standard Limited Warranty**

#### What is covered and for how long?

#### What is not covered?

This Limited Warranty is conditioned upon proper use of Product by Purchaser.

This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abnormal use, abnormal conditions, improper storage, exposure to liquid, moisture. dampness, sand or dirt, neglect, or unusual physical, electrical or electromechanical stress; (b) scratches, dents and cosmetic damage, unless caused by SAMSUNG: (c) defects or damage resulting from excessive force or use of a metallic object when pressing on a touch screen; (d) equipment that has the serial number or the enhancement data code removed, defaced, damaged, altered or made illegible; (e) ordinary wear and tear; (f) defects or damage resulting from the use of Product in conjunction or connection with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG: (a) defects or damage resulting from improper testing, operation, maintenance, installation, service, or adjustment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (h) defects or damage resulting from external causes such as collision with an object, fire, flooding, dirt, windstorm, lightning, earthquake, exposure to weather conditions, theft, blown fuse, or improper use of any electrical source:

#### What are the limits on SAMSUNG's liability?

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Nothing in the Product instructions or information shall be construed to create an express warranty of any kind with respect to the Products. No agent, employee, dealer, representative or reseller is authorized to modify or extend this Limited Warranty or to make binding representations or claims, whether in advertising, presentations or otherwise, on behalf of SAMSUNG regarding the Products or this Limited Warranty.

This Limited Warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights that vary from state to state.

#### What is the procedure for resolving disputes?

ALL DISPUTES WITH SAMSUNG ARISING IN ANY WAY FROM THIS LIMITED WARRANTY OR THE SALE, CONDITION OR PERFORMANCE OF THE PRODUCTS SHALL BE RESOLVED EXCLUSIVELY THROUGH FINAL AND BINDING ARBITRATION, AND NOT BY A COURT OR JURY. Any such dispute shall not be combined or consolidated with a dispute involving any other person's or entity's Product or claim, and specifically, without limitation of the foregoing, shall not under any circumstances proceed as part of a class action.

The arbitration shall be conducted before a single arbitrator, whose award may not exceed, in form or amount, the relief allowed by the applicable law. The arbitration shall be conducted according to the American Arbitration Association (AAA) Commercial Arbitration Rules applicable to consumer disputes. This arbitration provision is entered pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act. The laws of the State of Texas, without reference to its choice of laws principles, shall govern the interpretation of the Limited Warranty and all disputes that are subject to this arbitration provision. The

arbitrator shall decide all issues of interpretation and application of this arbitration provision and the Limited Warranty.

For any arbitration in which your total damage claims. exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, are \$5,000.00 or less ("Small Claim"), the arbitrator may, if you prevail, award your reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs as part of any award, but may not grant SAMSUNG its attorney fees, expert witness fees or costs unless it is determined that the claim was brought in bad faith. In a Small Claim case, you shall be required to pay no more than half of the total administrative, facility and arbitrator fees, or \$50.00 of such fees, whichever is less, and SAMSUNG shall pay the remainder of such fees. Administrative, facility and arbitrator fees for arbitrations in which your total damage claims, exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, exceed \$5,000.00 ("Large Claim") shall be determined according to AAA rules. You must include in the opt out e-mail (a) your name and address; (b) the date on which the Product was purchased; (c) the Product model name or model number; and (d) the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number, as applicable, if you have it (the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number can be found (i) on the Product box; (ii) on the Product information screen, which can be found under "Settings:" (iii) on a label on the back of the Product beneath the battery, if the battery is removable; and (iv) on the outside of the Product if the battery is not removable). Alternatively, you may opt out by calling 1-888-987-4357 no later than 30 calendar days from the date of the first consumer purchaser's purchase of the Product and providing the same information. These are the only two forms of notice that will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting

out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the benefits of the Limited Warranty.

Severability

If any portion of this Limited Warranty is held to be illegal or unenforceable, such partial illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of the Limited Warranty.

#### **Precautions for Transfer and Disposal**

If data stored on this device is deleted or reformatted using the standard methods, the data only appears to be removed on a superficial level, and it may be possible for someone to retrieve and reuse the data by means of special software.

To avoid unintended information leaks and other problems of this sort, it is recommended that the device be returned to Samsung's Customer Care Center for an Extended File System (EFS) Clear which will eliminate all user memory and return all settings to default settings.
