

Accumulation of Excess Credits


- Time to Degree is too Long

The following data serves as baseline data for the Complete College America Metro Momentum Pathways Project. This data is not presented as a means of comparing the Southern Nevada institutions against each other.




# Why Do Students Get Off Track?

- Never on a "track" to begin with
- Academic advising not required for all
- Catalogs are difficult to comprehend
- Do not understand course pre-requisites
- Do not understand course sequencing
- Students withdrawal or fail courses
- Required courses are not available at right time
- Students change majors (multiple times)
- Students do not have a connection on campus or have little engagement





## First Term Units Taken and Units Passed At C-




#### Percent of Units Passed at C- – Full and Part Time






Take Away – First Steps students are enrolling in more credits and passing at about the same rate as Non-First Steps students

Take Away – Both part time and full time students are enrolling in Math and English sooner


## Fall-to-Fall Persistence



Take Away – Both part time and full time First Steps students have higher fall-to-fall persistence rates.

Take Away – First Steps students appear to be graduating at a higher rate.
Though, the data available is still early at this point


# Grad Rate (within 150% time) – Pell Students

helping to close the achievement gap between Pell and Non-Pell students.


# Grad Rate (within 150% time) – Ethnicity

After Three Years, The Percentage of Students That Have Graduated, Transferred Out, or Are Still Enrolled



  - Require Academic Advising
  - Require Career Exploration (FSE, career assessments, etc.)
  - Require Math & English Enrollment in 1st Semester & Continuous Enrollment Until Gateway Math & English is Completed
- Before 15 Credits are Accumulated—Student Declares Actual Major & is on Pathway to Completion
