Media Team

Many great ideas came forth in the first meeting on 2/22/21. Look for letters to the editor, guest articles, website publications about current legislation, how our elections work and how to get involved in election processes, recognizing mis/disinformation and where to find reliable sources, the importance of a "free press" and civil discourse, and more.

Three specific projects were proposed:

- 1. Creating a FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) space on our website addressing local and state elected positions, democratic tools like the filibuster, recall elections, initiatives vs referendums and more.
- 2. Engaging voters in the election process beyond voting (poll working, ballot processing) and ensuring voters' rights and the security of the election process.
- 3. Public service announcements or letters for current issues (individually or with LWVVC signature if falls under League positions) VC Star published Pat Butler's letter "The Facts about Vaccinations" on Feb 27 https://www.vcstar.com/story/opinion/readers/2021/02/26/letter-facts-vaccinations/6836796002/

Climate Change Task Force

Wayne Morgan reviewed the LWVUS, LWVC and municipal positions concerning Climate Change and several areas that might be relevant to Ventura County: green infrastructure (planting trees in urban areas); Clean Power Alliance (moving towards 100% renewable energy sources); electrification of buildings as well as the transportation sector (EVs); sea level rise; healthy soils, forests and wildfire risks. Members will research how climate change is covered in current school curriculum; aspects of climate change (slow it down urgently) and climate resiliency (future needs), including roles of oil and utility companies; finding reliable, evidence-based sources for educating the public; current and future climate change legislation.

Civics Education

Committee members presented many ideas for improving civics knowledge of the public, with a focus on high school and elementary ages.

 Case Studies Project workshop presented by LWV of Greenwich, CT, and Harvard Business Professor David Moss (free & Virtual) directed towards high school Social Studies teachers interested in using case studies and original sources in teaching civics.



- 2. Civics education collaboration project with Simi Valley Girl Scouts troop for peer-to-peer education and merit badge award.
- 3. Essay contest focusing on some aspect of civics education, offering a financial award or scholarship to high school winner(s) and another form of recognition for middle school winner(s). The opportunity to collaborate with other community organizations will be pursued.

4. Development of FAQs on LWVVC website to educate the public on civics, government, elections, recall process, filibuster, etc.

March finds our Scholarship Committee busy working with Ventura County Colleges to select scholarship recipients. Each year our Scholarship Fund provides \$2,000 to one or two community college students who have an interest in pursuing a four-year degree in government, political science, or history. Legislative Interviews

The local Leagues from Los Angeles, Ventura County, Santa Barbara County, Santa Maria, and San Luis Obispo County collaborated for legislative interviews of our state representatives - State Sen. Henry Stern (SD 27), State Sen. Monique Limón (SD 19), Assemblyman Steve Bennett (AD 37), Congressman Salud Carbajal (CD 24), and Assemblywoman Jacqui Irwin (AD 44) in January. We interviewed Congresswoman Julia Brownley (CD 26) on Feb 3rd. We will continue to try to set up an interview with Congressman Mike Garcia (CD 25).

We were tasked with asking 3 questions formulated by the state League (LWVC) which were on the following topics:

- Climate Change and Land Use
- · Housing and Homelessness Zoning and Affordability
- Equitable Post-COVID-19 Economic Recovery
- Local issue question
- Personal Legislative Priorities

We will share the conversations once the reports are finalized and the interviews completed.

EFFECTIVE CALLS TO LEGISLATORS

Phone calls are the most effective form of communicating with your members of Congress because phone calls can't be ignored.

You have two senators and one representative. To find out who they are and how to contact them, use Google, text your zip code to 520-200-2223, or check the EXTREMELY comprehensive https://contactingcongress.org/.



Each member of Congress has a DC office as well as one or more local offices instate. If you have time, call both! If you can only call one, call the office most local to you first. If no one is answering, then call the DC office.

Save their numbers in your phone—two numbers each, both the local office and the DC office.

When you call, they will probably ask you for zip code and possibly your address, to make sure you are a constituent, so be ready to give those.

Ask for specific things like "vote for the XYZ Bill". It's helpful to have a script prepared by you or by an organized group.

Keep it short. You don't need to tell the staffer why you support or oppose something, just that you support or oppose it. They are just creating a tally of how many people took which position; they won't pass your convictions or supporting arguments along to your member of Congress.

Be courteous and polite.

COVID VACCINE UPDATES – Ventura County

Ventura County has expanded the number of locations and the number of appointments available for first and second doses of COVID-19 vaccinations. There is information about the vaccine phases and who is included in each. **Sign up for vaccinations** here. Subscribe to be notified when appointments are available. Community members who are eligible to be vaccinated but who have limited computer/internet access may call the phone registration line at **805-477-7161**. The phone line is open Monday through Friday 8:30-5:00. **Second doses are being offered** here-d2/.

Vaccine Phase Expanding March 1 - The County of Ventura will begin vaccinating teachers and childcare providers, first responders and food and agricultural workers who are eligible under the State's Phase 1B as supply allows March 1.
