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MAY DEVOTION

“Bring flowers of the rarest, bring flowers of the fairest..”



If you grew up in the Catholic Church, these words evoke precious memories of the yearly crowning of Mary, a joyous event held by school children to honor our Blessed Mother as the queen of heaven and earth. Each year, during the month of May, students would gather to participate in a ceremony of songs, prayers and flowers dedicated to her honor.

As the mother of God’s son, Mary was the perfect follower of Christ. She faithfully consented to God’s plan, listened to God’s Word and kept it in her heart. At the May crowning, Mary would receive our childhood prayers and flowers with the joy of a mother’s love, and we in turn would rejoice in God’s extraordinary plan in which he not only desired to come to us through a mother, but also gave us His mother to call our own.

At Saint Matthew School, we continue this time-honored tradition in the endearing ceremony of May Devotion. CLASS UPDATES

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8TH GRADE TRIP TO WASHINGTON, D.C.

Our 8th graders had an amazing, action-packed trip to Washington, D.C. in April. Some of the highlights included visiting Monticello (home of Thomas Jefferson), Mount Vernon (home of George Washington), the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, the Holocaust Museum, Lincoln Memorial, Arlington Cemetery and so much more. What a great way to experience the past, present and future of our government!

7TH GRADE — REFUGEE SIMULATION

Our middle school students participated in a refugee simulation that was orchestrated by Catholic Relief Services. During this simulation, the 7th and 8th grade students were grouped into families. Each family walked in the footsteps of a refugee family. Each journey is comprised of actual dilemmas, just as refugees find in real life. There were tasks at different stations that each family had to complete in order to become US Citizens. Stations included the border crossing, registration, school, health/medical center, nutrition, jail, and UNHCR (United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees). Only three families out of about 21 were able to complete the steps and become citizens. Through this simulation, the students learned to cooperate, negotiate, share and better understand refugees and begin to empathize with their situations. Students also learned that refugees have to move to save the lives of themselves and their family members, whereas immigrants choose to move to improve things for themselves and their families.



6TH GRADE — BUSINESS FAIR

2019 marked the 16th year of Business Fair. It started as a way for 6th graders to learn some of the challenges and rewards of starting their own businesses while making money for our sister parish in Haiti and The Ronald McDonald House. We have had some very creative items in the business fair — everything from scarves and t-shirts to marshmallow blasters and stress balls. Students are required to make their own items, calculate the cost of the item and market the item. This year we profited almost \$3,000 for our charities.



4TH GRADE — LIVING STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The 4th grade students created a live reenactment of Stations of the Cross. The students wrote the prayers and reflections that accompanied each station, and did a beautiful job narrating what we were seeing in each one. They painted a powerful and moving live picture for us to reflect upon on Holy Thursday.



2ND GRADE — BIOGRAPHY DAY

Biography Reports are a super fun way to get Saint Matthew 2nd graders engaged in reading and learning about someone they'd like to know more about. The students write a paper and give an oral report dressed in costume from their book. It's always a huge hit and one of the traditions we look forward to the most.



K & 1ST GRADE — DR. SEUSS DAY & 120TH DAY OF SCHOOL

"I know it is wet and the sun is not sunny, but we can have lots of good fun that is funny." —Dr. Seuss. Kindergarten and 1st grade celebrated Dr. Seuss' birthday which was remembered on "Read Across America Day." All the students thoroughly enjoyed having guest readers come to their classrooms throughout the day. This year, it happened to fall on the 120th day of school, when the first graders created Superhero Capes with 120 items on them!

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

This year, Confirmation was held at St. Matthew Church on February 24th. That day was the culmination of many hours spent learning, praying, reflecting and serving. Service was completed in the categories of Community, Parish, Spiritual and Family. Some of the service hours students completed as a group were cleaning at Camp Marymount, serving the homeless at Room in the Inn, working Summer Games for Special Olympics and leading at Service Day and the Floating Rosary. In addition, they were involved in ministry to our Pre-K students and the elderly at The Lodge. These students truly showed their commitment to growing in grace, spirituality and sharing their gifts with others.

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MATHLETES 2018-2019

Mathletes is a club for students in 6th-8th grade. Students gather twice a month to practice their problem solving skills. Mathletes participate in numerous math competitions throughout the year including, Father Ryan Math Day, Catholic Math League, and AMC 8, sponsored by the MAA. Mathletes are also members of the National Math Club sponsored by Mathcounts in which we have achieved silver and gold level status since 2010.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

Science Olympiad is a national program and extracurricular activity that culminates with a competition consisting of 23 events. The Science Olympiad team may have up to 15 members that work in teams of 3 or 4 to prepare and compete together. Students met to work on their events every Tuesday after school and at home on the weekends from October to March. 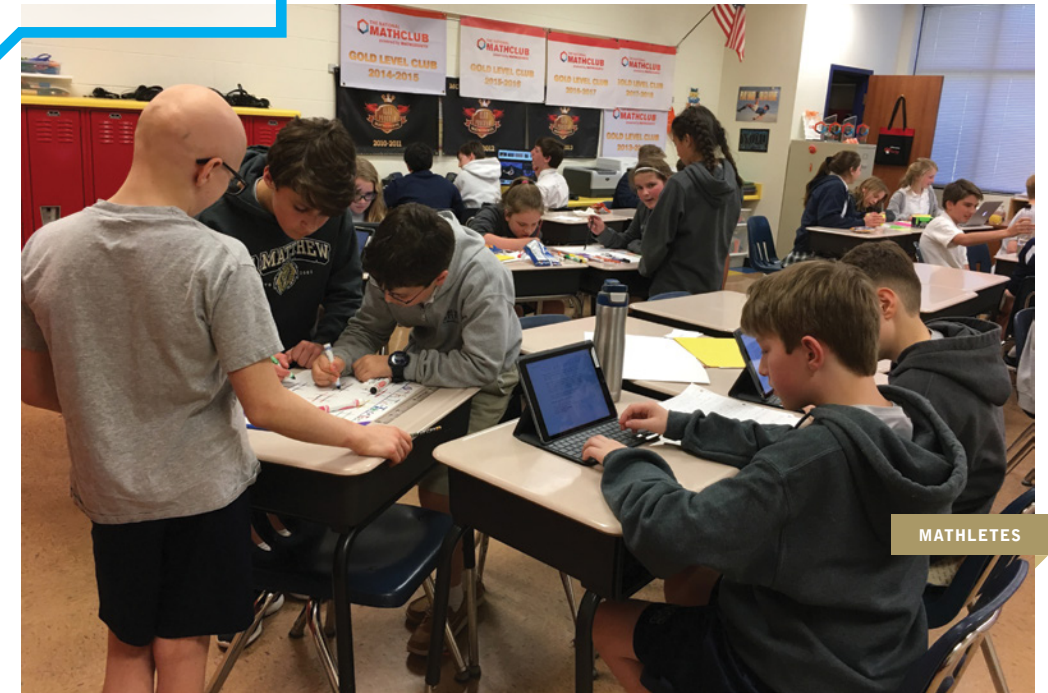
MODEL U.N.

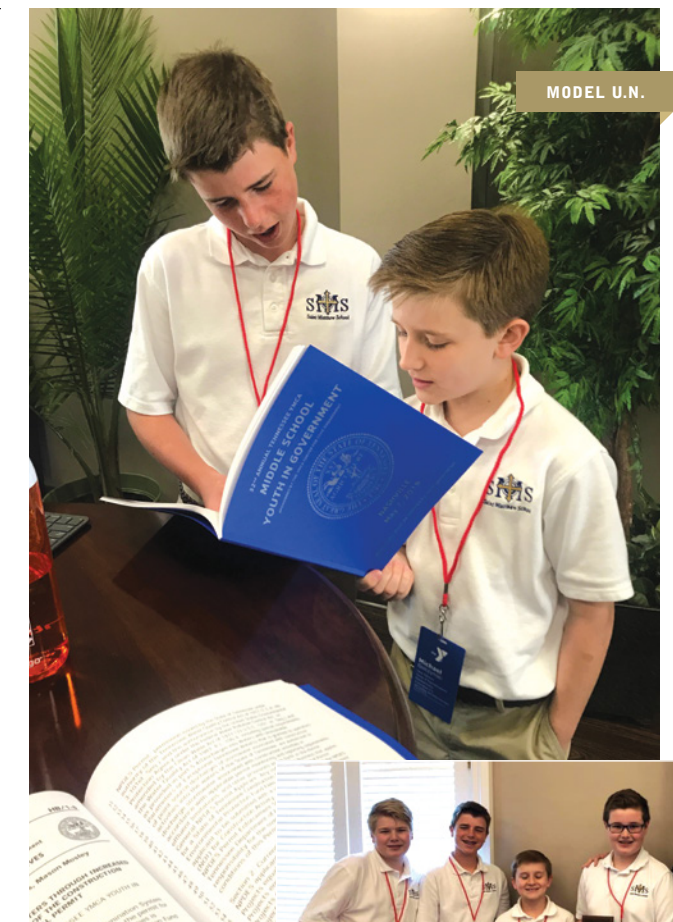

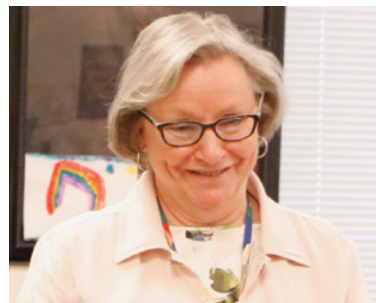


Heather Maguire

Extended Care allows children from different age groups to come together for a couple of hours and play with people they do not normally hang out with during the school day. This time also allows Josh to get to know each child better, to make aftercare a more enjoyable experience. During the summer, Josh runs the SMS weekly camp programs. When not at Saint Matthew, you can find Josh outdoors playing soccer, basketball, kayaking and spending time with friends.

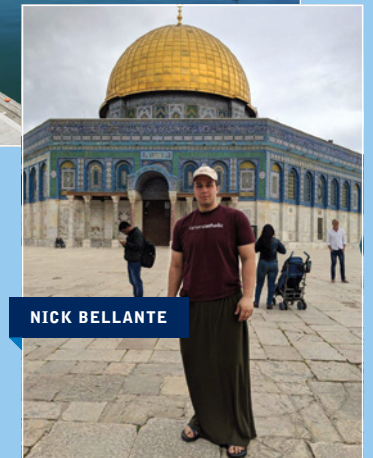
