


{WIGL Baby Shower}



MINUTES OF SESSION HAMBURG PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FEBRUARY 12, 2018

The Rev. Rachel Brown, Moderator, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. A quorum was present. The agenda was approved as presented. Elders in attendance were: Gary Lauchert, Leanne Howe, Craig Schmittendorf, Terri Vogler, Jim Beatty, Joyce Huen, Sandy Stearns, Christel Beers, Carole Mitchell, Kris McGuire, and Cheryl Koelmel, Clerk. Guests: Deacon Moderator Katy Webster and Treasurer Jeff Leyonmark.

Pastor Rachel opened the meeting with prayer and Terri Vogler presented her devotions which was an inspirational email received from a colleague.

SESSION MINUTES:

The Session Minutes of January 8, 2018 were approved as written.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Rachel attended the Presbytery Pastoral Retreat at the Clarion Hotel in Dunkirk from February 5-8, 2018. One topic was about pastor's stepping back and being less involved in pastoral care and meetings, and working on stress control.

As Chair of Council at Presbytery, and since the Sabbath at Presbytery, she is spending a lot of time with Presbytery meetings and concerns.

Home visits were made to Betty Lynn Griffin and Tom Rivers.

Pastor Rachel will be on vacation in Baltimore from March 7-9th.

Pastor Rachel and the committee have been working on the Women's Retreat which will be held on Sunday, March 4 following worship.

CLERK'S REPORT:

Craig Schmittendorf, Chair of Building and Grounds requested an email vote to allow the Hamburg Nursery School to use Fellowship Hall for an activity on February 8, 2018. Seven yes votes were received.

Jim Beatty was installed as an elder at worship on Sunday, January 28, 2018.

Shawn Ferro asked that the new Planning Calendar be circulated to the Team Chairs to complete and return to him.

On Sunday, February 25, 2018 Craig will present the Moment for Team Ministry during the worship service.

DEACON'S REPORT:

Katy Webster reported that she now has three new Deacons...Zak Nelson, Elyse Perry, and Cheryl Weyand. During Sunday School the children made Valentines and they were distributed by the deacons to our homebound members. Deacon meeting minutes were received.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The financial report for the month of January 2018 was presented. Jeff Leyonmark, Treasurer, reviewed highlights of the month.

COMM. TO PRESBYTERY REPORT:

The Presbytery Meeting on January 20, 2018 was held at Wayside Presbyterian. Pastor Rachel, Cally & August Miklasz, and Cheryl Koelmel attended. One main issue of the meeting that was discussed by the Trustee Craig Miler was regarding per capita. As most churches do not remit the entire per capita based on active church membership, Presbytery must remit to Synod and General Assembly, the full amount due for each church, therefore churches have the responsibility to review their active membership register.

Cheryl reported that as of today's date, approximately 80 members of the 217 on record have paid their \$31.00 (or more) per capita. Of the \$3497.00 budgeted for 2018, we have received \$2990.00.

Cheryl is still searching for two Commissioners to Presbytery. She will put an article in the Town & Basin and several Sunday bulletins.

MINISTRY TEAMS REQUIRING ACTION:

Written reports were received from the following ministry teams: Hospitality, Worship & Music, Personnel, Presbyterian Women, Building & Grounds, and Mission.

Personnel......Gary Lauchert, Chair present a **MOTION** from committee to dismiss the current sexton as of February 28, 2018. At 8:01 p.m. the elders went into Executive Session. The Executive Session ended at 8:15 p.m. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

MINISTRY TEAMS REQUIRING ACTION (CONT'D):

Building & Grounds.....Craig Schmittendorf presented the following two motions:

The Building & Grounds committee is asking session to approve our request for \$1,600.00 from our savings account, to be used to replaced the old metal chairs in Fellowship Hall with 80 new, heavy duty plastic chairs from BJ's. The **MOTION** was seconded and passed.

The Building & Grounds committee is asking session to approve our request for \$2,482.00 from our savings account to be used to complete the electrical upgrade in the church. The work will be completed by Simoncelli Electric and is the third of three phases we had outlined in 2017, which will include the supply and install of 70 - 4' LED Lamps in the lounge, copy room, office, restrooms, chapel, foyer and kitchen and also upgrading the four recessed lights near the elevator to LED bulbs. The **MOTION** was seconded and passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Joyce Huen and Sandy Stearns had questions regarding the changes to the July-June new elder/deacon terms. Kris McGuire stated that she and Shawn Ferro are currently working out details regarding shorter/longer terms and starting the nominating process for this July.

NEW BUSINESS:

The 2018 Elder Training will be Monday, February 26 from 6-8:00 p.m. Dinner will be provided.

The following **MOTION** was made to designate the Corporation Officers for 2018: Jim Beatty, President, Craig

Schmittendorf, Vice-President, Jeff Leyonmark, Treasurer, and Cheryl Koelmel, Secretary. The motion was seconded and passed.

DISCUSSION:

Craig gave an update on the recent repairs to the boiler.

Sandy advised the Health Department encourages wearing gloves when preparing and serving food, i.e. Coffee Hour, Harvest Dinner, Annual Meeting Luncheon, etc.

Names of members who are ill, in the hospital, in rehab and at home, were lifted up in prayer.

Joyce Huen circulated the communion sign-up sheet.

Sandy Stearns volunteered to do devotions at the March meeting.

The **Sacrament of Holy Communion** was celebrated on February 4, 2018 at the 10:30 a.m. worship service.

The next **Sacrament of Holy Communion** will be at the Ash Wednesday service on February 14, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. and March 4, 2018 at the 10:30 a.m. worship service.

The next scheduled Session meeting is Monday, March 12, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

Pastor Rachel closed the meeting with prayer at 9:04 p.m.
