Pastor's IN THE GOOD OLD SUMMER TIME Growing up in the city of Chicago, summer really didn't begin for me until school was out in the later part of June through Labor Day. I can still remember playing games like hopscotch drawn on the sidewalk

with chalk or with a rock. Jumping rope, single or double dutch, was another pastime, though I never got the hang of double dutch. Sitting on the front porch with friends listening to the radio and singing along was something we all did in those days and the memories go on and on.

As we all live in the Chicago land area, we can truly appreciate all four seasons of the year. We don't talk about the weather, because as soon as we complain about it - it changes. Each season brings with it specific holy days and holidays, too. Not everyone in the world has this kind of 4 season experience.

When I think of seasons, I automatically think of the passage in Ecclesiastes 3:1 "To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven." When I first heard this, it was a song sung by the group "The Byrds" titled "Turn, Turn, Turn". Little did any of us know then that we were singing Scripture verses. The song was originally written by Pete Seeger in the late 1950's but didn't become popular until the Byrds sang it in 1965. Seeger's version ends the song "a time for peace, I swear it's not too late." It is a plea for world peace which is still relevant today.

As a Pastor, I have read this passage at many a funeral because it's speaks of the full spectrum of a person's life. In reality, the full passage of Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 is a passage that does us all good to appreciate and understand during our lifetime. I invite you to read and ponder the meanings behind what is written in this passage.

As we all celebrate this wonderful summer season - may we remember "that school is out, but church is still in session".
