## County Board approves bikeway plan

The Washington County Board approved the County Bikeway and Trail Network Plan during its June 12 meeting.

At the start of discussion, County Administrator Joshua Schoemann said "this is just a plan, there isn't any spending."

The plan was prepared by Toole Design of Madison, Public Policy Consultant Kit Keller of Cedarburg, the Southeast Regional Plan Commission and the Washington County Parks and Planning Department. The County Board authorized the Parks and Planning Department to apply for a state Department of Transportation (DOT) grant of up to \$90,000 to hire a consultant to develop a countywide bicycle and pedestrian plan. The plan included input from the Bike and Pedestrian Plan Advisory Committee that included representatives from towns and municipalities across the county.

"The Washington County Bikeway and Trail Network Plan (the Plan) was developed to help guide the County as it makes investments in bikeways and trails across the County for a wide variety of people—from school children to casual adult bicyclists to avid road cyclists. The centerpiece of the Plan are seven high-priority, "all ages and abilities" bikeway and trail corridors that will connect all of the incorporated cities and villages in the County. The Plan will be used as a guide to

implement bikeways and trails over the next 30 to 40 years," the written report states in the introduction. "The intent of this Plan is to give individual communities and the County a comprehensive map of future bikeways and trails, as well as proposed policy and program actions that will help the planned trails and bikeways come to fruition."

The report adds that "increasing bicycling and walking opportunities can improve the health and safety, quality of life, economic growth, and economic and social accessibility of Washington County and its citizens. The cost of building bikeways and trails is also relatively modest when compared to other types of transportation or recreation investments."

The report states that the planning team and county staff chose seven "priority corridors" out of the further bikeway and trail network for more study and guidance. The corridors are:

- Jackson to Germantown via Eisenbahn State Trail Extension;
- West Bend to Jackson via Jackson Drive or CTH P;
- West Bend to Newburg via Decorah Road and Milwaukee River Path;
- West Bend to Slinger via Ridge Run Park and CTH NN;
- Holy Hill Road-Freistadt Road;
- Germantown to Bugline Trail via I-41

## NASCAR Truck Champion Sauter set for return to Slinger Nationals

Johnny Sauter, the 2016 NASCAR Truck Series Champion, will return to Slinger Super Speedway, Tuesday night, July 9, for the 40th annual SUPERSEAL Slinger Nationals presented by Miller Lite.

The Necedah, Wisconsin native has over 500 starts in NASCAR's three National Touring Series and relocated back to his home state a couple of years ago. And with that move, Sauter has taken the opportunity to return to his short-track roots, with his own equipment, when his schedule allows.

"Growing up as a Wisconsin kid, I remember going to the Slinger Nationals and thinking to myself that it'd be pretty cool to win that someday," said Sauter. "It's one of the premier events in the entire Midwest, so I better get my butt in gear and make it happen."

Sauter has one Truck Series victory to his credit in

2019 and in doing so, punched his ticket for a spot in the NASCAR Truck Series Playoffs. The win was Sauter's 24th career Truck Series win. This year's Slinger Nationals start will be the third of his career.

"We haven't had much luck at the Nationals," said Sauter. "In two previous starts I've broken a lower control arm and had a flat tire with 20 laps to go. Having said that, they were both subpar performances up to that point. I'm bringing a brand-new car and I've got a really good idea of where I need to be," said Sauter.

The list of previous Nationals winners includes former and current NASCAR standouts, Alan Kulwicki; Mark Martin; Dick Trickle (4 wins); Rich Bickle, Jr (4 wins); Matt Kenseth (7 wins) and Kyle Busch. The last two years, barnstorming national super late model standouts, Ty Majeski and Bubba Pollard have captured

the Slinger Nationals top laurels. Matt Kenseth; Bickle, Jr; Majeski and Pollard have all committed to competing in the 2019 Nationals event.

Advanced sale tickets for the 40th annual Slinger Nationals are available, now, at the speedway office or by visiting [www.slingersuperspeedway.com](http://www.slingersuperspeedway.com). Tickets are also available for a VIP Meet and Greet Autograph session featuring Kenseth; NASCAR Cup Series rookie Daniel Hemric; Sauter and other top drivers, the night of the Slinger Nationals.

Late models will also compete in a full race program on July 9. A rain date of July 10 has been established.

The Hawks then split games at the Wisconsin Amateur Baseball Association Town Ball tournament on June 22-23. ## Stay cool this summer while limiting energy consumption

For many homeowners, summer is all about staying cool. But that comfort comes with a hefty price tag. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, air conditioners cost homeowners more than \$29 billion a year in energy costs. While that's often money well spent, there are ways to stay cool this summer while simultaneously limiting energy consumption.

Air conditioners are a necessity in areas where temperatures rise to uncomfortable and often unhealthy levels in the summertime. But employing air conditioners is not the only way for homeowners to keep their homes cool during the dog days of summer.

- Embrace strategic landscaping. The landscaping outside of a home can contribute to cooler climates inside the

home. Deciduous trees shed their leaves annually, and when planted on the western and southern sides of a home, these trees can block the sun from entering the home during the hottest times of day, reducing the need to lower the thermostat on air conditioners. Of course, when these trees shed their leaves in late fall, sunlight can then make its way into the home, potentially reducing heating costs.

- Maintain air conditioners. Air conditioners contain air filters that, over time, can wear down and become dirty. The DOE notes that the relatively simple task of replacing and cleaning these air filters can reduce air conditioners' energy consumption by as much as 15 percent. If the unit does not respond after routine filter maintenance, the DOE

(energy.gov) lists issues with refrigerant, thermostat sensors and drainage as some common air conditioner problems. Homeowners who suspect these issues can contact certified professionals to inspect their units and perform any necessary repairs.

- Install ceiling fans. Cool people in a given room by installing ceiling fans in areas of the home that might be warm but not too hot during the summertime. Modern ceiling fans with the ENERGY STAR® logo can be as much as 75 percent more efficient than older models, and ceiling fans typically consume far less energy than air conditioners. Install fans that can rotate forward and in reverse, as the direction the fan is rotating can actually heat or cool a room. Consult the owner's manual to determine which

direction fans should be rotating in on hot and cold days.

- Draw the blinds or close the drapes on especially hot days. Drawing blinds and closing drapes can keep the sun out of the home, lowering temperatures inside as a result. While many homeowners understandably do not want their homes to be dark all day long, on especially hot days when the summer is bearing down, drawing the blinds or closing the drapes can have a substantial impact on comfort levels inside the home.

Pedestrian Overpass; and

- Pike Lake Unit to Heritage Trails Park to Loew Lake Unit.

The report offers recommendations for those seven priority corridors.

Supervisor Mark McCune cited a portion of the plan along Hwy. 164, which is undergoing construction, and asked if county officials talked with the state DOT regarding their plans? Debora Sielski, Deputy Parks and Planning Administrator, said Toole Design staff met with DOT officials regarding current and future road projects by the agency.

Another supervisor asked if there are

future fiscal expenditure commitments due to the adoption of the plan.

"Of course, yes," Sielski said. She said the estimated costs are identified at the back of the report.

"We're looking at this plan as a guide for the county as well as our local governments for planning purposes," she said.

Sielski added the future steps include on a strategic action plan to narrow the focus of what the county plans wants to implement. From there, additional engineering studies will be done and the county will work with willing land owners to implement the plan. She added those items will have to go through the

County Board for approval before they move forward.

The board approved the plan by a 25-1 vote.
