HEADWAY PRESENTS "FOR YOUR INSPIRATION"

As part of our annual meeting and regular speaker series, Headway is excited to sponsor "For Your Inspiration", presentations by Sammy Violante and Dr. Kenneth Sroka. Both of these speakers are notable in their respective fields for their accomplishments and for the obstacles they have overcome.

Sammy Violante is an inspirational speaker who has presented over a thousand talks to various groups. His talk "An Eagle Only Soars When It Flies Against the Wind" draws on his personal experience overcoming adversity. Once an investment broker managing funds worth millions of dollars, his career was cut short as he began to battle major mental health issues. He has been able to participate proactively in his own recovery, and he says, "I'd love to tell you how I did it." His talk will discuss some real life tools to use to keep moving forward, and to transform adversity into passion and happiness. Sammy has given over 1200 presentations to hundreds of organizations, and hopes to bring this inspiration to Headway and its members.

Dr. Kenneth Sroka is retired from Canisus College where he was a professor of English for over 41 years. He is now a volunteer with the ECMC Reading clubs, set up through Dr. Lisa Keenan in the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine. The Reading Clubs are support groups that use the title "The Power and Pleasure of Shaping Verbal Worlds", also the title of Dr. Sroka's presentation at Headway. He runs a Reading Club for acquired brain injury survivors and one for chronic pain sufferers. Participants read and discuss a wide variety of short stories, essays and poems. The clubs have served as inspiration for a number of participants in the past year, and Dr. Sroka is pleased to share with Headway members what they have learned and how this has helped.

The presentation will be Monday November 18, from 5:30–7:30 PM at the United Way Headquarters at 742 Delaware Ave. in Buffalo, NY. There will be a brief presentation with Headway's annual report and membership meeting at the beginning of the evening. Light refreshments will be served. There is free parking in the lot at the rear of the building.

HEADWAY WORKS TO FIND SERVICE ALTERNATIVES

On August 6th, it was announced that Phoenix Frontier Inc., a long time nonprofit agency in Western New York, made the decision to file for bankruptcy protection. Among other consequences, this meant that alternative service providers were needed for 51 people who were receiving services through Phoenix under the DOH TBI waiver program. Headway waiver staff worked very hard that week to help link those people with other service providers and make sure that there was not any significant interruption in their services.

Rhonda Frederick, COO at People Inc., the agency with which Headway is affiliated, said that the ability for various agencies to take over this program and others so quickly was impressive. "I think the folks who need the services are going to get what they need," she said.

A big thank you to our entire TBI waiver staff for their hard work!

"My name is Rebecca Rake and I am a Health and Human Services major at University at Buffalo. I am currently in my senior year working towards becoming a healthcare administrator. Over the course of the Fall 2013 semester I will be doing my internship which will entail helping with the Nursing Home Transition and Diversion Medicaid Waiver as well as the Traumatic Brain Injury Medicaid Waiver. So far, I have learned how Headway is working with Medicaid and various service providers to keep those in need out of nursing homes and in the community. This experience is helping me apply what I learn in my classes at UB to the real world and guiding me in the right direction for my future career."

HEADWAY VETERANS PROGRAM UNDERWAY

As mentioned in the last edition of this newsletter, Headway is excited to announce a new outreach program for veterans with traumatic brain injury, developed in collaboration with the Serve New York AmeriCorps VISTA program. In that position, Sarah DePerrior has recently begun work as Headway's Veterans outreach specialist.

Sarah is a 2013 graduate of the University of Rochester, where she majored in public health and minored in biology. Sarah grew up in Rochester and is a lifelong resident of Western New York. She is serving as a member of the Serve New York AmeriCorps VISTA program administered by the Service Collaborative of Western New York. This is a program which places members at partner organizations in the community for year-long terms of service. One of the key focuses for the Service Collaborative is services for veterans and their families.

Sarah has been working since July to learn more about the community organizations that provide services for veterans and how Headway can work with them in order to meet the needs of veterans with traumatic brain injury and other co-occurring conditions, including post-traumatic stress disorder. This has included attending community meetings for veterans' organizations, visiting the Veterans One-Stop Center and Buffalo VA Hospital, and tabling at Veterans Fairs. Sarah is working to create a "Veterans Brain Injury Resource Guide," which will be modeled after Headway's existing "Resource Guide for Brain Injury."

Overall, with this project, Headway seeks to help veterans with TBI and their families find the supports they need and overcome obstacles to engaging in their communities. SENIORS! ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR ADDITIONAL BENEFITS?

Here are some of the lesser known additional benefits some WNY seniors, and also some with handicaps/disabilities may be eligible for:

Complimentary Card for reduced Metro Fare: Erie County residents 65+ are eligible. Call Erie County Social Services at 858-8526 for more information.

Property Tax Exemption: Real estate owners 65+ with gross income limit of \$37,399. In Buffalo call 851-4374, application dates July 1 to Dec. 1. All others contact local city or township for dates and rates.

Subsidized Housing: If you are 62+ or handicapped/disabled, with low income of \$22,250 for single or \$25,400 for a couple, you may be eligible for rental assistance or subsidized housing. Erie County residents call Rental Assistance Corp at 882-0063 or Belmont Housing Resources at 884-7791. For an Independent Senior Citizens Housing list call Senior Services at 858-8526.

AARP Driver Safety Program is for NYS residents 50+ who have a valid NYS driver's license. Taking the course will provide a 10% reduction in base rate of parts of insurance premium; active point total will be reduced up to 4 points on violations incurred within last 18 months. There is a fee for the class. Call 1-888-227-7669 for more information.

Nursing Home Transition and Diversion Waiver: a variety of services may be available to help you stay in your home, or if you are in a Nursing Home, to leave the nursing home and return home. You must be on Medicaid, and meet certain other eligibilities. Call Headway at 408-3120 for more information, or check our website at www.headwayofwny.org.

She served on the Board of Directors for many years. Even after numerous health problems limited her activities, she would work diligently on afghans to contribute to the spring fundraiser auction.
