What did/does HUMC do that we don't need to do in the future? What do we need to let go of in order to move forward in where God is leading us? Kate and Shirlee have been doing an awesome job of getting rid of some of the unnecessary paperwork and other items that have been cluttering up cabinets, closets, and countertops. But what about traditions and practices that may have been meaningful at one point, but are no longer helpful for our current situation? What have we started doing that we would like to continue to do in some manner as we move into the future? Stephanie and team have been doing a super job of on-line worship which has kept us connected as a congregation, helped to touch base with our "shut-ins," and allowed us to reach out to other folks that haven't been a part of a worshiping congregation before. As we transition into in-person worship, to continue to do on-line programming in the manner we have been doing it and in-person as well, is going to be a significant drain on resources. However, we want to continue to be a quality on-line presence to folks who are finding this beneficial. What's the best way to do this? What would we like to add to our ministry in order to share God's grace and to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world? This last year has required us to learn new ways of doing things and to discover new places to be in ministry. It has taught us that we are capable of CHANGE (gulp)! Where is God asking us to stretch into something new?

So often, we like to offer up the excuse that we are a "small" church with limited resources and therefore can't be expected to do all those things large churches do. True. But, those who study church growth have pointed out that the near future could see a surge in the growth of small churches. There are people who are tired of being a "small fish in a big pond." They are looking for a more personalized service, a quality, more customized product (as opposed to a wide variety of merchandize), authenticity, and a comfortable, cozy atmosphere. That is not to say that the smaller churches shouldn't offer a high-quality selection of learning, growing, and mission activities, they just don't need to be everything to everybody. And they do need to communicate that everybody is somebody, somebody very special.

As we get ready to open our doors again, move forward, be who God intended us to be, I offer up all of the above questions as something to ponder and to pray about. And soon, very soon, we'll talk.
