We started the master planning process in January 2017 – that's right, it's been about a year and a half and we're getting very close to the groundbreaking for the project. We appreciate all of your support, participation, and patience during this important phase of planning and design. Your input during the February Listening Sessions was valuable and we have had good attendance at both the May and June Building Update Sessions.

The Building Committee held a meeting on June 26. This was an important meeting because we discussed the recommendation that we will be presenting to the Administrative Board on Monday, July 16 (the Administrative Board's vote is scheduled for August 13). That recommendation includes the overall scope of the project plus the method for financing the project. Please be in prayer for the committee as we prepare for these upcoming meetings and the weeks ahead.

Please be assured that the Building Committee continues to place Trinity's current and future ministry needs at the top of our priority list. We believe that maintaining and growing Trinity's two campuses helps to ensure the success of the church's ministries.


