## Help the Children

As a child growing up in the 50s and 60s, I remember my family being filled with promise, joy, excitement and fun. My family meant everything to me. Life was exciting and everyday was filled with new adventures, learning, playing and the thoughts of what tomorrow might bring. My parents were thoughtful and understanding and made us feel important and special.

Today millions of children live in fear and are victims of domestic violence. Their family life is often filled with pain, utterly lacking stability and love. Many of the children in our country today have been exposed to domestic violence and have not received any of the support available to them. Without this help, these young victims will not begin to heal from the emotional wounds inflicted upon them. With appropriate support, they have a chance to develop the understanding and abilities they will need in order to become stable and healthy. Statistics reveal that children represent the largest group of domestic violence victims. Helpless and vulnerable, they suffer from sexual, physical, and emotional abuse from their parents or other adults, many of whom they love and

Unfortunately, many children see a parent, usually their mother, being abused by their father. Imagine what that does to a child. These children continue to suffer even when the violence has stopped. They have ongoing problems of anger, depression, grief, and stress. Without treatment, recovery from domestic violence can leave emotional scars that will impact them for years to come. Research shows that children who grow up in violent households are 85% more likely to become victims or perpetrators of domestic violence as adults.

At Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County (DVS), 55% of the clients we serve are children. They arrive at DVS after fleeing from their homes, leaving most of what they have and know behind. They typically arrive at our Emergency Shelters in crisis, after witnessing or



experiencing physical and emotional abuse. They are dealing with rapidly changing life circumstances over which they have no control. In order to support these children, reduce their anxiety and address their special needs, **DVS provides treatment and support programs designed specifically for children**.

Domestic Violence Solutions is the only full service Domestic Violence Agency in Santa Barbara County that addresses the specific needs of women and children who have been victimized by family violence. Services and treatment programs are provided based on each client's needs. At DVS we have 3 emergency shelters where clients are provided safety, clinical support, Advocate support, food and clothing for up to 45 days. Prior to leaving the Emergency Shelter clients can apply for continued support in one of our two Transitional Housing facilities where they can stay for up to 18 months. During their stay in Transitional Housing, clients are supported by DVS Clinical and Advocate staff members where they work towards constructing a new life for themselves and their children.

The DVS Board, our staff, volunteers and management team look forward to continuing to support Santa Barbara County and all victims of domestic violence.

We especially wish to thank each of you for your support and contributions. Without your help we would not be able to continue the important programs and services needed to support the victims of domestic violence.

We appreciate all that you do and for being part of the Domestic Violence "Solution."







For fiscal year ending June 30, 2014, the total revenue for Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County was \$1,937,055. State and federal government contracts made up 29% of revenue, foundation grants were 20% and donations were 14%. DVS revenue from the change in value of assets held at the Santa Barbara Foundation was \$100,969.

Total DVS expenses were \$1,995,577. Program expenses were 70%, management and general expenses were 17% and fundraising expenses were 13%.
