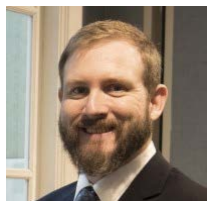


Todd Hauptli

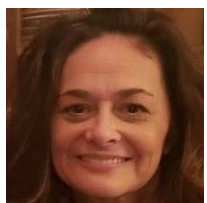


Dustin Hetzel

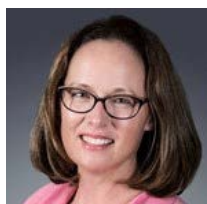

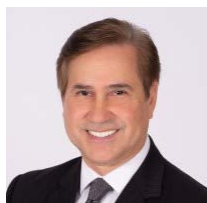

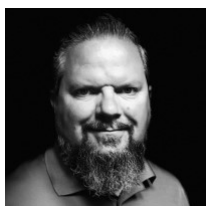


**Simon Robinson
