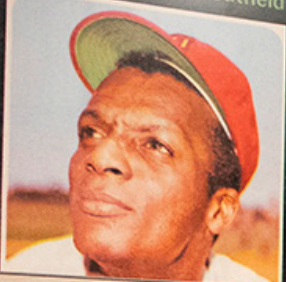

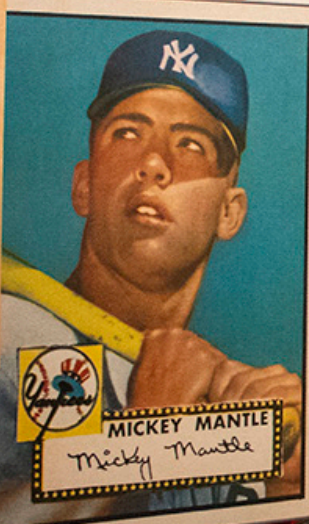

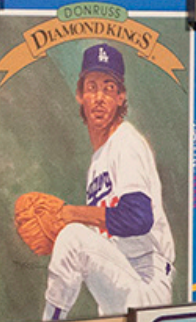
SHOEBOX TREASURES

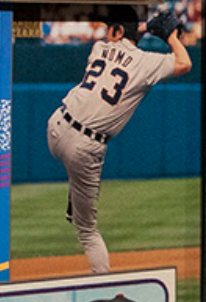

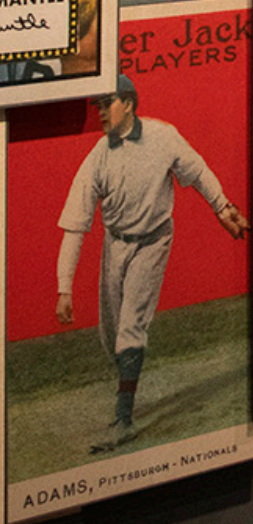

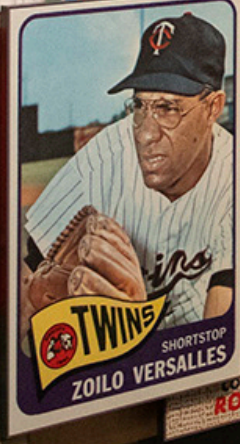

TOUR DATES | JUNE 22-27, 2021

Howdy, Ags,

Time and again referred to as America's national pastime, the game of baseball has played a key role in shaping our nation. Join us on this authentic baseball experience that will take a deep dive into the meaningful aspects that make baseball the game we enjoy today.

We will visit two historical baseball parks—Yankee Stadium and Fenway Park, including behind-the-scenes tours and live game action. And spend time in Cooperstown for a private tour of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

Joining us for discussion is Michael Raycraft, clinical associate professor at the University of Illinois Department of Recreation, Sport and Tourism, and the recipient of multiple teaching awards at the college and campus levels. Dr. Raycraft has been actively engaged with the Baseball Hall of Fame for over three decades. He published two books on baseball memorabilia, and he has lectured extensively on the sport's historical roots, business models, and tourism opportunities.

Dr. Raycraft will discuss Alexander Cartwright—the father of American baseball and founding member of the New York Knickerbockers—while highlighting the baseball stadiums, legends and greatest moments in New York and Boston history. At Cooperstown, we'll learn about James Fenimore Cooper and the Leatherstocking Tales, the Mohawk Indians and their influence on culture. Dr. Raycraft will also share details about Upstate New York's role as a "safe haven" for Holocaust-impacted Jews after World War II, plus the African American influence on the game of baseball.

We hope you will join us for this journey into the history and culture of baseball in America.

Tour Itinerary

TUESDAY, JUNE 22

Arrival Day - Check into the Refinery Hotel in New York City. Meet SET Staff to pick up on-site travel documents. This evening, gather for a cocktail and briefing with tour host Michael Raycraft before heading to Yankee Stadium—home to baseball’s most storied franchise—to watch the New York Yankees play the Kansas City Royals.



WEDNESDAY, JUNE 23

Following breakfast, depart for a private tour of historic Yankee Stadium. After the tour, enjoy a scenic bus ride to Cooperstown, checking into The Otesaga Resort.

This evening, join fellow travelers for dinner and a brief lecture on Cooperstown’s significance to baseball and the Hall of Fame.

THURSDAY, JUNE 24

After breakfast, meet with Hall of Fame staff for a private Artifact Spotlight—a hands-on baseball experience—and a tour of the Hall of Fame. The afternoon and evening are at leisure to explore Cooperstown.



FRIDAY, JUNE 25

Enjoy breakfast, then head to Boston for the final leg of the tour. Check into the Hotel Commonwealth, and take advantage of an afternoon at leisure before watching the Boston Red Sox play the New York Yankees.



SATURDAY, JUNE 26

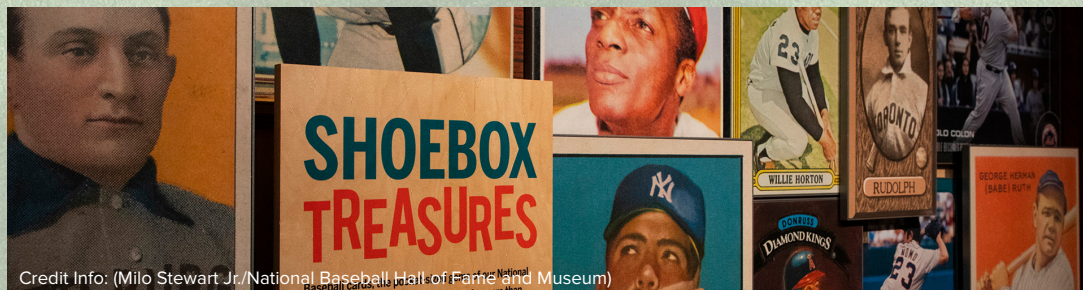

Reservations & Payments

Cancellations, Refunds and Changes
