It is requested you replenish food supplies in the morning on days of the fair. This will prevent exhibitors from getting into heavy evening fair traffic over which the fair board has no control. No stall space to be reserved until entry fee payment accompanies entries.

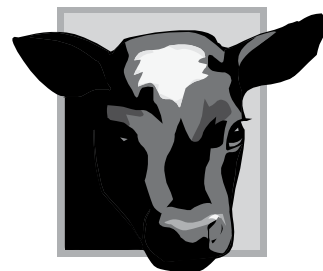
Exhibitors shall be guided by General Rules and the following class rules.

ENTRY RULES

1. Only one entry in group classes permitted by an exhibitor.
2. County Exhibitors will be given first choice and preference in stalls. If barn is full, there will be no out-of-county exhibits.
3. **Milking cows leaving early, must check in Sunday, September 19 by 9 p.m. and will be released on Wednesday, September 22 after 5 p.m. YOU MUST SHOW HEIFERS ALL WEEK IN ORDER TO HAVE "COWS" ON EARLY DISMISSAL.**
4. No stall space will be reserved unless the entry fee accompanies the entry form.
5. **Entry fee is \$10 per head per class.**
6. All exhibitors showing milking cows are required to fill out drug use forms.
7. **Cows leaving early must be identified on the entry form.**
8. No substitutions allowed after Sunday, Sept. 19, 2021
9. If only one exhibitor, only one premium paid.
10. Ribbons will be given to five places
11. All cows ages 2,3,4,5 must be in milk. All milking heifers regardless of age must show in a milking class.
12. Any cow not in milk must enter dry cow class.

Salted Caramel Apple Crumb Cake

FOR THE CRUMB CAKE:

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 stick unsalted butter, softened
- 2 eggs (large)
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 bottle of salted caramel sauce

FOR THE CINNAMON

STREUSEL CRUMB TOPPING:

- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp nutmeg
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 1 large apple, peeled and diced

MAKE THE CAKE:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Prep a springform pan by coating it with non-sticking cooking spray and lining the bottom of the pan with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, combine flour, baking soda, salt, and baking powder. Mix well. Set aside.

Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Slowly add the eggs, beating well to combine ingredients. Beat in the vanilla and sour cream.

Slowly add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, mixing until just combined. Do not overmix.

Spread half of the batter into the bottom of the springform pan.

Top with apple chunks, evenly covering the cake batter.

Sprinkle one cup of the cinnamon streusel crumb topping over the apples.

Top evenly with the remaining cake batter, and sprinkle with remaining cinnamon topping.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35-50 minutes. Test for doneness with a cake tester or toothpick: Insert in the center of the cake, if it comes out clean the cake is done.

Leave cake in the pan and allow to cool. Gently run a thin knife around the cake to loosen it before removing and transferring to a serving dish.

Drizzle salted caramel sauce over the top before serving.

MAKE THE CRUMB TOPPING:

In a medium bowl, combine flour, brown sugar, sugar, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg; whisk well.

Add the melted butter and vanilla. Stir until it is evenly moist. Set aside.

The Grange, Farm Bureau Organizations, Bee-keepers, Homemaker's Council, or any other family organization, may make an educational exhibit featuring some phase of the agricultural industry.

Exhibits should be educational in nature and should be built around some theme or point. It is better to have exhibits tell one thing than to try to tell too much in one display. Something moving in an exhibit always adds to its interest and attracts attention.

Expert judges will be employed and each organization will be scored on their exhibit according to the following scorecards:

ADULT GRANGE EXHIBITS

1. General Appearance (30 points). Well-balanced; attracts attention of visitor, color combination.
2. Effectiveness (30 points). How well does the exhibit tell the story or make its point clear to the observer.
3. Neatness (20 points) Name of Grange or other organization clearly displayed in an unusual and attractive way.
4. Originality (20 points)

Total – 100 points

Premiums will be awarded according to the number of points scored and 75 cents per point will be the basis of award providing the sum of the premiums does not exceed the amount appropriated. **NOTE:** All educational exhibits will be judged on a basis of 100 percent for perfect.

JUVENILE GRANGE EXHIBITS

Each Juvenile Grange in the county will be given a maximum of \$55 for an educational exhibit scored on the same basis as the Adult Granges.

FARM BUREAU COUNCIL EXHIBITS AND OTHER AGRICULTURE EXHIBITS

1. The purpose of this exhibit shall be to inform the public on any phase of agriculture in Tuscarawas County.
2. Booth displays will be 10 x 10 feet.
3. Each booth will have at least one light and one electrical receptacle for your use.
4. Exhibits must be completed on the evening before the fair is to officially open.
5. Exhibits will be judged on the following basis:
 - General Appearance (30 points) Well-balanced; attracts attention of viewer, informs the non-farmer about agriculture.
 - Effectiveness (30 points) Exhibit tells a story, makes its point clearly, and is related to agriculture in Tuscarawas County.
 - Neatness (20 points) Name of council or other organization clearly and cleverly displayed, all lettering neat and attractive, all objects and products clearly labeled.
 - Originality (20 points) Unique and clever display of topic, a new topic or a new approach to an old topic.

Premiums will be awarded according to the number of points scored and 75 cents per point will be the basis of award providing the sum of the premiums does not exceed the amount appropriated.

NOTE: All educational exhibits will be judged on a basis of 100 points for perfect.
