What's Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment is a term used for classes that offer both High School credits and College credits.

At Horizon, we offer many of the classes you will need to complete an Associates Degree through Rio Salado. That means you could complete up to two years of college by the time you graduate. Through taking our dual enrollment classes you will get a head start of college while saving time and money because you won't be retaking these classes in college AND tuition is a fraction of the cost the university!

Benefits of Dual Enrollment
