A Message From The Pastor . . .

In Mission For Christ



Let us borrow from the name of our larger church body, the LCMC...the "MC" part, which is "In Mission for Christ." That is our task, our purpose, Know Him our meaning as a congregation of believers, and -more so--as a People of God, as Disciples of Jesus.

Mission means ministry. Ministry means serving, caring, witnessing, teaching...as well as worshipping. It is the "action" part of who we are and the sort of "Faith Active in Love" (per St. Paul) that is the very substance and identity of who we are. What we are about is who we are.

I like to say, "Ministry is person-to-person." Ministry happens through relationship. Ministry is not a program or programs--Ministry is what happens through our programs. Ministry isn't the guilts, for example, or even the guilting. Ministry is the caring and helping and witnessing of the Gospel that is block by block and stitch by stitch sown into the fabric of what we send. Every "shipment" needs to go with our prayers of blessing and our open-ended hope that the recipients will receive the covering, the brightness, the warmth and the promise of Christ.

When I prepare a sermon, I, as the preaching pastor, need to be in relationship with the hearers. I need to use words and thoughts that will offer meaning and purpose, care and blessing, life and Good News, to the range of hearts and lives in the sanctuary or over the internet. I strive to deliver a message as a dialog, not as a monolog. The goal is that "The Word Become Flesh" (per St. John) in the course of that few minutes, and in the context of the larger setting of song and prayer of the Word and Sacrament coming into

the hearts and lives of real individual persons-offaith.

So, as a Transition Team in our leading of the congregation in this Transition Process and then in the Call Process, we are therefore striving to grow the spiritual depth and breadth of our task. We are identifying this time as "emotional-spiritual process"--our moving through some things together with a grounding in scripture and prayer, and that moving through in practical application to our leading of the whole congregation.

Second, along with that, we are striving to engage our sense of our Calling as a congregation. That is who the Church is--the "ones called out" in the life and ministry of the Gospel of Christ. So, we will also work to grow our sense of mission. And, why? Because if we are to Call a pastor to lead us and guide us in the future, he or she will need to know what we are believing we are about in this time and in this place in this little corner of God's Good World.

A part of what we will do in the next few weeks, then, is to develop a series of meetings-probably in home "cottage meetings"--to open as much as possible the who of the Zion body of

<- Continued from Pg. 1 believers to the discussion and input as to what we at the present (...not the past) believe our mission, our ministry to be moving forward. It may involve some assessment as to the "mission" quality and effectiveness of what we are doing now. Hopefully, it will involve some creative envisioning of what we "see" and "hear" God calling us to become and be in the future.

I can tell you from my own many experiences in interviewing for a pastorate that it is not very exciting to interview where a congregation does not know who they are or where they believe they need to go. By contrast, it stirs my pastoral spirit when I come to a Transition Process and then Call Committee where they have that sort of vision and that sort of excitement about their own faith. Those are the connecting points we are hoping to develop in the weeks before us.


"In View of God's Mercy" Series for Lent services

Sign-In Sheet:



COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE ...

On Saturday (2/12) the Transition Team met for the second time. As in the prior meeting the session began with devotions and conversation on the Parable of the Sower. Pastor Barden's Guidelines for Communication were also presented. The team pledged to follow these in our Transition and Call Process. The meeting concluded with discussion of the required tasks immediately ahead of the team. Those tasks being:

- Reach out to the Congregation. Hopefully we will be able to conduct in home cottage meetings of 6 to 8 people to learn about what we as members of Zion think about the future mission of the church. If there are concerns voiced they will be addressed. We must be able to greet a new Pastor as a united congregation sharing a common vision. We must also determine how leadership of the Congregation is shared between the Pastor & Congregation.
- Develop a Communication Plan Effective for All. I am sure we all share a common desire to know the progress in our search for a new Pastor. Multiple means of communication will be employed - email, Sunday morning announcements, postings to the bulletin board and I am sure additional means will be identified. A schedule is being developed to show all required tasks, their status/completion percentage and relationship to one another.
- The Congregational Assessment or Ministry Site Profile done in 2017 will be updated. Work to
 update statistics for the congregation and surrounding area can begin immediately. The latter
 sections addressing Vision for Ministry and Leadership Needs cannot be completed until the
 Reach out to the Congregation is completed.
- Review all Governing Documents. This begins with our Constitution and Bylaws as they relate to Pastoral responsibilities and the call process. Additionally these documents address what we believe, the mission of the church as well as the responsibilities of the congregation both during and after the call process is completed.



This is important work to complete and knowledge to gain before the actual call process can begin. We are not hiring an employee. We are preparing ourselves to call a pastor. A process which is relational, covenantal and above all guided by the Holy Spirit. In our last letter of call we pledge nine areas of support to the called pastor. We are now in the process of preparing to provide that support both spiritually with the help of Pastor Barden and administratively through the efforts of the Transition Team. We

can all support this process with prayer for the Church, Pastor Barden and the Transition Team.
