(Career & Technical Education) Portfolio Requirements



Course Description: Participation in occupational area of study work experience under supervision of both college and employer. Internship/cooperative education learning objectives developed by student and faculty adviser, with approval of employer, to provide appropriate work-based learning experience. Minimum of 75 clock hours per semester credit.

General Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion of the course the student should be able to do the following:

- 1. Demonstrate evidence of increased field of study proficiency.
- 2. Apply academic theory to the world of work.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate work skills including communication, problem solving/decision making, teamwork, self-management, initiative, and technical.



Why a portfolio?


A portfolio is being used extensively in the business world as a way of showing evidence of your work, knowledge, skills and achievements. Employers often want more than just a resume!

- *A portfolio is a tool that:
 - Indicates your level of expertise in your subject matter.
 - Shows proof of your skills and abilities.
 - Shows evidence (work samples) of your abilities.
 - Contains your personal and professional goals.
 - Keep this in mind as you build your portfolio using the following sections and documents as a guideline.



Design a front, side, and back cover for your binder. For example:

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Statement of Confidentiality

You may use the statement below.

Resume

Include a resume that incorporates your most recent coursework and co-op experience. You may also want to include a sample cover letter (not required).

Your co-op goals go in this section. You should retype them. Also create a set of short and long-term goals. These set the direction and tone of your career. Take some time to reflect on your short and long term goals. Ask yourself, where do I want to be in 2 years or less? In 5 years and beyond?

Skill Sets

Identify and describe your skill sets and abilities in three areas:

- Applied Skill Sets What skills and knowledge did you have from your horticulture classes that you applied on the job?
- Acquired Skill Sets What new skills and knowledge did you learn on the job?
- Additional Skill Sets What skills or knowledge needed to be stronger or were lacking?



Work Samples

- The *first* page of this tabbed section should be an annotated list of your work samples. The annotation clearly states what goal the documentation supports.
- Include samples of your work during your Co-op/internship. Samples should show evidence that you achieved your goals. This could include your employer evaluations and self evaluations, photos, publications, reports, etc.

What else can you include that shows evidence of your achievement during your Coop/internship?



Other Evidence of Achievement

You might want to include

- Course projects
- Other work samples
- Awards
- Community Service
- References
- Letters of recommendation
- Personal interests
- etc.
