ABOUT THE ARTISTS



Second-year HGO Studio Artist **Dorothy Gal** won second prize in HGO's 2018 Eleanor McCollum Competition Concert of Arias and made her HGO mainstage debut as Zerlina in *Don Giovanni* this past spring. She participated in Marilyn Horne's The Song Continues workshop at Carnegie Hall, and was a vocal fellow at Ravinia's Steans Music Institute and a New Horizons Fellow at the Aspen Summer Music Festival. She is an alumna of Houston Grand Opera's Young Artists Vocal Academy (2015). Roles include

Amy in Little Women, Lauretta in Gianni Schicchi, Poussette in Manon, Zerlina in Don Giovanni, Sandrina in La finta giardiniera and First Wood Sprite in Rusalka. This past summer, she sang the role of Anne Egerman in A Little Night Music at Aspen Music Festival. Her HGO roles during the 2019–2020 season are Countess Ceprano in Rigoletto, Priestess in Aida and Papagena in The Magic Flute.

Dorothy Gal is the Evans Family/Mr. and Mrs. Charles G. Nickson Fellow at Houston Grand Opera.



Second-year HGO Studio Artist **Lindsay Kate Brown** won third prize in HGO's 2018 Eleanor McCollum Competition Concert of Arias. She earned an artist diploma in opera studies at Rice University, where she portrayed the roles of Cecilia March in *Little Women*, Zita in *Gianni Schicchi* and Cornelia in *Julius Caesar*. She made her professional debut with Tri-Cities Opera in 2014. In 2015, she won an encouragement award in the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. In summer 2018, she was a young

artist at Des Moines Metro Opera, where she reprised the role of Ma Moss in Copland's *The Tender Land* and covered the role of Ježibaba in *Rusalka*. This past summer she sang the role of the Composer in *Ariadne auf Naxos* with Wolf Trap Opera. During the 2019–2020 season at HGO, she will perform Giovanna in *Rigoletto* and the Second Lady in *The Magic Flute*.

Lindsay Kate Brown is the Mr. and Mrs. James W. Crownover/Lynn and Henry Gissel Fellow at Houston Grand Opera.



First-year HGO Studio Artist **William Guanbo Su** won second prize in HGO's 2019 Eleanor McCollum Competition Concert of Arias and was a Grand Finals Winner of the 2019 Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. He has been a Gerdine Young Artist at Opera Theatre of Saint Louis and a voice fellow at the Aspen Music Festival. Roles include Pluton in Rameau's *Hippolyte et Aricie*, Herr Reich in Nicolai's *The Merry Wives of Windsor* and Seneca in Monteverdi's *The Coronation of Poppea*. He has studied

German lieder at the Franz Schubert Institute in Vienna, and in 2017, he won first prize in the Gerda Lissner Lieder Competition. In summer 2019, he sang Count Ceprano in *Rigoletto* as a Gerdine Young Artist with Opera Theatre of Saint Louis. During the 2019–2020 season at HGO, he appears as the Usher in *Rigoletto*, the Fifth Jew in *Salome* and the Second Armored Man in *The Magic Flute*.

William Guanbo Su is the Anne and Albert Chao Fellow at Houston Grand Opera.



Second-year HGO Studio Artist **Kyle Naig** coached HGO productions of *La bohème*, *Florencia en el Amazonas* and *Don Giovanni* last season. He previously played productions of *Manon* and *The Barber of Seville* at Opera Santa Barbara, *As One* at Des Moines Metro Opera, *Scalia/Ginsburg* and *Porgy and Bess* at The Glimmerglass Festival, *Turandot* at Cedar Rapids Opera Theatre, and *Tosca* at Intermountain Opera Bozeman. Recent engagements include *Scarlatti's Il trionfo dell'onore* at Opera Memphis, as well

as returns to Opera Santa Barbara (*Trouble in Tahiti* and *Gallantry*) and Intermountain Opera Bozeman (*Falstaff*). He is an alumnus of training programs at Des Moines Metro Opera, Opera Santa Barbara and Lyric Opera of Kansas City. This past summer he worked on *Wozzeck* at Des Moines Metro Opera. During the 2019–2020 season at HGO, he will be coaching *Saul*, *Aida* and *The Magic Flute*.

In mainstage productions and at other less traditional venues, these artist hone their craft as singing actors. During a residency of up to three years, each performer receives customized training from an expert team while gaining invaluable performance experience at the highest level.

These recitals reflect the joint efforts of OPERA America and its member companies to identify and nurture the careers of the most promising young artists. Each recital hosts emerging singers and pianists at the National Opera Center's Marc A. Scorca Hall. The concerts are streamed live to opera companies around the world, introducing these artists to a broad community of producers and other casting professionals who can help advance their careers, as well as to a worldwide public interested in tracking the accomplishments of aspiring artists who have achieved success through competitions and young artist programs.
