RECIPROCAL YACHT CLUBS



How does reciprocity work?

There are more than 100 yacht clubs and boating organizations in PICYA, each unique in size, structure and facilities. It is the responsibility of each club to develop its own policies and procedures about reciprocity.

Some guidelines

- 1. Verify that you have reciprocal privileges.
- 2. Call ahead to ensure that space is available, your visit will not conflict with other club functions, and to make arrangements early in the year for a club cruise.
- 3. When making arrangements ask about club and marina rules such as, allowing pets, parties, electrical service, etc.
- 4. Always sign the guest register.
- 5. Always have a current membership card from your clubs and be prepared to show it.
- 6. Wear a nametag from your club or sign a 'stick on badge' from the club.
- 7. Ask for a copy or location of club rules and observe them, you are a guest.
- 8. Patronize the facilities of the club. They may have brought in extra staff just for your visit.
- 9. Under no circumstances board or make fast to any vessel without permission. Do not use any equipment left on the dock.
- 10. Always follow good environmental practice consistent with concerns for proper waste disposal and discharges from your vessel.

It's been said that the Napa Valley Yacht Club is now "More Frittata then Regatta." Our club activities are all great fun, but do any of our members still sail?

We have no regattas, but Jeffrey Yablon and Trish Arnold's 41' Columbia, BACCHUS, has been very active this season. On the BACCHUS, berthed at the Marina Bay Yacht Harbor in Richmond, Jeff does a sail-out every other Sunday into San Francisco Bay. Although he maintains a basic sailing crew which he draws from for each outing, guests are added in an ever-changing combination of participants. The skipper and three crew members are essential for operating the boat, and the other guests are trainees, or wine and food devotees and *reconteurs*, making the trip more pleasurable for all. The food brought by guests and crew varies from one outing to another. Some meals are simple sandwiches for hard-core sailors who just want to get out on the water, while others are pre-packaged, gourmet offerings. We've seen no frittatas on board, but some of the gourmet spreads tempt us to get the S.F. Chronicle food editor on the phone and send photographs.

The BACCHUS outings are also something of a family affair. Guests and crew often bring along a partner or younger family member to introduce him or her to the sailing experience and/or expose them to the rich mix of characters always found on board. A father brought his high school daughter along, and we found her to be an accomplished sailor. Other young guests are given instruction by skipper Jeffrey on basic sailing. Guests are assigned tasks based on their skills, from acting as "spotter" or watch for other approaching crafts, to coiling loose dock lines or serving food, even commanding the vessel. Everyone is a sailing participant in some way.

There may not be a regatta in our club's future, but let's keep sailing away at every opportunity. The BACCHUS requires wine, and we can all benefit from more frittatas.


