# HOW TO CONFUSE YOUR PARENTS



**Do-** SPEAK WELL of your Parents when they are not around Don't-TRASH TALK your parents to others

When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder where ever the pilot wants to go. Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of life on fire, and itself set on fire by hell. James 3:3-6

Do- Show <u>RESPECT</u> to your parents even when you do not agree.

Show proper <u>respect</u> to everyone: Love the brotherhood of believers, fear God, and honor the king. 1 Peter 2:17

# **Do- Submit to your parents <u>AUTHORITY</u>**



Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you clothe yourself in humility toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble". 1 Peter 5:5

# **OBEY** Your parents, even when they're not around

Who is the faithful and wise servant, whom the master has put in charge of the servants in his household to give them their food at the proper time?
