Ready, set, snow! Are you ready to ski



You don't have to wait 'till the ground is covered in your back yard you know. We have great places that get snow where there is none to be found elsewhere. Garnet Hill, Lake Placid and Lapland come to mind. My favorite is Prospect Mt. in Bennington, VT because it has lots of snow, fantastic grooming and its not too far away. It takes me 2 1/4 hours to get there from the MHB. Close enough for a day trip especially if you car pool. Another thing that you can do is go downhill skiing (it's ok to use the fat skis and heavy boots). You don't have to do scary stuff, just the easy trails or the cruisers. It's just great to be on snow. I always bring my skate skis and have a blast. Last year I ran into the Kingston HS Nordic ski club at Belleayre. They were having a lot of fun and they didn't mind the ride up either. If you do head to the slopes I encourage you to take a lesson. Everything that you learn in a beginner class is the same as what you

would learn in an XC lesson! We have lots of learn to ski days that come with discounted tickets. It's a fun way to improve your XC skills

You will have to get your gear in shape too. You may need some new garb or equipment, and your skis will need some wax. Mail order is an option, then there are shops in the Berkshires and Adirondacks but if you would prefer something closer to home I recommend Peak Performance in New Paltz and Pawling Cycle and Sport. The owners are skiers and they know their stuff. EMS is good for backcountry. Stay away from the rest. The new equipment will make skiing a lot more fun. Skis that fit, boots that provide good support and keep your feet warm and dry and poles that pop back into your hand are important for having fun, so make a commitment to get better this year and part with some cash to get what you need to do so!

We will be participating in Team Ski Racing on Wednesday Nights for six weeks beginning 1/3/07 and ending 2/7/07 (weather permitting). We need at least FIVE racers to participate as a TEAM. 
