We are highlighting these areas not only to say, "thank you", but also to bring awareness that in most of these areas we have a great need for willing and loving servants. Perhaps in the Lord's strength he is calling you to come along these and lessen their load?



ELDERS CORNER - OCTOBER 2021

Biblical compromise is a most dangerous thing to do since that greatly affects where people will spend eternity. Pastor Dr. Robert Jeffress has written a book, *Not All Roads Lead To Heaven*. I will give you some highlights from this book that point out the dangers of compromising our beliefs.

Dr. Jeffress begins by saying that we must understand the doctrine of exclusivity of Christ so that we are prepared to respond when people ask us, "Don't all religions lead to heaven?" He says the most loving thing we can do for our unbelieving family, friends and people in our circle of influence – for anyone is to clearly communicate this essential doctrine to them.

Our goal should be to not win an argument but to win the other person to faith in God's ONLY WAY to heaven – THROUGH CHRIST ALONE.

A June 2021 poll by Gallup showed for the first time that 70% of Americans supported same-sex marriage, this is up 43% from 1996 when only 27% of Americans supported it. What did not help is that the U.S. Supreme Court ruled on June 26, 2015 that gay marriage was a civil right (Obergefell v. Hodges). Yet in 1885 the Supreme Court ruled in Murphy v. Ramsey that marriage is a sacred union between a man and a woman, from which all good things in society come. Jeffress raised the question what has changed? Not the constitution, but the culture. The Supreme Court caved into political correctness.

Dr. Jeffress says that Christians are increasingly supportive of homosexual unions, especially the younger ones which according to the PEW Religion Forum is now up to 58 percent.

An example he gave was of a popular sports personality, known for his courage in standing for his Christian faith was invited to speak to his congregation (First Baptist Church of Dallas, Texas). A New York columnist heard about this and demanded that he cancel his talk because he felt Dr. Jeffress was anti-gay and anti-Semitic. Dr. Jeffress believes marriage is between a man and a woman and that Jews like everyone else must trust Christ for salvation. This sports star cancelled his appearance even though he agreed with the church's beliefs but said he needed to protect his career and not damage his platform.

He says in his book that Christians are waffling, wavering and in the process of ceding the bedrock of historic Christianity. SALVATION IS ONLY AVAILABLE THROUGH FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST.

When addressing the question What Difference Does It Make What We Believe? He replied our own eternal destiny is at stake. What you believe about the exclusivity of the gospel of Christ determines whether you will spend eternity in heaven or hell. He goes on to quote Matthew 7:13-14 which says to enter heaven through the narrow gate.

Hinduism teaches that all of the major religions lead to God. In other words he says most other faiths claim that their way is the exclusive way into the presence of God. So who is right? Dr. Jeffress feels we are losing the battle because we are outfought, outargued and outmarketed when it comes to the issue of salvation through Christ alone.

Many pastors, individual believers and congregations are rejecting the belief of salvation through Christ alone and are instead embracing "pluralism." That is the idea that all religions are equally valid.

In being outfought in this spiritual warfare battle Satan uses his servants to disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Some examples he lists are Joseph Smith, founder of Mormonism, the so called prophet Muhammad, the founder of Islam, the religious leader that is wrapped up in beautiful clerical robes who says that faith in Christ is important but not sufficient by itself to obtain the forgiveness of sins, and the evangelical pastor who preaches that although he personally believes that Christ offers the way to heaven, sincere followers of other faiths will also be welcomed into God's presence. The outcome of this battle over the exclusivity of Jesus Christ will affect the ETERNAL DESTINY of billions of people.

For an example of being outargued, he tells of meeting a senior executive of one of the largest broadcast organizations in the world in New York City. He was asked why he spends his time talking to the secular media. He replied that the Christian view point is often distorted. For example, the issue of sanctity of life has been turned into a war on women's health. The issue of marriage between a man and a woman has been twisted into hatred for homosexuals and the good news of God's forgiveness to everyone who trusts in Jesus is being rebranded into a message of intolerance that condemns people of other faiths.

Giving an example of being out marketed, he says the average American watches 5 hours of television a day. He says Oprah Winfrey continues to be one of the most powerful figures in broadcasting. She claims "One of the biggest mistakes humans make is to believe there is only one way. Actually, there are many diverse paths leading to what you call God." She is one of many influential personalities who use the airwaves to spread their message of pluralism.

Think about this: for the first two thousand years the Christian faith grew from a handful of converts to the most powerful movement the world has ever seen. This was done without the use of television, radio or the internet.

We must equip the saints for the work of service for building up the body of Christ (Ephesians 4:12). We must be ready to communicate the message of the gospel to anyone God brings into our lives. This is done by knowing and studying the Word and by having unwavering resolve to share the truth of the gospel with anyone we meet.

For example: in a public prayer we should never close with "in Your name" but "in Jesus name" and not to worry about offending those of different faiths or no faith. We should be concerned when having a conversation at work, church or school to point out that those who fail to trust Christ for salvation will be sentenced to eternal separation from God (Hell). We also need to reject Universalism which is the belief that everyone regardless of their belief will be accepted by God for all eternity.

In closing here are four Scripture passages which point out the exclusivity of accepting Jesus as Savior. They are John 3:16, John 11:25-26, Acts 16:31 and Romans 10:9.

As believers we need to believe in (1) Absolute Truth (God's Word is true for all people), (2) Believe the Bible to be the inspired and inerrant Word of God, (2 Timothy 3:16-17), (3) Believe in the deity of Jesus Christ (Matthew 7:14 – Jesus rejected the idea that everyone would be saved), (4) Believe in the Necessity of the Atonement (I John 2:2 – All other religions share a common denominator – that man is responsible through rituals, self-improvement or rule keeping to appease their god. Christianity is different in that it says Jesus' sacrifice on Calvary is sufficient to atone for our sins that have offended a Holy God.), (5) Believe in the reality of Hell (see Matthew 25:41-46) and (6) Evangelism / Missions (go into all the world and make disciples – Matthew 28:19-20)

Remember only those who believe that personal faith in Jesus Christ is absolutely necessary for salvation have any logical reason to share their faith with others. NEVER COMPROMISE YOUR FAITH!!! It can make a difference for eternity in people's lives!

THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWER

This summer I reread a book written by Erwin Lutzer, pastor emeritus of Moody Bible Church.

It was called When A Nation Forgets God, 7 Lessons We Must Learn From Nazi Germany.

George Santayana said "Those who do not remember the past are condemned to repeat it."

With everything going on in the world today I feel that the observations Lutzer makes we could benefit from. We most certainly can learn from the past so we don't make the same mistakes.

In his introduction to the book Lutzer points out that he doesn't expect America to ever gas millions of people because they belong to the wrong race; but the same values that destroyed Germany are being taught in many of our centers of learning today.

He says, "The experience of the church in Nazi Germany reminds us that Christ must always stand alone; He must be worshiped not as One who stands alongside the governmental leaders of this world but as standing above them as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. The church has always been poised between two gods and two crosses. On the one side is our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, who died on a Roman cross, executed for the sins of the world. On the other side are any number of lesser gods and other crosses that promise a false salvation."

The following are insights Erwin Lutzer gives us for the church of today:

1. WHEN GOD IS SEPARATED FROM GOVERNMENT, JUDGMENT FOLLOWS

Hitler redefined Christmas and Easter. Christmas was turned into a pagan festival to be celebrated on December 21st – The winter solstice. School prayers were banned and carols and Nativity plays were forbidden in the schools. In 1938 Christmas was changed to Yuletide. Easter was turned into a holiday that heralded the arrival of spring.

Germany had a state church which paid the pastors salaries. Most of the churches bowed to the cultural currents and endorsed the "Positive Christianity" that was in line with government policies.

"Hitler would later try to obliterate the church. In the end he wanted to transform the church so thoroughly that every vestige of Christianity would be smashed. There was not enough room in the churches for both the cross and the swastika."

Martin Niemoller and Dietrich Bonhoeffer (both of these men landed in prison for taking a Biblical stand) opposed Hitler's intrusion into the affairs of the church. According to Lutzer, "more than two thousand pastors who had stood with Niemoller and Bonhoeffer withdrew their support. They believed that appeasement was the best strategy; they thought if they remained silent they could live with Hitler's intrusion into church affairs and his political policies."

When the public square is free of any hint of religious values, secular values fill the vacuum, like the cheapness of human life (abortion and euthanasia) and the promotion of all forms of immorality (including homosexual marriages). Hate speech in this country will mean the same as it did in Nazi Germany: It is simply stating an opinion that the government thinks should not be expressed.

Lutzer says "Bonhoeoffer was right when he said that we will never be a victorious church until we see suffering as a divine gift.. "For to you it has been granted on behalf of Christ, not only to believe in Him but to suffer for his sake." (Philippians 1:29) He says it is time for us to reread the New Testament book of I Peter, written specifically to believers living in a hostile, pagan culture.

"Niemoller was right: we are being sifted to separate the wheat and the chaff. Whether in Nazi Germany or America, believers cannot choose to remain silent under the guise of preaching the Gospel. Sharing the Gospel is, of course, our primary responsibility **since it is only the cross of Christ that can transform the human heart. We must be prepared to submit to the Lordship of Christ in all spheres.**

2. It Is Always The Economy

Bonhoeffer and Niemoller broke away from the State Church and formed "The Confessing Church" which followed the Scripture instead of the government's orders.

Erwin says "given our penchant for wanting to live and not suffer deprivation, we are prone to do exactly what the German people did, and that is to overlook eternal ideals for the sake of temporal survival. So often we as Christians have been willing to compromise Christ to keep our jobs and to be assured of economic security, and to hide our faith in order to graduate from our favorite university."

"It is better to starve while doing God's will than to be a well-fed Christian who has chosen the short-term advantages instead of divine favor."

"The hard road is often the one we must have the courage to choose."

3. THAT WHICH IS LEGAL MIGHT ALSO BE EVIL

Hitler believed that the Jews were subhuman-parasites that needed to be exterminated. To make sure the Jews could be killed without reprisals he would change the law to ensure that extinguishing this race was not a crime. (a good example is abortion being legalized). "Whoever controls a nation's laws also controls a nation's agenda and values."

Evolution thinking and liberal theology have served over the years to weaken Christianity's influence.

4. PROPAGANDA CAN CHANGE A NATION

Hitler knew he could lead the masses if he could tell convincing lies. "The Nazi's censored film productions and textbooks to be used in schools. Books that did not match the Nazi ideal were burned or outlawed. Children's picture books demeaned the Jews and emphasized the glories of the Aryan race and they succeeded.

The Nazi's also sanitized their terminology. "When Hitler starved children, he called it' putting them on a low calorie diet.' And the extermination of Jews was called 'cleansing the land.' Euthanasia was referred to as 'the best of modern therapy.' Children were put to death in 'Children's Specialty Centers.'"

Examples today: homosexual behavior is alternate lifestyle, and adultery is an affair. Schools that demean religion and promote immorality are said to be value free.

5. PARENTS, NOT THE STATE - ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR A CHILD'S TRAINING.

Textbooks were rewritten to reflect the view of racial fitness with an emphasis on German history and culture. If teachers wanted to keep their jobs they had to take an oath of loyalty to Hitler.

The purpose of school was not independent thought, but rather to transform the attitude and values of children to what the state wanted.

Truth was whatever the Nazis preferred it to be. Parents who tried to contradict what their children were being taught were punished.

Look at "values clarification" invented by Dr. Sidney Simon in order to change the beliefs, convictions and moral values of a child. It is based on the notion that there are no absolutes.

Teachers in North Carolina were told what values they should instill in their children. They were given a seven point list.

Deuteronomy 6:6-9 God spells out what parents, especially fathers should be teaching their children.

6. ORDINARY HEROES CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote that "When God calls a man, he bids him come and die." He followed what he preached and was hanged a couple of months before the end of the war for standing for Christ. He wrote that cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our Church. We are fighting today for costly grace.....Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross and grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

"Today in America we need an army of ordinary heroes to stand against the gathering darkness in our land. We need people who will stand for truth courageously, consistently and with humility and

grace. " " We need to individually draw a line in the sand, making up our minds that we will not compromise our principles, even at great personal cost."

Lutzer gave an example of a hero he knew. His name is Zakaria Botros, a Coptic priest who through television and internet preaches the Gospel to fifty million Muslims in the Middle East each week. Tens of thousands of Muslims have come to Christ through his ministry. He is regarded as Islam's public enemy number one.

When asked by Lutzer what price he had to pay for sharing the claims of the Gospel this was his reply: "Whatever price I have had to pay is cheap in comparison to what Jesus Christ has done for me in shedding His blood for us!" But he went on to explain how his brother had his tongue cut out and a stake put through his head for preaching the Gospel in Egypt. "But that was okay if it was the price that needed to be paid for preaching the Gospel."

In writing about Chuck Colson he says, "No one is beyond hope; no one has fallen so far, but that God's grace can reach them."

7. WE MUST EXALT THE CROSS IN THE GATHERING DARKNESS

"Bonhoeffer warned that if the church should ever substitute one Lord for another, if the cross of Christ was replaced by any other cross, the Gospel would be betrayed and the church judged." He saw clearly what we in America have not yet grasped: that for us as Christians, the conflict is really between humanism and Christianity; or alternative religions and Christianity. " It is the meaning of the cross that gives Christianity its power."

"The cross has become an ornament hung around the neck, not an instrument that changes the heart."

In closing, Lutzer points out that "We must be confident that Christ will set the record straight. Those who are faithful to Him and His cross will be rewarded with joy unspeakable and full of glory.' All rival crosses will be exposed and judged, and every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)


