
In 2019, we formed two advisory boards at IJRD to enhance our research:

GRANTS



We have received \$19,461,044 in grant funding since January 2018.

- We received **\$15,052,181** from CKF to fund IJRD and the flagship S3C/5-Key Model research project.
- We received \$1,000,000 from the University Fund for IJRD/S3C/5-Key Model research.
- We have been awarded \$5,408,863 in private and public grants to support other IJRD research projects:

We have applied for \$138,420,277 in grant funding, including a \$100 million proposal submitted to the MacArthur 100&Change Challenge in August 2019.
