Scholarships

Limited scholarships are provided by the ICC Educational Foundation. The scholarship amount is \$50 per class with a maximum of two scholarships per child, not to exceed \$100 total. Limit of four scholarships awarded per family, not to exceed \$200 total. Additional classes will be charged at full price.

Game Maker is a program that allows you to make exciting computer games without the need to write a single line of code. You can make games with backgrounds, animated graphics, music, and sound effects. Once you get more experienced, there is a built-in programming language that gives you full flexibility. Game Maker can be used free of charge, and you can use the games you produce in any way you like — you can even sell them!

Computer Aided Design CAD

Grades 6-8 Session 1 10:30

Students will enjoy activities which include creating mechanical images that are used in

programming creating mechanical images that are used in careers like engineering and manufacturing. You will be introduced to the units of CAD navigation, drawing basic objects, modifying those objects, orthographic projections, isometrics, and dimensioning.

AutoCAD will be the principle software used.

Web Design

Grades 7-10 Session 1 8:15 Grades 7-10 Session 2 8:15

Give your "techy side" a boost by creating your own eye-catching website, while learning basic HTML coding. Students will markup text, add images, incorporate sound files and animated pictures, and link those elements together to form a website that is truly fun and unique.

Computer Programming with Etoys

Grades 7-10 Session 1 10:30 or 1:10 Grades 7-10 Session 2 10:30 or 1:10

Are you a right brain and left brain person? Do you have a need to create and use your powers of logical thinking? Then this course is for you! Here you will learn the basic skills of computer programming. You will sketch your own worlds and elements. Then learn how to program their movements and actions just like the pros. You can also create animated storybooks. If you wish, your finished projects will be submitted to Etoys Illinois, a collaboration with the University of Illinois and Google, to be posted on the World Wide Web for all to view. An awesome experience awaits you!

Robot Revolution Building

Grades 8-10 Session 1 1:10 Grades 8-10 Session 2 1:10 Materials Fee: \$70

Want to build your own robot? Build your own Hyper Line Tracker robot in June and your own Spider III robot in July. The Hyper Line robot will be able to follow a pathway of your own design. The Spider III robot uses its infrared sensor and sees objects to avoid, changes direction, and finds a new path. Take your robot home with you.

Advanced Game Maker

Grades 8-10 Session 1 10:30 Grades 8-10 Session 2 10:30

Prerequisite: Game Maker I (or instructor's permission). Advanced Game Maker shows you how to create several exciting games using new graphics while advancing the skills you learned from Game Maker I. This class covers a range of genres, including action, adventure, and puzzle games, complete with professional quality sound effects and visuals. It discusses game design theory and features practical examples of how this can be applied to making games that are more fun to play. Game Maker allows games to be created using a simple drag-and-drop interface, so you don't need to have any prior coding experience. It includes an optional programming language for adding advance features to your games when you feel ready to do so.

Foreign Language

American Sign Language I

Grades 4-8 Session 1 8:15 Grades 4-8 Session 2 8:15

This class teaches the basics of ASL. Students will learn the manual alphabet, numbers, and common phrases. Students will learn ASL vocabulary through games and other hands-on activities. Students will learn about the deaf community and how to sign The Pledge of Allegiance and some songs.

American Sign Language II

Session 1 1:10 Grades 4-8 Grades 4-8 Session 2 1:10

This class will continue where ASL for Beginners finished. We will review the alphabet and common phrases. The class will use games and role playing activities to help students understand old and new concepts. Students will also learn a new song and present it at the end of the session. We will also watch a movie in American Sign Language.

German for Fun

Grades 4-8 Session 1 10:30 Grades 4-8 Session 2 10:30

Speaking German is fun! Conversations will be a big part of this class with enhanced vocabulary including numbers, time, colors, food, days, month, seasons, school objects, and weather expressions. Listening and speaking skills are practiced through roleplaying, games, songs, and poetry. There will be awards and prizes for all!

We will also practice organizational skills which will help get you and your homework to the right place at the same time. We will discuss how to earn more freedom by taking more responsibility, learn about internet safety, and make a plan for involvement in school activities and seeking a leadership role in your school. This class is led by a current middle school counselor.

Leadership Training

Learn about setting goals and taking steps to reach them. This course is based on the book. The Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens by Sean Covey.

Work Smarter

This course is designed for junior high and high school students in anticipation of the future. You will learn study skills, strategies, habits, attitudes, and self-awareness that will serve you through your high school and college careers. We'll practice goal-setting, time management, organization, memory, reading strategies, note taking skills, test taking skills, researching and writing, and learn to reduce test anxiety.

Edgar Allan Poe

Explore his writings and discover the secrets behind the darkness of his tales. Become a better writer and complete your own original pieces of work. Lessons for this class are designed to meet the Illinois Common Core Standards for Language Arts.

Hip-Hop Poetry

Grades 8-10 Session 1 8:15 Grades 8-10 Session 2 8:15

What do Tupac Shakur and Robert Frost have in common? They were both poets!! Do you enjoy hip-hop music and poetry? Did you know that the two are closely related? Join us as we analyze how hip-hop music and poetry compare in motifs, themes and poetic devices. Examine "classical" poems that are traditionally studied and uncover how these are related to hip-hop music. You will create a portfolio of your own original hip-hop poetry and maybe uncover a hidden talent for music and writing.

Mathematics


