



IMCAT Welcomes Tom Maynard

Tom Maynard, member of the State Board of Education, will address the IMCAT 30th Annual Conference during lunch Monday, Dec. 6.

Maynard represents District 10, which includes Williamson and Bell Counties and portions of Travis County on the Interstate-35 corridor and reaches to Freestone County on the northeast corner, Waller County on the southeast corner and Burnet County on the west end.

Maynard has been actively engaged in education as a parent, teacher, school board trustee and nonprofit executive for more than 30 years. He worked in career and technical education for 13 years as an agricultural science teacher and earned national recognition for innovative programs and student achievement.

He served for 17 years as executive director of the Texas FFA Association, the nation's largest state career and technical student organization with an overall membership of more than 118,000 students on more than 1,000 Texas campuses.

He was named the nation's outstanding state FFA

executive in 2016 by the National Association of Supervisors of Agricultural Education. Maynard also served as president and regional vice president of that organization. Maynard retired from his FFA post in 2017.


Maynard also comes to the State Board with fine arts experience. He has led church music programs as a choir director and worship leader for 17 years.



He and his wife, Freda, have five children and nine grandchildren and reside in Williamson County.




