Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Festivals

This Sunday the Scriptures call our attention to the BIGGER PICTURE. In today's first reading, Cyrus is called by God to be a liberator of His chosen people. The Responsorial Psalm reminds us of God's goodness and how we are called to respond. Paul's letter in the second reading gives encouragement to the Thessalonian community. In the Gospel, Jesus avoids a snare that is set for Him by responding with a statement on what should be expected by the civil authorities and what should be expected by God.

It is important to recognize how our particular experiences and actions fit into God's bigger plan. In today's readings, we see contributions to Salvation History, and we serve a God who is just as active in our world today. Cyrus, also known as Cyrus the Great, extended his rule to a large section of the Near East during the 6th century BC. After his conquest of Babylon, he allowed the Jews, that had been deported from Palestine, to return. The first verses of Isaiah 45 describe God calling Cyrus to be the deliverer of the chosen people. Though never embracing Judaism himself, Cyrus played an integral role in the preservation of the Jewish people, their culture and their religion.

Thessalonica is one of several places where Paul made inroads, in spite of initially being forced to flee due to Jewish opposition. Without Paul's fervor and dedication, I doubt Christianity would have grown and flourished the way that it did. Paul and his proclamation of Christianity to the Gentiles was part of God's bigger plan.

In the Gospel, Jesus responds that it is good to give government what it is due, while offering ourselves to the service of God's plan. In today's world, not everyone buys into the idea of a bigger plan. We would like our world to thrive, but there are violent acts, injustices and natural disasters. There are times when things seem comfortable and clear. These are the moments when we may find it easy to point to God's presence and God's plan in the world. Then the tide shifts. We can feel lost and discouraged.

Over the years, the loss of those who were part of my journey helped me recognize the gifts they had been, of the love that had been there. I have learned to see myself in the world having a purpose, a world that reflects the goodness of God's divine plan. We are all called to see how our lives and days can be a part of God's loving plan for all his children.

This Tuesday we will have the Rite of Acceptance for the students in the 10th Grade of our Parish School of Religion as they begin the last two years of their journey toward Confirmation in January, 2019. Their formation

began at the beginning of their Christian Initiation at Baptism, took another big step forward when they entered PSR in the First Grade, and Tuesday will take another step forward as they are accepted into these final years of preparation for Confirmation in January of 2019. Next year we will have the Rite of Election with them as they begin their final months of preparation. **This Tuesday, because of the Rite of Enrollment during the Eucharist, there will be no Novena and Benediction, as the Rite of Acceptance will take a little time.**

More Lay Ministers of the Eucharist are needed, and this would be the ideal time to join. Slight changes are being made on a Diocesan level with our Eucharistic ministers and we will have workshops to explain the updates on Wednesday, November 8th at 6:30 p.m., Thursday, November 9th at 9:30 a.m. and on Saturday, November 11 at 10:00 a.m. We will then celebrate the recommissioning of all Eucharistic Ministers at all Liturgies on Sunday, November 12. New ministers are needed in addition to those we already have. If interested or if you have any questions, please call the parish office, 665-5359, and we will direct you to those who can best serve you.

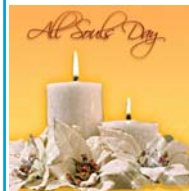

Stump the Deacon!

Why should I stay until the end of Mass?

There are several reasons not to leave Mass early. Here are a few:

1. We don't want to participate in the "Judas shuffle." Judas left the first Mass early at the Last Supper. We don't want to emulate him.
2. Leaving Mass early is rude to Jesus. It is like visiting a friend for dinner, and as soon as we finish eating, we jump up and run out the door yelling "It was great spending time with you; see you next week."
3. Leaving Mass early is rude to others. Other Mass participants may be praying after receiving Communion. Leaving early could distract them from their prayers.
4. Mass is not an activity on a To-Do List. If we are going to Mass only to avoid a mortal sin, we are missing the boat. We are called to much more. We are called to relationship, holiness and transformation.
5. The final blessing is important. When a priest, who by his ordination is configured to Christ, gives us his final blessing, we are being blessed by God himself. If Jesus were standing on the altar ready to give us His blessing, would we leave early?

Yogi Berra, the great New York Yankee catcher, once said "It ain't over till it's over." Mass is over when the priest gives his final and the priest or the deacon says "Go forth, the Mass has ended" and the people respond "Thanks be to God."
